



### Lapford Weather Review



#### LAPFORD WEATHER DECEMBER 2022 **AND ANNUAL REVIEW 2022**

Thanks to the cold first half of December, it was cooler than average overall by nearly two degrees C. It was also drier than average.

The mildest day was on the  $19^{th}$ , with a maximum of  $14.0^{\circ}$ C, and the coldest was the 12th when the temperature just scraped above freezing to 0.1°C. The coldest night was on the 16<sup>th</sup> with a minimum of -7.4°C, and a grass frost of -11.5°C. The grass temperature fell a fraction lower on the 9<sup>th</sup> (-11.7°C).

Snow covered the ground from the morning of the 10<sup>th</sup> to the morning of the 18<sup>th</sup> when rain was rapidly thawing what was left. In all there were 9 days of snow covering the ground, the highest count since December 2010, indeed this was the coldest December since then.

Total rain for the month was 99.6mm, the second half of the month being quite wet as well as mild. The wettest day was the 19<sup>th</sup> with 16.2mm rain.

The windiest day was shared by the 19th and 28th with gusts of 42 m.p.h.

#### 2022

A milder and drier than average year. The mean temperature was 10.9°C as opposed to the average of 10.2°C. (records going back to 1988) This equalled 1989, but was a fraction lower than the warmest year which was 2014, when the mean was 11.1°C, so no records broken here whereas some other parts of the UK had their warmest year since reliable measurements began in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Total rainfall was 846.2mm, the average being 963.4mm.

The year will probably be best remembered for the dry summer and short hot spells. July produced only 9.7mm rain (the driest on record) and the warmest day of 32.2°C. August would also have been very dry were it not for two wet days in

the middle of the month. A temperature of 32.9°C was recorded, the second highest of ( any August day. (The hottest August day (35.5°C) was in 1990, so hot weather is nothing new).

#### **LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES JANUARY 2023**

At the time of going to print, we had not received any notes from the January meeting of the Parish Council. We hope to be able to bring you up to date with both the January and February meetings in the March issue of the Lapford Lookout.

#### **PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS - 4TH MAY 2023**

Candidate nominations will be from Monday 20 March to Tuesday 4 April. They must be delivered by hand to Phoenix House, Tiverton, EX16 6PP between 10am and 4pm any day during that period, except weekends.

#### THE ROLE OF A PARISH COUNCILLOR

The main role of a Parish Councillor is to represent the views of all residents within the parish and to listen to, and understand, the views and needs of different groups in the community. There is a responsibility to be wellinformed, especially about diverse local views. Councillors cannot assume that they represent the interests of electors without consulting them.

Parish Councillors are elected representatives (they are neither volunteers nor employees) and serve for a 4-year term unless co-opted or elected in a by-election when they serve until the next election. They must apply the law and comply with the Code of Conduct and other adopted policies of the council. Councillors are required to act in an ethical way and to declare an interest when necessary.

Councillors contribute to the work of the council by suggesting ideas, influencing policy and strategy, engaging in constructive debate and by responding to the needs and views the community. Councillors comment proposals to ensure the best outcome and vote to enable the council to make decisions.

Individual Parish Councillors cannot make decisions on behalf of the council, but they can actively lead engage with local projects.

The Parish Council needs a wide range of skills and experience to work as a team. Councillors from different backgrounds better represent the whole community and possess different enthusiasms, skills, attitudes interests.

#### MID DEVON MEDICAL PRACTICE NEWS

Hannah Baker is our Primary Care Network Pharmacy Technician. The Mid Devon Medical Practice is in a Primary Care Network (PCN) with three other local Practices. Our Primary Care Network is called Mid Devon Healthcare PCN. The PCN employees a group of professionals to help support the four practices.



#### Q&A's

- What is your role within the Primary Care Network?
   I work as part of the PCN Pharmacy team as a Pharmacy Technician alongside a Clinical Pharmacist.
- 2. In what way will you be involved in the care of the patients from the Mid Devon Medical Practice?
  My current involvement for the practice is quite 'behind the scenes'. Patients may occasionally receive a telephone call from myself, but at the moment I'm working on looking at prescribing trends against local and national guidelines, running reports, reviewing safety audits and helping with national and local NHS contracts. All of these tasks aim to build on the core work of current primary care services and enable greater provision of proactive, personalised, coordinated and more integrated health and social care for our communities.
- 3. What aspect of your job do you enjoy the most?

  There are so many aspects of this job I enjoy and I find that every day is different, which is great. Narrowing it down, I particularly enjoy working in a team environment and I'm learning a lot by working alongside various professions and clinical expertise. It's also been really lovely meeting and getting to know patients and learning more about the local area.
- 4. Can you tell us about any projects you are currently working on?

A couple projects we are currently working on are:

Checking controlled drug prescriptions have the most appropriate and clear instructions to ensure safe and effective use for patients.

Ensuring that patients taking Statins are getting the most effective and cost-efficient treatment in line with national prescribing guidelines and GP approval.

Assisting with reviews of various processes within the practice and offering advice/assistance.

