



Lapford Weather Review




LAPFORD WEATHER OCTOBER 2022

The mildest October since 2006 thanks to a largely southerly airflow, slightly lower than average rainfall.

The warmest day was the 27^{th} with a maximum of 18.8° C and the coolest was the 10^{th} when the maximum was 14.5° C. The coldest night was on the 11^{th} with a minimum temperature of 1.4° C and a grass frost of -1.6° C.

Total rainfall was 91.8mm, about 10% drier than average. The wettest day was the 31st with a fall of 19.8mm.

THE HISTORY OF TOM SMITH

It was on a trip to Paris in 1840 that an adventurous and forward thinking Tom Smith discovered the 'bon bon' sugared almond, wrapped in a twist of tissue paper. Seven years later this simple idea evolved into the Christmas Cracker.



By placing a small love motto in the tissue paper he created enormous

interest in this product, especially at Christmas, and it was during a search for inspiration to achieve even greater sales that he casually threw a log on the fire. The crackle sound, made by the burning log, gave him the idea that would eventually lead to the crackers we know and love today. After a great deal of hard work and experimentation he came up with a cracking mechanism that created a 'pop' as the 'bon bon' wrapping was broken. This eventually became the snap and the cracker was born.

Over the next few years his idea evolved and grew and he moved from his original premises in Clerkenwell, East London, to Finsbury Square in the City. His sons, Tom, Walter and Henry, took over the business when he died and later a drinking fountain was erected in Finsbury Square, by Walter, in memory of his mother and to commemorate the life of the man who invented the Christmas Cracker.

It was Walter who introduced the paper hats and he toured the world to find new and unusual ideas for the gifts.

The company was very aware of current affairs and crackers were created for the Suffragettes, War Heroes, Charlie Chaplin, The Coronation and many other great occasions. Exclusive crackers were also made for the Royal Family and still are to this day.





JAPONICA, ORNAMENTAL QUINCE— JELLY OR STEWED

A reminder for those of you with ornamental quince in your gardens. The yellow or green fruits from this shrub make excellent quince jelly.

They can also be washed, cut in half, placed in a saucepan, barely covered with water, and stewed until soft.

Sieve the cooked fruit to remove the skins and seeds. A generous dollop or two of the aromatic puree can be added to apple crumble, apple pie, or stewed apple.

RAIL NEWS

As anticipated in last month's Lapford Lookout, we can now see the public railway timetables showing six additional Lapford trains on Saturdays, to bring this more-or-less into line with the enhancements to weekday services that we successfully negotiated two years' ago. The additional services are (towards Exeter), 0702, 11.06, 14.06, and 16.06; and



(towards Barnstaple) 09.50 and 12.50. We will continue to campaign to have ALL services with request stops at Lapford especially as there are still 3-hour gaps at certain times of day that make planning return journeys quite difficult.

To some people, the additional early train will be of great use when planning days out further afield on a Saturday; for example, it will now be possible to get to London by 10.09 whereas the earliest previous Saturday arrival into Paddington was 11.29.

LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

The weeks are rushing by and the festive period will soon be upon us. In school, we have been trying to hold off the Christmas chaos for a few more weeks but the sound of nativity practise and carol singing is beginning to creep into the corridors! The last month at Lapford CP School has been a busy one; just before half term we were able to celebrate Harvest Festival with a special assembly for friends and family. The children performed songs and shared art, poetry and prayers. It was a lovely celebration and well attended by our school community. We also held a collection to support the Foodbank at The ARK and we were incredibly grateful for the generous contributions from our families towards such a worthy cause.





In the last month our Lower Key Stage 2 football team have been! busy playing in two tournaments against other local schools from the surrounding areas. The first of these was held at Bow and was the first time the team had played together. They demonstrated fantastic sportsmanship and worked together superbly to create a really strong team who, despite some tricky games, managed to finish the tournament in third place. Last week they were back in action at Winkleigh, where they played against teams from Monkleigh, Bow and Winkleigh. The team were even more determined than in their previous tournament and they were overjoyed to make the final. The final game against Bow was incredibly tight and both teams had some good shots on goal which were saved expertly by the keepers. 












