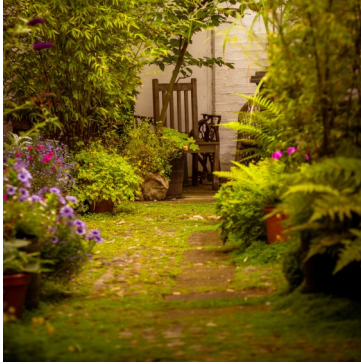


LAPFORD GARDENING CLUB

LADIES LEARN ABOUT NEXT STEPS

On a pleasant evening in April, the Ladies gathered in the ARK to hear about a charity called Next Steps that is based in Barnstaple. Most of us had not heard about it but we learnt that it came about because of the birth of a boy named Josh, back in in 1996. Josh came into the world with a rare chromosome disorder which caused him a number of difficulties that would, to some extent, limit his opportunities. As he approached adulthood, his parents were acutely aware that there was a lack of provision for someone like Josh. They decided to take matters into their own hands and find a way to allow Josh to work alongside his father learning the skills of woodworking and carpentry. Because of this Next Steps was born in May 2018 and became a registered charity the following year.

What amazed us all was the story our speaker told of how that original ambition to help their son had grown into something so much bigger and is still growing. In the beginning, there was just a workshop where Josh and his father could work together. Now that workshop has grown, as has the student intake, and is well equipped with both hand tools and machinery which the trainees are taught to use. After careful tuition in health and safety measures they are able to carry out many of the processes themselves so are fully involved. But things did not stop there. Over the years, opportunities have presented themselves and been taken up so that students now have a huge range of options. There is a café, a design department, a retail outlet (their charity shop on the High Street), the chance to be involved in external catering (providing meals for a local firm employing over 300 people), the chance to learn about administration by working in the charity's office, gardening work off site, preparing for permaculture, tree management and seasonal planting of fruit and vegetables, animal husbandry working with a local farmer and learning how to care for a number of different animals and keep the animals and themselves safe, a workshop where the trainees can learn from a trained mechanic about car maintenance and the workings of an engine and finally they can get involved in building works, something which is proving very successful with some students who are showing a real aptitude for the construction industry. I say 'finally' but after listening to the way the charity has expanded its range in just a few years, I think it likely that more new developments will occur.

In all these areas the young people are encouraged to become fully involved finding out which areas suit them best. The aim from the beginning is summed up in the charity's headline, 'Showcasing ability, instead of focusing on disability'. They offer two pathways to help prepare the students for life beyond the classroom and these are the pathway to independence and the pathway to employment and they have already had a number of success stories with young people growing in confidence and self esteem.

We really enjoyed the slides and the enthusiasm of our speaker who clearly demonstrated his pleasure in what he did and his commitment to it. It was very clear that Next Steps is providing an incredibly valuable service to many young people in the South West and to their families. We were left full of admiration for what has come about because of one small boy named Josh, and the dedication and determination of his parents.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, MAY 2022

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The Ark.

- The Parish Council met on 4th May in the Victory Hall.
- The meeting was the Parish Council AGM, so a number of procedural matters were dealt with.
- The proposal to build 14 dwellings on Eastington Lane (MDDC reference 22/00539/MOUT) was to be considered by the parish council and this attracted a good audience at the meeting, most of which were expressing their objections to the development.
- Later in the meeting the parish council **unanimously resolved to OBJECT on the basis of non-compliance with Local Plan Policies, the danger on the highway and no demonstrable need for the housing proposed.**
- Councillors Sue Briant-Evans and Stacey Lumsdon both resigned at the meeting and Ivan Hall was co-opted onto the council. This leaves two vacancies on the council, so if you want to make a difference please contact Rob Martin, Parish Clerk who will enlighten you further, phone 07768 829511 or email clerk@lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk. Peter Heal was re-elected as Chairman for the coming year and Julie Down replaced Sue as Vice-Chairman.
- The main noticeboard had been moved from the Church Green to outside of the Victory Hall to make sure it is easy to post things and read.
- The parish council has set up a working party to look at the Orchard Centre and the way it was run and uses that could be made of it. This work is at an early stage, and any suggestions about it could be sent to Rob Martin at the email address above and would be gratefully received.
- The grass cutting contract was set up for the village with cutting already now taking place.
- The next Parish Council Meeting is to be held on Wednesday 15th June.

LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL WELCOMES A NEW HEAD OF SCHOOL

It has been a busy start to the summer term at Lapford Community Primary School. The children returned after an Easter break ready and raring to learn.



The children and staff welcomes their new Head of School, Mrs Jessica Wright, who joins the school after the departure of the previous head, Mrs Wilmott. Mrs Wright is an experienced teacher who had been working at Cheriton Fitzpaine Primary School for the past seven years and held the role of Maths Lead Teacher across six schools within the Exe Valley Federation. She is very excited about her move to Lapford and is already enjoying getting to know the children and their families. Mrs Wright is very keen to develop links with the local community and is looking forward to finding opportunities to open the school to the public to celebrate the fantastic learning that is taking place at Lapford Community Primary School.



Children from Year 5 have been given the chance to undertake cycle training by completing their Level 1 Bikeability. This took place within the school playground and saw riders develop confidence in controlling and maintaining their bikes. After half a day of hard work, all the riders had completed their Level 1 and most were ready to begin

tackling Level 2. This involved them spending the afternoon on the roads learning how to share the space safely with other vehicles. The riders returned to school with an excited buzz and it was



fantastic to hear from the instructors how well-mannered and sensible the children had been. They look forward to completing their training.

MY MEMORIES OF THE CORONATION

I can remember my dad driving me and my family (mum and two brothers) over to Wales to stay with my Aunt and Uncle to watch the Coronation on their television, which was in black and white. My uncle was very clever and had made the television himself. My Aunt and my Mother told us that.

I can remember the gold coach which was being pulled by lovely horses. We children were given Coronation mugs and I still have mine.

MEMORIES OF THE CORONATION OF QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND, 1953



I was still in primary school in a small village in Northumberland at the time of the coronation. Television was very new in the area and almost no-one had a set. My great aunt and uncle bought one in time for the great day, and invited as many friends and family as could reasonably be fitted in to their rather small dining room. The "front room" was only used on very rare occasions, so the tv was set up in the much used dining room.

To go back a while, when King George the sixth died, both my brother and I were off school with measles. Mum had gone out to do a little shopping, Dad was at work but had set up a speaker between our bedrooms so we could both listen to the Light Programme, as it was then called. Halfway through the morning the radio,(wireless) cut out and there was silence. It was only when Mum came home and told us it had gone off air as a mark of respect as our king had died.

At this point I had never seen television. My first time of watching was a month before the coronation, when several of us were invited to Great Uncle Sam's to watch the cup final. Another first for me, I'd never seen a football match. We all sat square eyed watching the 14" black and white television, listening to incomprehensible remarks such as, " Get in there Morton". I was none the wiser.

For the coronation about 15 of us were packed in, adults on chairs in rows, many of which must have been borrowed, kids sitting on the floor at the front.

It was a long day. We saw all the nobs slowly filling up the abbey, hours before the ceremony, then finally, the queen emerged from the palace to enter the coronation coach and drive slowly through the streets of London through cheering crowds who had camped out all night in pouring rain to see her on that special day. Among the visiting royalty, I remember the Queen of Tonga, Queen Salote (I think) in an open carriage, getting absolutely soaked and loving it.

Arriving at the Abbey, the Queen led a procession through the Abbey, followed by page boys and ladies in waiting, led by the Archbishop of Canterbury to the front of the sanctuary. Then came the ceremony, so much history, none of which had much meaning to me, but was pretty gripping even so. At one point she was taken in to a kind of tent pavilion for her anointing. Moments such as this were an excuse for making cups of tea and passing them round, kids pressed in to service, glad to stretch our legs.

