# Lapford Weather Review

## LAPFORD WEATHER JULY 2022

Milder than average (by nearly 1°C), very dry.

The warmest day was the 18<sup>th</sup> with a maximum of 32.2°C, the hottest day since 1990 (that was in August). This came in the middle of the month, courtesy of a very warm air mass drifting slowly north from Africa, which gave us a 4 day heat wave.

The coolest day was shared by the  $1^{st}$  and  $4^{th}$ , both of which had maxima of  $16.3^{\circ}$ C. The coolest night was shared by the  $27^{th}$  and  $28^{th}$ , when the temperature fell to  $6.5^{\circ}$ C. The grass temperature fell to just  $1.6^{\circ}$ C on the  $4^{th}$ , which just goes to show how chilly a night in July can be.

Total rainfall for the month was only 9.7mm, making it the

driest since my July records began in 1988. This was barely 10% of our average for July. The wettest day was the 1<sup>st</sup>, with a fall of 4.2mm.

The windiest day was the 30<sup>th</sup> with a gust of 34 m.p.h.






## **EXHIBITIONS IN THE ARK**

## LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, AUGUST 2022

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes will be made available on the Council website, <u>www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk</u> and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The Ark.

The Parish Council met on 3<sup>rd</sup> August in the Victory Hall. Four members of the public attended.

- There had been no meeting in July as the Clerk contracted Covid, testing positive the week that the agendas were due to go out.
- The parish council is still looking for new councillors and anyone who is interested should contact the clerk on <a href="clerk@lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk">clerk@lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk</a>
- The Jubilee celebrations had been successful and had come at no cost to the parish council precept.
- The parish council Lapford Emergency Action Plan (LEAP) Working Party was looking for new volunteers to review the plan and make sure it was achieving its purpose. The group is a mixture of councillors and other residents who meet periodically to make things happen. 

The team opposing mine had a visiting lady who I now realise should have been banned (on the grounds of being an outsider) as she proved far too good on her first ever attempt at croquet and she and Sue beat my team.



She had her own special action that seemed to place her ball very close to the jack (or cochonnet if we are being French) every time. My throw began by being too long and when I tried to shorten it, it was of course too short. More practice needed. Finally, there was molkki. A very simple game, a bit similar to skittles, except that you throw a sort of baton to knock down the 'skittles' which are small numbered tubes of various heights that you place on the grass in a bunch. It is a good game because the rules are simple and anyone of any age can play, which probably explains why I did a bit better at this!

The weather was fine and dry. It did get cooler as the evening wore on but Sandra kindly produced a variety of shawls and rugs to keep us warm and the food, drink and friendly chat kept the chill at bay until it was time to say our goodbyes and wend our way home.






## BOOK REVIEW SHAPE OF A BOY BY KATE WICKERS

Kate Wickers is the truly seasoned travel journalist. There's nothing you can tell her about how to behave in exotic climes. This book is a summary of her and her family's adventures since the Millennium. Her husband Neil and her boys Josh, Ben and Freddie are as much characters in this narrative as she is.

This is not the traditional travel book. There is no over-arching narrative, or geo-political discussions. In a way, you don't really miss those. This is as much a book about the "joys" of



travelling with children; whilst trying to have a decent holiday on your own terms. Those of us with children will tell you that this is reconciling two entirely disparate/Panglossian notions.

In a sense, you watch the three boys grow up, within the narrative frame of annual holidays. Her children are millennials, in every sense of the word. Over the course of twenty years, the author has had some fabulous trips to places like Egypt, Mallorca, Borneo and Japan.

Whilst there though, the author's adventures/misadventures have included retrieving a "little message" left in a hotel pool by one of her sons, being interrogated by Israeli police, trying to enjoy a yoga lesson with grumpy teenage children and possibly, best of all: giving the complimentary rum from a Cuban hotel room, to the cleaners to supplement their wages.

The writing is light and frothy, but slightly arch at the same time. The author is constantly looking for relaxation, berated by her own kids for being a "Helicopter Mum"... but each chapter of their travels is used as lesson learnt; in bringing up well-adjusted, empathetic, decent human beings who also sell those rare Pokémon cards for £90 on eBay when they get older.

There is also the regret that her children are now (possibly) too old for family holidays and the fact that Covid brought the idea of those to a temporary halt.

It's not a long book, but the kind which is perfect for your own - hopefully less fraught - holidays. Let your mind drift, whilst you congratulate yourself on being a good parent and asking the koan: What would Kate Wickers do?