LADIES, AND OTHERS, SUPPORT FORCE

Our Ladies' night in October was a bit different because we invited anyone who was interested to join us. Originally simply a talk for the Ladies, we realised this was an opportunity to raise money for this excellent Charity. Soon a plan emerged to offer a curry supper (thank you so much John for your efforts in the kitchen and your generous donation of the ingredients) and a raffle (thank you very much Sue for your efforts in sourcing raffle prizes and selling tickets). Meriel Fishwick was booked for the 20th, we



found a venue as we were too big for The ARK and the Victory Hall was used on Thursdays and our preparations were complete.

The evening turned out to be very successful with the hall just about full. Meriel gave an interesting and informative talk about how FORCE came into being and how it is structured and funded. It has been a registered charity since 1987 and it grew out of a small number of volunteers who originally met in a small room at the hospital with the aim of helping cancer patients. At first the focus was on research and buying much needed equipment for the hospital but as FORCE grew, alongside this work, it began to develop its role in offering non-clinical support to cancer patients and their families. For many, it is this work of FORCE that is so familiar. Their lovely welcoming centre in the corner of the main car park at Wonford is a haven of tranquility away from the tension and sense of anonymity sometimes experienced in a busy bustling hospital (despite the efforts of very committed and caring staff). Meriel ran through the types of support they were able to offer. There is of course the ever-ready boiling kettle and sympathetic ear for anyone who needed to talk, invaluable in itself, but there is so much more. They have complimentary therapies, benefits advice, physiotherapy and exercise guidance as well as other health and well-being support. The range is impressive. Sadly, so many people today are touched directly or indirectly by cancer and the work done by FORCE is invaluable in supporting these people.

After the talk, the curry supper went down well amongst much chatter. When it was cleared away, the chatter subsided a little as people listened for their ticket number during the raffle before making their way home plus prize if they were lucky.

While the clearing up was done, so were the sums. We had decided that all the money gathered would go to FORCE and were able to give Meriel a cheque for £440. She wrote to us after the event saying how much she had enjoyed the evening; how welcome she had been made to feel and how grateful and surprised FORCE was by our donation. We would like to say thank you to all those who came along and to all those who helped. Between you, you made it into a very worthwhile and enjoyable evening.



A notice inside the lid of each bin gives instructions about the most efficient way to spread the grit in handfuls (see below). It would be helpful to have a small container with you when intending to spread grit.

USING THE GRIT IN THIS BIN

- The grit is only for use on the roads/pavements in this area – it is <u>not</u> for use on private drives and walkways. Householders should purchase their own supplies.
- Spread the grit as evenly as possible at the rate of a handful per square metre. Spreading more thickly will not be as effective and will waste supplies.
- Only treat areas you have assessed as slippery and dangerous.



Winter is on the way, and who knows how much ice and/or snow there will be to contend with. The grit bins are stationed in the most vulnerable areas of the village. They are there for anyone to use in order to help keep the roads and pavements safe for vehicles and pedestrians.

Please report to the Parish Council or the Snow Warden if you find that stocks of grit in a particular bin are low.







FUEL THEFTS



Following an increase in fuel thefts, we would like to remind people to remain vigilant and to consider the following Crime Prevention advice:

Fuel theft -vehicles:

- Secure vehicles and keys. (Do not leave keys in vehicles!)
- Consider locking fuel caps.
- Consider security lighting and overt/covert CCTV
- Consider the use of alarms and anti-siphoning devices
- Park vehicles in busy, well-lit or overlooked areas if possible, ideally covered by CCTV.
- Parking with the fuel filler cap facing the road may act as a deterrent as thieves cannot hide behind the vehicle
- Sign up to Farm/Business Watch and DCAlert

Fuel theft -tanks and heating oil:

- Position tank close to house or where it's overlooked or otherwise monitored.
- Switches that control the flow of oil should be turned off and electricity supplies should be isolated when tank is not in use.
- Invest in a quality lock. Closed shackle padlocks offer the most resistance.
- Consider installing an oil level gauge as they set off

audible alarms if the level in the tank suddenly drops or falls below a quarter full.

- Protect tanks and cylinders -install cages and use 'defensive planting.'
- Lock gates and compounds and make fences/hedges etc secure.
- Consider mobile refuelling equipment if a business.
- Join Farm/Business Watch and DCAlert
- Signage may act as a deterrent.