I wish I could remember the name of the commentator; he talked us through it all for over seven hours. How all the nobility coped unable to get to a loo I shall never know.

After the ceremony there was the triumphal carriage ride back to the palace, appearances on the balcony, cheering crowds everywhere. A truly splendid day of exciting historic ceremony and every cup and saucer in my Aunt's house. Huge washing up when the rest went home.

My street had raised enough money to buy every child a souvenir of the day, and we had a big street party after the event, with silly games, the only one I remember was the slow bike race where several kids at a time set off on their bikes to ride up a short hill as slowly as possible, if you fell off or put a foot down, you were out. I fell off. Last one upright won. The food was very bland, we were still in some rationing after the war. Ask your grandparents or great grandparents. It didn't matter; we had something to be happy about, to hold a party for, to celebrate. It still remains one of the highlights of my life.

I wish I still had the tiny metal model of the coronation coach and horses that I spent hours playing with afterwards, but the only souvenir I still have is a metal calendar with the coronation date engraved on it. All the days, months and numbers are still there too. I also have, still engraved on my memory, mental pictures of the day, of the robes, Little Prince Charles and impatient Princess Anne, beckoning for more planes to come during the fly past.

As best we could at the time, we welcomed our new queen, and I hope we can do our best this year to thank her for her years of outstanding service to our nations.

CORONATION MEMORIES

(Excerpt taken from an article by
Pte. W. Rounsefell 22740145 - Walter's father)

At the start of 1952 I was into my apprenticeship for a building firm called Boatfield & Bourne here in Lapford. Around the end of January - beginning of February – they put me on a job at Court Barton, Lapford to build 18” brick pillars to support the roof of the old cart shed.

Whilst building these pillars it was announced over the wireless that King George sixth had passed away after a long illness. He had gone to the airport to see off Princess Elizabeth and Prince Phillip a short while earlier, who were going on a visit to Kenya. It was at Treetops Hotel in Kenya that she was given the sad news about her father. She returned home straight away.

In that short period of time she left England a Princess and returned home a Queen.

Little did I realise then that the turn of events in Africa would become more meaningful 14 months later when, I would also be in Kenya with the Devonshire Regiment.

It was then that six of us were picked to prepare for the Coronation Parade, along with six from each of the other Companies. So besides the Devons there were the “Buffs”, the Black Watch and the Navy. It was a real spectacle for the people of Nairobi. I have to say that I remember very little of the actual parade, but to this day I am proud to be part of such an occasion. 50 years later I reflect on the fact that while we were parading the latest weapons in Her Majesty's Army, the Queen herself was taking part in a ceremony dating back hundreds of years.

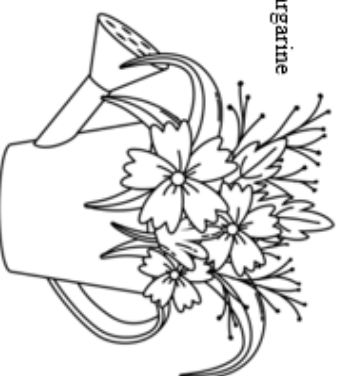

GARDENING CLUB SHOW TOP TIPS

The Gardening Club Show will take place on Saturday 10th September in the Congregational Church and we'd like to encourage as many folk as possible to enter. Entries can be dropped off between 9-11am on the day of the show, after which Judging will take place. In the afternoon everyone will be able to come and see the entries and stop for a cuppa, times are yet to be confirmed.

Here are our Top Tips!

1. Although The Garden Show is in September, some plants will need starting off now! Choose a couple of classes you'd like to enter and get planting!
2. The judge will be looking for uniformity in your entry - whether you enter fruits, vegetables or flowers, ensure they are the same size, shape and colour.
3. Tomatoes - should be ripe, picked on the morning of the show and be presented with their calix (stem) in place. Avoid wiping them as this will remove their natural sheen.
4. Potatoes and Carrots - dig them up the day before the show and immediately place them in water (to stop soil drying to their skin). Wash with a soft sponge, keep them in a dark dry place until the show.
5. Flowers - check your flower stems in the weeks before the show. Trim away any excess buds to allow the plants' energy to fuel the prize winner (buds are considered a flower too, so if you are entering a single bloom there should be no buds attached).
6. Runner Beans - how straight are your beans? You can straighten them by binding them to a splint with a warm, damp cloth.
7. Beetroot - dig them up and place them in salt water, as this will help preserve their colour.
8. Shallots - Dig them up nice and early and remove ragged skins. Allow the outer layer to form an even, dry, tanned skin by Show Day. Fold over the tops and tie with raffia, then present them on shallow tray of dry sand.



