Lapford Weather Review




LAPFORD WEATHER SEPTEMBER 2022

Average temperature, above average rainfall.

The warmest day was the 2nd with a maximum of 23.4°C, and the coolest was the 28th with 13.7°C. The coolest night was on the 17th with a minimum temperature of 3.6°C and with a touch of grass frost, in fact there were 4 nights with a touch of frost on the grass.

Total rainfall was 98.8 mm. about a third wetter than average. The wettest day was the 4th with a fall of 27.3 mm.




list! We would especially like to thank all those who helped 'behind the scenes' to make it all happen.

RAIL NEWS

It has been some time since we were last able to report any progress in our ongoing consultations with Great Western Railways both to improve our services and to reduce our fares. Readers may recall that it was two year's ago that we first achieved the addition of several stopping trains on weekdays together with achieving a 'virtual' fare decrease by having Lapford fares frozen while all other fares around us went up



with the annual inflation-linked fare increase.

After months of failure to achieve any further improvements, frustrated by changes in the railway personnel with whom we were talking, we finally have a written commitment that from December, we will have six more trains stopping at Lapford on Saturdays; a matter that was overlooked when the weekday service was improved two years' ago. Precise details have not been published at the time of writing this news item, but more detailed information will hopefully be available for publication in the December Lapford Lookout. Failing that, just keep checking the usual Railway Timetable websites until the new trains appear. Meanwhile, we continue to campaign to have ALL trains EVERY day stopping at Lapford. We will share any news, through the Lapford Lookout, as it emerges.


PREPARE FOR CHRISTMAS!

LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

It's been a busy start to the new school year. During the summer, we were finally able to remove the classroom that had sat empty in the playground for many years. As you may be aware, the Chulmleigh Academy Trust have worked tirelessly to try and secure funding for a new building



for the school. To date, this has been unsuccessful which has been disappointing for the children, staff and parents. However, by removing the empty classroom we will be able to more than double the outside area for our youngest children and will be able to make use of an additional play space at the top of our site. It really is an exciting time for Lapford and we cannot wait to make use of the newly landscaped areas when we return to school following half term. We are very grateful for the patience and support shown by children and parents while this work is undertaken.

One of the areas we want to focus on improving this year is writing and the children and staff have made a tremendous start already this term. Last week we were able to welcome family and friends into school for an open morning which focussed on how writing is taught and sought to make parents aware of our expectations for writing. It was lovely to see the school bustling with visitors and the



children absolutely loved showing off their hard work. Skylarks were busy on an adjective hunt while Kingfishers



were playing a grammar game which involved them using lots of technical vocabulary; demonstrating they can tell their fronted adverbials from their prepositional phrases! Over in the Nest, Mrs Tanner held a phonics workshop where she explained how we teach our youngest learners to read and write. It was

a fantastic morning and I hope those who attended enjoyed it.



LAPFORD GARDENING CLUB

At our last meeting we had a hands-on chutney preparation session lead by Sue Harle who has been making chutney for years, primarily as a fund raising activity. Her produce is available in The ARK and the money from her sales go to the Lapford Foodbank. As we chopped onions, apples, tomatoes and courgettes we swapped stories and discussed recipes. Sue is going to cook up the local produce and bring tasters back to our next meeting for us all to try.





GLUTNEY

Makes about 10 Jars

1kg overgrown courgettes or marrows, unpeeled if small, peeled if huge, cut into 1cm dice

500g onions, peeled and diced

1kg red or green tomatoes, scalded, skinned and roughly chopped

1kg cooking or eating apples, peeled and diced

500g sultanas or raisins

500g light brown sugar

750ml white wine (or cider) vinegar

1-3 tsp dried chilli flakes

1 tsp salt

For the spice bag

1 thumb-sized nugget of fresh or dried ginger, roughly chopped

12 cloves

12 black peppercorns

1 (generous) tsp coriander seeds

A few blades of mace

Method

Put the vegetables and fresh fruit into a large, heavy-based pan with the sultanas and sugar. Make the wine vinegar up to 1 litre with water and add to the pan with the chilli flakes and salt.


Make up the spice bag by tying all the spices together in a square of muslin. Add the spice bag to the pan, pushing it into the middle.

Heat the mixture gently, stirring occasionally until the sugar has dissolved, then slowly bring to the boil. Simmer, uncovered, for 2-3 hours, stirring regularly to ensure it does not burn on the bottom of the pan. The chutney is ready when it is rich, thick and reduced. To test, drag a wooden spoon through the mixture: it should part to form a channel and reveal the base of the pan. If it starts to dry out before this stage is reached, add a little boiling water. Allow to cool slightly.

Pot the chutney while still warm in sterilised jars. Seal with plastic-coated screw-top lids (essential to stop the vinegar interacting with the metal). Leave to mature for at least 2 weeks – ideally 2 months – before using.