Battery theft:

- Follow relevant advice given above under fuel theft, and in addition:
- Deter thieves by uniquely marking batteries with, for example, a postcode, identifiable colours and dna markers.
- Consider installing a battery lock or secure box for electric fencing batteries which ideally is chained to a ground anchor or other immoveable object.
- Keep electric fencing batteries out of sight where possible
- Do not allow old batteries to accumulate on site as this may attract thieves.

Please report any suspicious activity immediately either via 999 - if an emergency (happening at the time) or 101 for non-emergency (already happened).

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW: STRICTLY ANN BY ANN WIDDICOMBE

The book opens with Ann describing her childhood as the daughter of a Senior Member of the Admiralty moving from posting to postings at home and abroad. She describes her experiences as a boarder at a convent school moving on to her experiences at Birmingham University. This was the start of her interest in politics having joined various debating societies enjoying the cut and thrust of debates.

During the 70's and 80's looking for a nomination to a constituency and facing many setbacks only made her more determined to achieve her goal eventually becoming an MP in 1987. Ann describes the highs and lows of political life concentrating mainly on aspects of government where she was very much involved. One example being the great prison debacle and the public fight with Michael Howard.

The debates on same sex marriages and Pro-Life and later the decision to allow women to become priests made Ann question her belief that the Anglican church had taken a step too far for her. This led to her decision to join the Catholic Church where her faith was restored and she felt at home at last.

Interesting to read about some of the reasons behind the choices made by Ann who writes about the cut and thrust, horse trading, wheeling and dealing plus back stabbing within Westminster along with constant pressure from the press. The mechanics of our system are curious to some and frustrating but a game to others representing us it seems.

The last few chapters tells us about the experience of Strictly Come Dancing of having fun and enjoying the whole thing. She has a busy life enjoying the chance to choose interests to please herself at last.

Whether you agree with her politics or not, it's clear that this is a woman of strong convictions, witty with a fun side that's not usually obvious.



BOOK REVIEW: MADLY, DEEPLY: THE DIARIES OF ALAN RICKMAN. EDITED BY ALAN TAYLOR.

I often place Alan Rickman's death in early 2016 with the other people we lost in that dark spring: Bowie, Prince, Victoria Wood (ironically, a close friend of Rickman's)... unique talents, auteurs we'll probably never seen the like of again. There was a literary auction for Rickman's diaries two years ago and I've been looking forward to them ever since.

Rickman is best known for *Die Hard* and *Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves* and those roles cast long, sunlit shadows over his career. He never mentions watching them, but he's always pleased to see the last half hour on TV. This fame gives him access to a sensual life of food, wine, films, theatre, foreign property purchases and the ability to pick and choose his roles - especially on stage. However, there is the element of self-doubt in all he does. His remarks on a 1998 production of Antony and Cleopatra bear witness to that. Rickman and Helen Mirren are in the leads, but it's never quite good enough ("It's so big, this play" "Another heavy silence hangs over the grey, grey day"). His friends tell him he was good, but reviews kill the play stone dead. He expects perfection in everything, even directing Strindberg's *Creditors* where his godson Tom Burke is one of the actors.



The magical elephant in the room of course is Potter. He signs up for it, feels confused about Snape's motivations. A phone call to JK Rowling helps, but he dismisses the whole thing as "tedious nonsense". Daniel Radcliffe is "serious and focussed, with a sense of fun", but Emma Watson's "diction is this side of Albania". He urges his agent to get him out of the contract after the first two, but to decides to plod on, ignoring the questions of Potterhead's; be they random children or Neil Kinnock's daughter. In that respect, the book is reminiscent of Piers Paul Read's book of Alec Guinness diaries: Phlegmatically bemused by the vast cheques from a galaxy, far, far away; but hating the whole thing. It also recalls Chris Williams' book on Richard Burton's diaries: doing jobs to do fund a luxuriant lifestyle. This is without Burton's self-destructive behaviour, but Rickman is constantly on crash diets to fit into Snape's robes.