THOUGHTS FROM THE ARK

The film Schindler's List tells the story of one man's efforts to make the most of a desperate situation. As the director of a munitions factory in Poland, Oskar Schindler decided to use his position to save Jewish lives. By employing them in his factory, Schindler rescued many condemned Jews from the gas chambers. But keeping them employed was costly and little by little he liquidated his personal property to keep his business afloat. At the end of the story, the Nazis are defeated, and the full impact of Schindler's efforts is revealed as the dead are counted and the living stagger back to freedom. In one scene, kneeling by the railway track that had carried thousands to their death, Schindler has a startling realisation. He could have saved a few more. Overwhelmed with regret he laments keeping the few personal assets he still owns. If he'd only known when the war would end, he would have done more. Now it was too late.

Oskar Schindler was a hero. He is credited with saving more Jews during World War II than any other single person. But interestingly, all he could think about was what he didn't do. He wished he had done more. A powerful lesson in Schindler's story is this: even joyful givers will look back on their lives and wish they had done more. There are also others, who gave less than they could have given, or who never gave at all. Can you imagine their thoughts as they stand before God, giving an account of how they used their resources and to be rewarded accordingly? 'God loves a cheerful giver.' so today look for opportunities to give. Taken from UCB - Word for Today. It's not just financially that we give. When you think about it, today is all we have. Tomorrow never comes and yesterday is done. You will never get that time back to say the things you should have said and do the things you should have done. Life then becomes full of regrets and "if onlys."

This trifle was inspired by a recipe from Frederic Nutt, a famous confectioner in Georgian England. It consists of three indulgent layers: sponge cake, custard, and whipped cream.

First layer: place a mixture of sponge cakes spread with **apricot jam and amaretti biscuits** in a glass trifle bowl. Moisten generously with **sweet white wine or sherry** and leave until the wine has been soaked up.

Second layer: lots of warm vanilla custard (a spoonful of **brandy** may be added to this). Allow to cool.

Third layer: lightly whipped double cream which has been sweetened and flavoured with a little finely grated **lemon zest**. Spoon the cream over the custard and decorate with **roasted flaked almonds**.

This is good with **summer fruits and berries**.

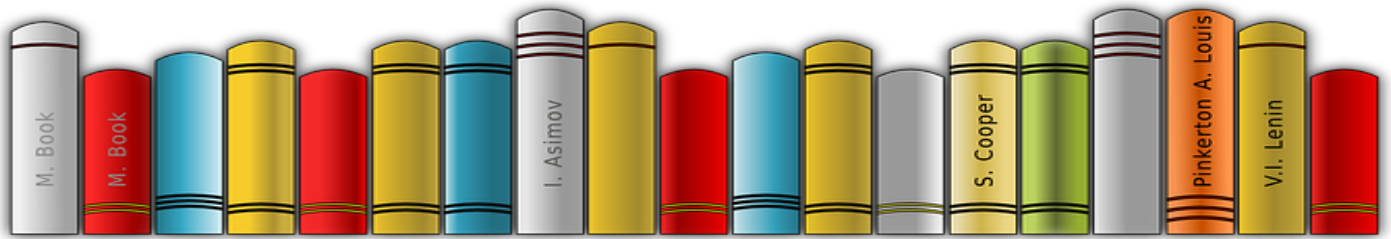

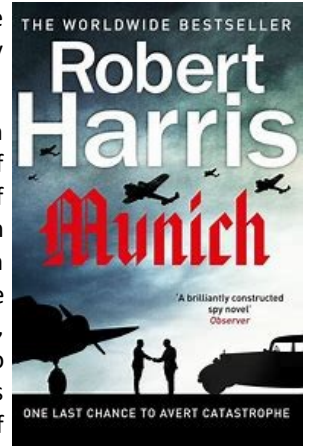

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB BOOK REVIEW – MUNICH BY ROBERT HARRIS

