ROYAL MAIL—NEW BARCODED STAMPS

Royal mail have introduced new everyday stamps which now include barcodes (not for special or Collectible stamps).

When using these new stamps you MUST keep the barcode attached otherwise they are not valid.

Stamps without a barcode will continue to be sold until stocks are exhausted and can be used as normal 1st and 2nd Class stamps until 31st January 2023.

Those that are not used can be exchanged using Royal Mail's Swap Out Scheme. Forms for this scheme are available from www.royalmail.com/barcodedstamps or from a local delivery office Customer Service Point.





Lapford Weather Review

LAPFORD WEATHER JUNE 2022

Very slightly warmer than average, also slightly wetter than average.

The highest temperature of the month arrived during one of the two brief warm spells. This was 27.9°C on the 17th, nothing particularly exceptional for June.

The coolest day was the 19^{th} with a maximum of 15.1° C. The coolest night was on the 2^{nd} with a minimum of 4.9° C. There were slight grass frosts on both the 1st and the 14th. The mildest night was on the 18th, when the air temperature remained above 14.5°C.

This was nearly another dry month until the afternoon of the 30th when we experienced a thunderstorm in the late

afternoon with heavy hailstones up to 12 mm (½") diameter. Total equivalent rainfall from this event was 25.2 mm, and the monthly total was 65.1 mm.

The windiest day was also the 30th with a gust of 36 m.p.h. during the storm.


LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL

NEWS FROM MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL

Residents across Mid Devon will start to receive new wheelie bins as the Council prepares to implement its new Bin-it 123 collection service.

From October 2022 all black sack/

every three weeks as part of the



Council's drive to increase recycling and reduce waste. All other collections remain unchanged - with food waste collected weekly and dry recycling each fortnight.

More than 37,000 wheelie bins will be delivered across the district over the next few months, in preparation for the autumn changes, with every household entitled to a free black wheelie bin. Seagull sacks can also be provided instead of a wheelie bin.

Trial figures have shown the introduction of the Bin-it 123 collection cycle will increase recycling, reduce the amount of non-recyclable material collected, and reduce CO2emissions, with waste collection vehicles travelling less miles.

The cost of a year's waste collection in the district is estimated to be around £54 per household.

The first round of the new collection cycle is due to begin in October. If you want to find out more visit: www.middevon.gov.uk/binit123. You can also look up your collection date online.

SMALL ANGELS BY LAUREN OWEN

You're all invited to a wedding. Sam and Chloe are getting married in Small Angels, the church of Sam's childhood village. His sister Kate is along to help, but something is not happy with the imminent festivities at the edge of Mockbeggar Woods. It's angry, manipulative and eldritch at the same time.

Small Angels is a patchwork of a book. Beneath it is a general, creeping, lurking terror of what will happen on the day itself. Beneath that is the history of the village, it's myths and fables and how Sam and Kate's childhood affects what is going to happen and when it does, you'll be genuinely terrified. I say that, as someone who doesn't "get" horror. But be warned, find something to hold on to.

There is the odd hint of the modern world, and where the unnamed village might actually be. But there is nothing to really tie it to one particular time and space - other than the fact that the hard drive of Sam's laptop keeps wiping and he can't get a mobile signal. There is also the internal logic that the villagers accept that Mockbeggar is haunted. Not just by the spirit, but also in the ghosts of angry dogs and a lost goose which plays with the children.

I should also mention that The Gonnes are a family of women, guardians of both the woods and Small Angels. They are depicted at one point as cooking meals of random ingredients thrown into a pot and you can make of that what you will.

There's more than enough in Small Angels to make the jaw drop and the flesh creep. There is that tick and drip of information about what is going to happen. One, involving Chloe's wedding veil is so horrifying I had to stop reading for a few minutes. She also acquires an unseen voice which narrates her wedding preparations and manipulates her into setting something loose.

I'm not going to say whether there is a happy ending. What I will say is it ends on a definite, unsettling minor key. Things

might be normal (or as normal as they can be in a haunted village), but there is great uncertainty with it. It depicts perfectly the great leap of faith of deciding to give your heart and soul to someone.

I read this book three months ahead of publication and it was enough to give me nightmares then. Published on August 2nd, it will make your flesh creep as the light seeps out of Summertime.

PLANT HERITAGE, PLANT CONSERVATION, AND THE PLANT GUARDIAN SCHEME



Plant Heritage, formerly NCCPG (National Council for the Conservation of Plants & Gardens), was set up with the aim of conserving garden plants across the British Isles and Ireland. I joined over 25 years ago and began to sell rare and unusual plants, together with son David and sister Janice, at Plant Heritage Plant Sales at Tavistock, Bicton, South Molton, Tiverton and at PH AGMs. We had plantaholics flocking around our table!