Alan Taylor has consistently and impishly caught Rickman's spirit: dry, questioning and always seeking perfection. The appendix of earlier, sporadic diary keeping shows that. Challenged by appearing at RSC, but mildly offended by signing on. But there's that love of music, art, his wife, socialism, tennis. The last two combined in meeting John Major at Wimbledon (JM: "Thanks for all the enjoyment you've given us" AR: "I wish I could say the same of you.").

When the end comes, it's marked by the death of his friends (such as Mel Smith, Rik Mayall, Nastasha Richardson). Receiving his terminal diagnosis, his entry reads: "A different kind of diary now". He plans his own funeral, with music from Bruno Mars, Tom Waits and The Walker Brothers. There is ultimately an intense sense of loss - of what he was to his friends, the acting profession and what he still could have achieved.

Even better than you can possibly have imagined, this is an acid, aesthetic, absorbing delight. Call off Christmas until you've bought this book.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Maybe I need to get out more, but when I saw the new bus timetable in the November 'Lapford Lookout', and realised that DCC have managed to secure a contract with a different bus company after Stagecoach pulled out from delivering our service (apart from the most financially lucrative, the 'rush hour' buses) it made my day. I was even happier when I looked at the detail and realised that the new timetable is actually significantly better than the previous one – ie, every bus now comes up through the village, and there is no two hour gap in the afternoon.



I do personally have the alternative of getting in my car but I honestly prefer going by bus when I go to Crediton or Exeter, if I can - no parking hassle, beautiful views out of the windows as I am higher up than in my car, and the opportunity of a bit of people watching. But I think a lot of the older people who use the bus don't have a car, and they maybe rely on the bus for getting shopping, or seeing friends.

It seems so important right now, with the need to reduce our carbon emissions, that we have good public transport links so that we are not forced to use cars so much. It's also good for our health - we get a bit of exercise. My personal view is that trains and buses should be seen as an essential service, not as a business opportunity, and that they should be back in public ownership with no shareholders involved – but I expect there are people who disagree with me.

I guess I'm writing this letter because I think we are really lucky to still have this service in these times, particularly as it is a subsidised route and, as we know, our local authority is really strapped for cash and is going to be even more so next year due to yet more cuts in government funding.

We've probably all seen the new little red buses going through the village. Maybe using a bus isn't something you think of doing usually, or maybe there are reasons why you can't. I'm not a saint, I do use my car for work because I have to carry heavy stuff around in my boot, so I'm not intending to preach. All I'm saying is, keep the idea of using these buses in your mind; The saying, 'Use it or Lose it' is so true.

Finally, (in case you are wondering) I do not work for or hold shares in this or any other bus company!

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, NOVEMBER 2022

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The ARK.

The Parish Council met on 8th November 2022 in the Victory Hall. Sixteen members of the public attended.

- The Parish Council had to re-run the election for councillor co-options this month because of procedural problems in October. It had three positions to fill and five people applied for consideration. The result was that Steven Fletcher, Bill Graham and Malcolm Hayes were all co-opted as councillors and their term of office will end in May 2023.
- There will be **councillor elections** for all ten positions on the parish council on **4**th **May 2023** and councillors are keen for anyone wishing to come onto the council after that date to put their names forward. More details of how this has to be done will be available in the new year, so if you are interested keep your eyes open.
- There was a lively public participation part of the meeting where people opposing the development in Eastington Lane for 14 homes were given their chance to present their case to the parish council, the details of which are reproduced in full in the minutes. The parish council, later in the meeting, agreed with the points being made and would be submitting its own objection to the application, number 22/0910/MOUT.
- The Parish Council had laid a concrete entrance to the footpath where it appears in Park Meadow Close and has laid a base for the Memorial Bench, which has now been installed.
- The 'Village Website' was to be made available to the LP2K group to use for community information.
- The Parish Council budget and precept setting for the year 2023/2024 had started. There would be more information available after the December meeting but councillors were acutely aware that the current financial situation was difficult and would set a precept accordingly.
- New Christmas lights are to be purchased and installed shortly. The aim was to provide a bit of Christmas cheer at a somewhat gloomy time.
- The next meeting of the Parish Council was to be Tuesday 13th December 2022 at 7.30pm, in the Victory Hall. All are welcome to attend.