We all agreed that the story in this book was eerily topical given what is going on in the Ukraine at the moment. It concerns the aggressive territorial demands made by Hitler in 1938 and the attempts by Joseph Chamberlain to at least delay the start of war.

Two men, friends from Oxford, one English one German, find themselves in the entourage of each country's leaders in the run up to the Munich Agreement. The Englishman, Hugh Legat, is one of Chamberlain's private secretaries. The German, Paul Hartmann, is a diplomat, but also a member of the anti-Hitler resistance. The story is a gripping one, involving the behind-the-scenes manoeuvres on both sides, with the added interest of how the Germans who were against Hitler tried to remove him from power. I think it casts a new light on Chamberlain's desire to keep the peace – he knew if he could stall Hitler for a year or two Britain would be better equipped to fight. After the First World War, everyone in power was so determined that it should be "the war to end all wars" that any attempt to increase this country's land, sea and air forces were voted down by Parliament, even when it was known that Germany was re-arming itself. So in many ways the book changes the perception of Chamberlain as the "appeaser" to one of Chamberlain as a pragmatist who was prepared to lay himself open to ridicule if it meant that he could delay a war. As with all of Robert Harris's books it is well researched; he admits to having been fascinated by the Munich Agreement for years, and he made a BBC documentary in 1988 marking the fiftieth anniversary of the conference. There is a film, also called "Munich" starring Jeremy Irons, based on this book, which I can also recommend.



I couldn't help but wonder if there had been a Chamberlain character prepared to go to similar lengths in 2014 when the Crimea was first invaded, perhaps the world would feel a safer place today.

THE MANAGER BY AK WILSON

The Manager looks and feels like the kind of novel you'd read to pass the time in the recycled air of departure lounges; or in latent heat by the pool. It's a sleek, sexy book and like a swimming pool, deeper than it looks.

Katy is left jobless after her sexist pig of a boss gets a new post. She finds employment at Byrsa, which offers cloud computing to the world's most powerful companies and as a result: wields a tangible, existential power. And as PA to Byrsa's CEO Riley, she's drawn into a dangerous game.

That's the basic line of the narrative and you would be forgiven that it's glossy, superficial nonsense. But it's not. Firstly, Riley and Katy are incredibly well-drawn as characters. They are both engaging and intriguing at the same time. There's also a "will they-won't they" romance between them. Add to that, the background colour of the natural world, with Brysa setting up a data farm in a forest. Until then their servers are guarded by the kind of piranhas that normally swim through the pages of Ian Fleming novels.

Hidden in the middle of that though, are three examples of Chekov's gun. Unlike most of those, these get fired and my jaw dropped and my ears popped when they did. And yes, if you're shrewd enough like me, you can probably suss them. But that doesn't detract from the enjoyment of the novel. Once they happen, the book becomes pacy with a car chase, a hostage and an embittered sociopath who uses guns as a form of interior design.

Even then though, the focus is still on Riley and Katy. By this point, you will have realised that both of them are neither really who they say they are. And the novel makes the point lightly, but in depth: how does your online presence really represent who you are? And also: how much do women change their behaviour to compete with men... and why should they do that? Plus, as well the misogynistic idiocy that when women have to act like men to compete with them... and if they do, they are perceived as aggressive.

So, the proverbial pleasant surprise. Something well-crafted, nourishing and thought provoking. I've already mentally cast Jodie Comer as Katy and Maxine Peake as Riley. However, I reckon I've given you enough reasons to pack a copy before everyone starts talking about it. Take up the offer and be ahead of the game for a proper page-tuner.