## LAPFORD BOOK CLUB BOOK REVIEW THE NIGHT MANAGER

I am so sorry that we didn't contribute a review last month; the book, "Lying Life of Adults" was not popular and none of us really wanted to write a review. No matter how much I twisted arms, I couldn't get a volunteer.

The July book was "The Night Manager" by John Le Carre and we hoped very much this would be a vast improvement on the last book!



Jonathan Pine, a former British soldier, is night manager at Meinster Palace Hotel in Zurich. Richard Onslow Roper, plus entourage, arrives. Roper is a billionaire criminal who traffics illegal arms and drugs. Pine's desperation to destroy Roper's enterprises began in Cairo when he previously worked at the Queen Nefertiti Hotel. There Pine had met Sophie, the mistress of the hotel's owner, who called Roper "the worst man in the world". She provided Pine with incriminating documents, asking him to forward them to the Egyptian authorities. Disregarding Sophie's warning that Roper has ties with British intelligence he also forwards copies to a friend in MI5 . Shortly after this, Sophie is brutally murdered.

Several years later, while working in Switzerland, Pine is approached by ex-SIS chief, Leonard Burr and his civil service backer, Rex Goodhew, who are planning an elaborate sting operation against Roper. Eager to avenge Sophie, Pine agrees to go undercover to infiltrate Roper's criminal enterprise. However, the operation is in jeopardy, a turf war within the intelligence community with suspicion that somewhere collusion with Roper is taking place. Pine is betrayed and held captive on Roper's yacht. Now read on......

Never knowing just who was in league with Roper, who was a "goody" made this a tale of twists and turns. It was a book that required quite a lot of concentration to follow just who was doing what to whom. With perseverance, I finished it and enjoyed it but I do want a light book to read now!

We all now want to watch the 2015 television adaption again, for a change I found that the actors were an improvement over the pictures I had in mind as I read the book, especially Roper, played beautifully by Hugh Laurie.



# Lapford Weather Review

## LAPFORD SUMMER WEATHER

I'm sure many of you are wondering just how 'unprecedented' (the Met. Office's favourite word just now) the current summer weather is. I have now been recording the weather in Lapford for 35 years so thought I would have a look back at previous summers. My criteria for a hot day is one with a maximum temperature over 25°C. You will have observed that we enjoyed a brief hot spell lasting four days this July (with a maximum on the 18<sup>th</sup> of 32.2°C) and it was a very dry month with just 9.7 mm rain. Just now in August we are again (as I write this) experiencing a few days of heat.

July last year was also warm, with an eight day hot spell in midmonth (hottest day the 21<sup>st</sup> with 29.3°C). That hot spell was dry, but the month as a whole was wet.

August 2020 saw a three day heat wave, with a maximum of  $30.9^{\circ}$ C recorded.

Both July and August in 2018 saw brief heat waves, peaking at 29.0  $^{\rm o}{\rm C}$  on the 9  $^{\rm th}$  July.

July 2013 had a twelve day spell of hot weather mid-month, with a maximum on the  $18^{th}$  of  $29.6^{\circ}$ C. A dry month.

July 2006 had eleven days of hot weather, peaking at  $30.9^{\circ}$ C on the  $19^{\text{th}}$ . A dry month.

July 2005 had a five day hot spell, maximum 29.0°C on the 13<sup>th</sup>.

July and August 2003 both had brief hot spells, peaking at  $29.9^{\circ}$ C on the 9<sup>th</sup> August. August was also very dry.

August 1995 had two six day hot spells, with a maximum of  $30.8^{\circ}$ C on the 1st. This was also a very dry month, just 13 mm rain.

July 1990 had a thirteen day heat wave mid-month, peaking at  $32.0^{\circ}$ C on the  $21^{st}$ . August began with four very hot days, culminating in  $35^{\circ}$ C on the  $3^{rd}$ , my hottest day of all. This was also a mainly dry month.

July 1989 had an eleven day hot spell following on from 3 hot days earlier in the month. The highest temperature was  $31.5^{\circ}$ C on the  $24^{th}$ . Also a dry month.

I have not included the odd isolated hot days, which have occurred in many other summers, but I think it is clear that what we are experiencing this year is not so very unusual compared with the past 35 years.

The benchmark for hot dry summers is 1976, unfortunately I was not living in Devon to record that one, but I do have synoptic charts that show anticyclones sitting near or over the country for much of that time. The nearest data I have is for Plymouth, where the rainfall for the whole summer was just 53

mm (around a quarter of average) and the temperature was around 3°C above the long term average. Other parts of Southern UK had continuous hot weather for up to seventeen days.