THOUGHTS FROM THE ARK

A competition was held between two men to see who could chop down the most trees in a single day. One man was older and more experienced, while the other was younger and less experienced, and that's where the difference showed up. The younger man spent eight hours chopping down trees, and at the end of the day he had a total of twenty-five. Looking around, listening to people, they are struggling with Covid, whether to be vaccinated, price rises for food and fuel costs. The government seems to be in disarray, the media constantly paints a terrible picture for the future. Take time to rest and recharge, not likely with the war in Ukraine and the potential for nuclear weapons to be used. In spite of everything appearing to be going down hill, it's a really good time to take stock and stop for a while, just to breathe. Spend time with family and friends. Do something different and laugh. Make memories. It won't make the problems go away but it will give you a different perspective.

One of the joys of being in The ARK is seeing people care for one another. It's a pleasure to stand back sometimes and hear the chatter and laughter. To watch as people listen and share, offering help, comfort or support. Community in these difficult times is going to be invaluable.

The sole purpose of The ARK is to help those who are in need, in any way we can. We are a Community Cafe and Foodbank which is for everyone to use, in good times and bad, whether there is a need or not.

A big thank you to those who attended the harvest supper. It was a most enjoyable evening. Philip Burrow spoke about the work being done to help refugees in Ukraine and showed a video of the huge container being loaded to take much needed supplies out there. There was also a collection for the flood victims in Pakistan which raised £375 to be put towards a shelter box, which has much needed items and tents to help them survive until the floods recede.

Chair's Report for 2021-2022 for Heart of Lapford Development Limited

This reporting year started way back in April 2021 when COVID was still severely affecting everyday life. Our first Board meeting was on ZOOM! Despite this, things were starting to come together, H4L had suggested a Revel type event with the official opening of LTP included, and a Common Players production started to become a possibility. Talks with the Victory Hall Committee were progressing well with container usage getting sorted. The gardening group had been busy, mulching, weeding, and planting apple trees.

In May the thorny issue of dogs on Lower Town Place arose. Strong views were being expressed, so HOLD arranged a meeting with members of the supposedly opposing camps. Facilitated by Peter Totterdell, this was a major success as everyone realised that they all had the same aim, an accessible space to walk dogs while ensuring no mess (dog poo) was left behind. A policy for LTP was agreed. It was recognised that this was not just an LTP problem but one affecting the whole village and all other villages in the country. The Youth Club agreed to run a publicity campaign highlighting the problem and appealing for owners to clear up after their dogs.

It was becoming apparent that a minority on the Parish Council was very opposed to the concept of Lower Town Place as a public amenity space associated with the Victory Hall – and especially the use of funds realised by the sale of the Youth Club building at Popes Lane, despite the fact that the benefit to young people was becoming ever more obvious.

The HOLD Board has consistently kept both the Parish Council and the public informed about its progress through written reports and statements published in the Lapford Lookout. For many months the Board has sought an open dialogue with the Parish Council, all of its requests having been ignored until recently, when at last it is hoped that meaningful contact and the truth in these matters have been established. The Parish Council have yet to exercise their right to nominate a Director.

Meanwhile LTP had really started to become a great asset for Lapford, the Youth Club evenings attracting the vast majority of 7 to 12-year-olds in the village and the sound of children playing could once again be heard as they made full use of the open space. Benches had been bought or donated with the site becoming well used by villagers of all ages. The two organised events were very well attended, with over one hundred at the Robin Hood spectacular put on by the Common Players. Lower Town Place was packed for the Revel evening and the official opening ceremony.

The reconstruction of the Lower Town Place boundary with Church Green was (and still is) in abeyance. HOLD have offered £1,000 in recognition of its part ownership of the bank in question, along with a similar disabled access gate to those already installed (£275), and stone that has been reclaimed from the demolished buildings (free of charge). As of April 2022 the Church Green Trustees had not been able to identify the extra £2,000 required but this will go back to the Parish Council in November. Planning permission has been applied for as it is a boundary to the Conservation Area.

The change of constitution for HOLD was being progressed through this period with the Federated Charitable Incorporated Organisation model being favoured, as it is widely used as a basis for the constitution of most similar charities both in Devon and the UK in general. The constitution of several local village halls was researched during the process concentrating on the newer ones created within the last ten years. This exercise is ongoing.

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW: EXIT WEST by MOHSIN HAMID

This book was not very well received by the Book Club; the story is a romance, set in some war-torn country (Syria? Iraq?), and told in the third person. The couple, Saeed and Nadia, meet and, as their romance flourishes, the violence in their country increases, so they decide they must flee. This is when it gets confusing. Doors appear at various places which lead to an escape to another country.