In 2013 I decided to catalogue all the plants in my garden on to my laptop, noting where they were in the garden, where they had been obtained and any special remarks. At the same time I checked the plants against the RHS database and if any plant had two or fewer stockists, I registered the plant with the Plant Heritage Plant Guardian scheme. All the registered

plants held by Plant Guardians are held on the PH database and if a member is looking for a particular plant, the Society can contact the grower of that plant and ask if the grower is able to supply a plant. I did this with Agapanthus 'Mercury' when a nursery in Northern Ireland wanted it for its collection. I also sent Agapanthus 'Beatrice', another of Dick Fulcher's plants. Some of my plants came from Exeter University when David was working there and others from wonderful plantsmen (and women), including the late Terry Jones from Zeal

Monachorum, two from Dick Fulcher from Eggesford, and one from Roy Lancaster. I had now





joined the band of Plant Guardians who propagate and send these endangered plants to the annual Plant Exchange. I try to keep at least two of most species in the garden – belt and braces! A couple of years ago David sent seed of Sorbus subcuneata (Exmoor Whitebeam) to the Seed Bank.

A few of my plants are no longer stocked by nurseries and one of my favourites is Erodium 'Pipsqueak', the smallest Erodium in cultivation, small leaves and small white flowers. I bought it from Lydford Alpines in 2005. It had been collected by R.V. Rogers, who had a nursery at Pickering in Yorkshire, around the 1990s. I have over 100 Plant Guardian plants.

In early June I had an email from Plant Heritage to say that two of my threatened plants, out of 12 chosen nationally, had been shortlisted for the 2022 Threatened Plant of the Year Competition at the Hampton Court Flower Festival in early July - Rhododendron 'Charme La' and Agapanthus 'Mercury' (bred by Dick Fulcher, Eggesford). I had two shortlisted last year but didn't win but it was great to have had them entered. The twelve will be judged by officials and there will also be a public vote.

The Hardy Plant Society, to which I also belong, has a conservation scheme and I

grow a few of their plants. The Alpine Garden Society, of which I am a member, is involved with the conservation of alpine plants. I grow quite a few alpines and especially love the pasque flower, Pulsatilla, and have a few species and varieties. A beautiful alpine from the bud peeping through the ground in spring to the seed head after flowering. I have started to cut back the spent flower which extends the flowering season.

From having a tiny garden at Church View as a child to packing every space with plants as I do now in Crediton, growing plants has been a delight and has been shared with gardeners all over Devon and the world, via Facebook.

The Youth Club has been back, up and running for a year now and what a year it has been! After agreeing to run some summer taster sessions last summer, we didn't think any of us were prepared for the incredible response we received. High Five Thursdays were born, running on a weekly basis

during term time and now we cater for nearly 100 children in the village and surrounding area across all our clubs.

High Five Thursdays have been a real pleasure to run with an average of 35-40 kids a week. This year, we have been able to enjoy so many activities together including, crafts, baking, quizzes, football, Badminton etc. The list is endless. We sent a card to Her Majesty the Queen and



received a response in return. We have launched a campaign to stop dog fouling in the village. We also enjoyed being involved in the Platinum Jubilee celebrations in June. High Five Thursday will be back on Thursday

We have also been able to provide a bi-weekly session for 11–16-year-olds called, "The Drop In." These sessions run on a more relaxed basis and we have a regular group of children that attend. We are hoping to make these more regular during the autumn, after the summer holidays.

In September, we will be launching our High Five Junior sessions once a month. These sessions will be for children aged 4-7 and their carers/parents. There will be lots of fun activities to do and toys to play and we are hoping these sessions will be well received.

When Sainsbury's shelves are empty, There's no wheat or livestock reared, They will look for farms and farmers, To find that both have disappeared.







LETTUCE SOUP

300g (10 oz) lettuce, washed and shredded [Cos lettuce is good] 1 clove garlic 50g (2oz) butter 1 dessertspoon flour 250ml (1/2 pint) vegetable stock 250 ml (1/2 pint) milk 1 bay leaf.

Melt the butter in a saucepan and add the lettuce and garlic. Stir over a gentle heat for 5 minutes until lettuce has wilted. Add the flour and mix in thoroughly. Gradually add the stock and milk, stirring well. Bring to the boil, add the bay leaf and simmer gently for 10 - 15 minutes until the lettuce is tender. Remove the bay leaf and puree the soup in a blender or food processor. Season with salt, pepper and a little freshly grated nutmeg. Add extra milk or stock if the soup is too thick. This is a good way of using a surplus of lettuce, or the leaves of bolted lettuce.