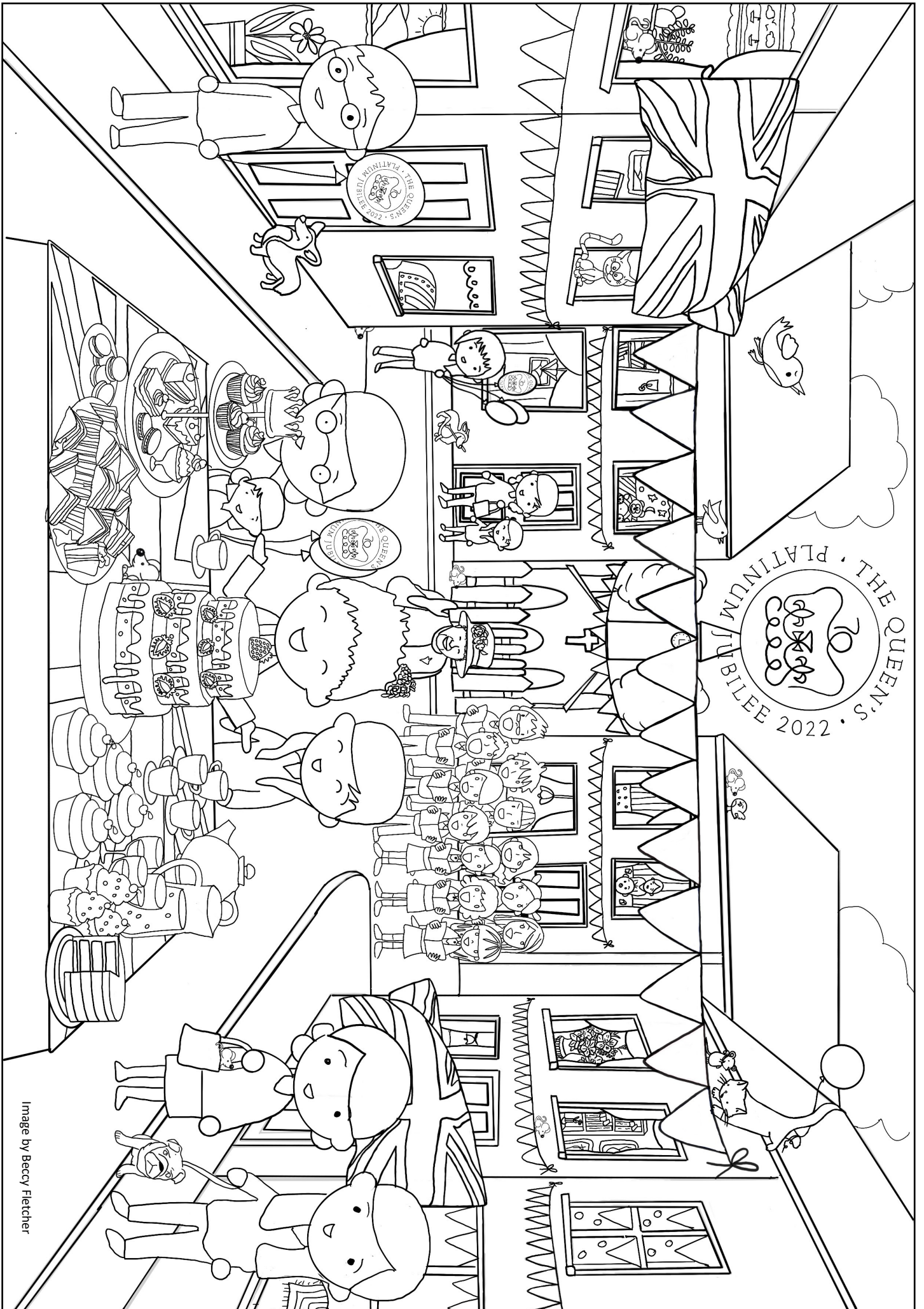

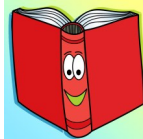