Initially I thought this was going to be about the hardships suffered by refugees at the hands of people traffickers, as the first exit through one of these doors is brought about when they use an "agent", and they emerge in a refugee camp on the Greek island of Mykonos. The description of how militants destroy infrastructure and the hardships encountered by the citizens of the area were a reminder of how lucky we are to be living in a peaceful country (although the power cuts and food shortages described may not be so far removed from us this winter, if the newspapers are to be believed). However, the story takes the couple through two more doors with no details of how this happens; one brings them out in London where they find themselves in a part of the city full of refugees from many other countries, and then another which takes them to Marin, just outside San Francisco. Here both Saeed and Nadia drift apart as a couple, but the rather flat tone of the narrator failed to elicit much sympathy from me and I finished the book with relief.



I turned instead to Richard Osman's new book about the Thursday Murder Club, "The Bullet that Missed". This is a book I can recommend if you are looking for fun characters, and an interesting (though rather far-fetched) storyline, which is a good read on an autumn evening.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, OCTOBER 2022

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The ARK.

The Parish Council met on 5th October 2022 in the Victory Hall. Thirteen members of the public attended.

- A minute's silence was held in memory of the late Queen Elizabeth II.
- The Parish Council co-opted two new councillors at this meeting. A signed declaration of acceptance was received from Steven Fletcher confirming him as a councillor. There is a further vacancy on the council which the parish council will be filling at its next meeting on Tuesday 8th November 2022.
- Concerns had been expressed about the quality of hedge flailing which had been done in the village and the parish council would take the matter up with County Highways in the first instance.
- Community Buildings WiFi connectivity would be improved in Lapford using finance from a historic grant fund from Calor Gas, with the Village Hall, Parish Church, Congregational Church and The Ark all benefitting from the money.
- A project was underway to improve the condition of road and other signposts in the parish with the work largely being carried out by volunteer councillors. If anyone wants to volunteer to help, please contact the clerk.
- A concern had been expressed about the safety of children using the highway to cycle to the school questioning whether
 work could be done to improve the situation. This matter would be taken up with County Highways as would the possibility
 of extending the gritting area to include this bit of highway.
- A fire risk assessment is to be carried out on the Orchard Centre building to assess if it requires any safety work.
- The next meeting of the parish council was to be Tuesday 8th November 2022 at 7.30pm, in the small room of the Victory Hall. All are welcome to attend.

Lapford Parish Council Is also looking for a Village Handyman to undertake general maintenance of village assets on a job-by-job basis. The tasks to be undertaken will include things like painting and other maintenance work requiring a good level of competence. In general, it will be expected that the tasks will be undertaken promptly, within a fortnight of being ordered for example, and payment for work done will be made equally promptly.



BOOK REVIEW A POCKET FULL OF HAPPINESS BY RICHARD E GRANT

Uxoriousness. It's a funny word.

On September 1st, last year Richard E Grant lost his wife, the dialect coach Joan Washington. She died two months short of their 35th wedding anniversary. Towards the end, she asked him to "find a pocket full of happiness in every day".

And as a basis of memoir, that's an incredibly potent concept. There is also the potential for it to be dismissed as the kind of book that can easily be filed in the "Painful Lives" section of your local bookshop, then neatly bagged to the nearest Oxfam.

But we are talking Richard E Grant here. A bundle of nervous energy, a gourmand, a neophobe and an actor who can effortlessly play hysteria packed into a six foot-two frame. If you've read any of his other books, you'll know what's to come. The arch, acrid whip of nameless actors who get on his wick; combined with the starry-eyed wonder of being famous. And there's plenty of that here, covering his work on *Star Wars, Persuasion, Loki* and most of all, the role he really should have won an Oscar for *Can You Ever Forgive Me?*


What is surprising is the gentle side of his personality, as life goes on hold when his wife is diagnosed with a terminal illness and dies within nine months. He's devoted to Joan till the very end, conscious of the fact that he's not coping with it and open about the fact he doesn't know where his life will go next. Recent interviews show that this is still the case.

He should also be credited for showing the lonely, insular side of loss: the friends displaying Joni Mitchell levels of devotion (weekly meals from Nigella Lawson or help with moving a bed from Gabriel Byrne), plus the ones who drop off the radar, or just don't know what to say. There are also the surreal mentions of Prince Charles popping round for a chat with flowers and mangoes from Highgrove.

It's a book that needs to be read without too much of a critical edge. Richard E Grant should be thanked for giving us his personal experience of what is a fact of life for all of us. And if you didn't know, Uxoriousness means "having an excessive fondness for one's partner". A Pocket Full of Happiness shows how close the fine line between love and loss actually is.

I'll keep your sacrifice alive


I spoke to you of legacy For when this hellish time is through All those who hauled or charged or carried Will be regarded heroes too


