

LAPFORD REVEL NEEDS YOU!



There are a great many people in the village who have offered to help out with the running of this child-centred event. However the multifarious, multi-day event requires an immense amount of work. From our AGM it was clear that the team is simply not large enough to run an event such as the Lapford Revel without pushing us all to the point of exhaustion.

In short, in order to proceed, the Revel requires more of us who are prepared to take a lead role in specific areas and pull the wider offers of help together, distributing the work across a number of smaller groups. These include organising the bars, the catering, entertainments, infrastructure (toilets, marquees, staging, electrics, first aid), children's procession & coronations, church service, clean-up, event management (licensing, insurance, risk assessments, programming and promotions) and fundraising. The team already have quite a lot of this covered, but it does need more people prepared to *lead* some of these areas. Last year, our belated event had been cut back from previous years in order to accommodate the workload, yet still this Herculean effort fell on too few shoulders!

ALL VOLUNTEERS are welcome and training for leadership roles can be given. Please get in touch!

The departing committee has agreed to stay on in a caretaker role and I too, remain in the Chair for the time being in order to keep the Revel from dissolution following which, one presumes, the assets would be transferred to the Parish Council.

Without your help, The Lapford Revel currently has no plans for 2022 and could be lost for ever!





LAPFORD WEATHER DECEMBER 2021

December was milder and slightly wetter than average.

The mildest day was the 31^{st} with a maximum of 14.2° C, due to the balmy south-westerly winds that had been flooding the country for the previous week. The coolest day was the 19^{th} which only reached 5.6° C. The coldest night was shared by the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} of the month, with air minimum temperatures of 0.4° C, so no air frosts at all at the higher end of the village, although there were several grass frosts at various times. The nights of both the 30^{th} and 31^{st} were very mild, the temperature only falling to 12.5 and 12.1° C respectively. Not quite a record, that was back in 2015 when I recorded a minimum of 12.7° C.

Rainfall total was 121.8 mm, much of this falling during the final mild week. Christmas day was the wettest with 27.1 mm but not quite the wettest one I have measured, that was back in 1999 when there were 28.8 mm.

There has been no trend of increasing rainfall since the 1990's.

The windiest day was shared by the 27th and 29th, both of which had gusts of 54 m.p.h.

2021 ANNUAL REVIEW

There has been a trend for the average annual temperature to rise slightly compared with 30 years ago by a small amount (0.2°C in that time). Since the 1990's there has been a trend of increasing autumn and winter temperatures by around half a degree), but no significant trend in increasing spring and summer temperatures.

The 2021 average annual temperature was 10.3°C, just 0.1°C above the 30 year average here in Lapford. The first half of the year was cooler than average, the second half milder.

The hottest day was the 21^{st} July which saw a maximum of 29.3° C. The coldest day was the 9^{th} of February when the temperature remained just below zero at -0.1° C.

The coldest night was on the 1st January when the air temperature fell to -5.4°C.

There were just four days when we had the thinnest of snow coverings on the ground, for a short time at least.

The annual rainfall was 1031.6 mm. some 70mm. wetter than average. As yet there has been no overall trend in changing rainfall.

May was particularly unpleasant with a combination of 164 mm. rainfall (more than twice the average) and a number of sharp frosts, which pretty much put paid to our apple harvest this year. This followed on from a very dry and chilly April.

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB BOOK REVIEW - THE KINGS CURSE BY PHILLIPPA GREGORY

Our latest book was 'The Kings Curse' by Philippa Gregory. I have read her books several times before and always found they are very difficult to put down. This one was almost 600 pages long so over Christmas it was sometimes a struggle to find time with so much going on.

The story is based in Tudor times and the heroine is Lady Margaret Pole – nee Plantagenet. When her husband dies she is suddenly in terrible financial trouble with 4 children, staff and property to support. Henry VII has had several of her family beheaded and imprisoned in the Tower of London just because he feels threatened by the Plantagenets.


Margaret is well thought of by the Queen and is asked to be governess to her eldest son Arthur. He dies in his teens after a brief marriage to Katherine of Aragon. That means the next in line to the throne is Henry VIII. He is a spoiled and indulged child and turns into a cruel tyrant.

All through her life, Margaret finds she is in and out of favour at the Kings court. These are exceptionally hard times when the King's whim means that many find themselves imprisoned and put to death for no reason.

Margaret is in her mid 60's when she also is sadly put to death.

Very addictive reading.

BOOK REVIEW - GROWN UPS BY MARIAN KEYES

A new year, maybe time to try something new. Four years ago, my wife suggested I try one of Marian Keyes books. She pointed me in the paper direction of *Rachel's Holiday*, her second book, and since then I have been slowly obsessed. She is a writer with a moral purpose, but with a light, comic tone and an absolute master of the laborious plate spinning of novels that sometimes span hundreds of pages. A sequel to that first book *Again*, *Rachel* is published this month. However, if you would like to make a start, try her last novel *Grown Ups*.

In many ways, it is a fantasy 2020 published as we saw the start of Covid and all the things that we saw taken away from us. The Casey's run a chain of independent grocers and spend that missing year on holiday, at a festival and a truly awful murder mystery weekend with their blended families. At a family party, one member suffers a concussion and a lifetime's worth of unhappiness, mental health problems, infidelity and general unhappiness come tumbling across the kitchen table.


That is a huge scope for any writer and I've said, she's in control. The novel starts with the inciting incident and works backwards, with the last third working through the emotional carnage. It ends on an uncertain, yet satisfying note. No-one is particularly happy, but at least they are honest about their dissatisfaction. And in one case, one character achieves a transitory form of happiness on their own terms.

This is Nell, young, restless and socially conscious. Married to an older man (a former cycling champion), step mum to his children from a previous relationship. Nell is possibly one of the few times I've had a crush on a fictional character in a book. It's Nell, or Ashley in Iain Banks' *The Crow Road*. Maybe that is a trigger for me, big, bold novels about family secrets.

Anyway, this is a comic novel achieved through hard graft and great skill. In many ways, Marian Keyes is an underrated writer and it's a literary mystery as to why. Her books have been translated into over thirty languages - that is over thirty years, fifteen novels, two collections of non-fiction and a cookery book. She deals with human issues in a warm, comic way. Another writer of a different gender or country (she's Irish) would be lauded for that grace and body of work. The Walsh's in particular, who feature in six of her novels are a wonderful creation. Putting the fun into dysfunctional, but never with authorial snobbery or judgemental polemic. *Again, Rachel* sees Rachel Walsh working in the rehab she attended in *Rachel's Holiday*.

I'd start there and work around. She's a writer you'll discover and become slowly obsessed with. In uncertain times, warm your soul with a new, literary discovery.