- 1. Be very clear about exactly how much money you have coming in and going out each month and be realistic about what you really need for essentials like food and travel.
- 2. Set yourself a budget that you can stick to. You may find our budgeting tool useful to help you.

If any of your bills do go up during the year, you can go back to our budgeting tool at any time, create a new plan and stay in control.

- 4. Make sure you are getting all the income you are entitled to

5. As credit or store card bills land on the mat it is perfectly understandable that these debts add to your worries but the priority has to be paying your rent/mortgage, energy bills and Council Tax as failing to pay these has serious consequences. 

#### LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

The Spring term is well underway at Lapford Primary School and although the weather hasn't been entirely on our side, we are determined to get outside and make the most of our wonderful grounds.

This term we are excited to be able to offer weekly forest school sessions for all children. Forest school has been proven to support children in so may ways from helping them learn about the natural environment to building positive relationships and improving emotional wellbeing. We are fortunate at Lapford to have such a

well-established wooded area and our resident forest expert, Mrs Kigongo, who has recently undertaken forest school leader training. In our first sessions we have been focussing on trees: identifying, planting and taking cuttings using secateurs.



Also this term, we have begun our OPAL journey. OPAL is a two-year school improvement programme that aims to improve playtimes for all children to ensure they have the best possible time and the most possible fun. One of our first steps was to introduce some new playtime equipment and the children have loved building giant marble runs together (using old guttering), playing small world games with the Barbies and digging in the mud pit!

It has been wonderful to see the children mixing across classes and we have talked lots about the importance of teamwork, which is one of out Trust

values. We are noticing that the children are beginning to take this on board – playing more collaboratively and finding solutions to conflict amongst themselves.





Over the coming months we will be introducing more new equipment and opening up more of our grounds for the children to explore at playtimes. The ethos of OPAL is that children should be able to make use of the whole site every day and that play should cater for sixteen different play types!



#### **VALENTINES CREAMY SALMON TAGLIATELLE**

#### Ingredients

250g salmon fillet 1 concentrated vegetable stock pot 1 onion, chopped 200g tagliatelle 125g frozen peas 250ml crème fraiche



#### Method

Heat oven to 220°C. Put the salmon on a lined baking tray and cook in the oven for 15 minutes.

Bring 1ltr of salted water to the boil. Add the vegetable stock pot and onion and then stir to combine and plunge in the tagliatelle. Return to the boil and cook for 5 minutes.

Add the peas to the pasta pan and cook for 3 minutes until the peas and pasta are tender. Drain the pasta, reserving just a little stock in the base of the pan.

Return the pasta to the pan with the crème fraiche. Remove the salmon from the skin and add in chunks to the pan. Gently stir to combine.

Season with salt and ground black pepper.

#### DREAMY CHOCOLATE CAKE WITH SUNFLOWER OIL

#### Ingredients

175g self-raising flour

2 tbsp cocoa powder

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

150g caster sugar

2 large eggs, lightly beaten

2 tbsp golden syrup

150ml sunflower oil, plus extra for the tin

150ml semi-skimmed milk

#### For the Icing

100g unsalted butter

225g icing sugar

40g cocoa powder

2½ tbsp milk (a little more if needed)

#### Method

Heat the oven to 180c/160c fan. Oil and line two 18cm cake tins. Sieve the flour, cocoa powder and bicarbonate into a bowl and add the caster sugar.

Add the golden syrup, eggs, sunflower oil and milk into a well in the centre of the dry mix and whisk well until smooth.

Put half the mixture into each tin and cook for 25-30 minutes until they are firm to the touch. Turn out of tins after 10 minutes and allow to fully cool.

Make the icing by beating the butter until soft and gradually sieve the icing sugar and cocoa powder whisking well you can add the milk a bit at a time until the icing is spreadable and fluffy.

Sandwich the cakes together, fill and fully coat with icing. Enjoy!

I alerted other truckers and searched until it was pitch black. Nothing. Eventually the others left, some said, "I'll pray for you." I wasn't so sure God was listening. I'd already been praying for hours. Next morning, I had to get on the road and when I opened my laptop and pulled up my Facebook page, it was full of postings. "We're praying for you." "Hang in there." "Trust God." I felt comforted; someone besides me was worried about my dog. If only I could get back to Atlanta soon. I



thought about praying, "Lord, get me an assignment in Atlanta ..... NOW!" I knew it could take weeks but when I clicked on my company's website to check the destination of my next job ....... it was *Atlanta*. Next morning, my cell phone woke me up. It was Russ, the maintenance supervisor. "I saw your dog on the way to work." I couldn't believe my ears. I had to get to Atlanta. From the truck centre, Russ drove me to where he had seen my dog. After searching for hours, I glanced over my shoulder ...... and there she sat on the doorstep of a house. She bolted over and as I picked her up, I prayed, "Thank you God." The Bible says, "Give all your worries and cares to God, for He cares about you (1 Peter 5:7). Coldiron adds, "Who knows what's going on in a dog's mind? One thing I know is we are never alone and God always answers prayer.

## THE BIG FREEZE 1962-3

## The 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of a memorable winter



The winter of 1962-3 was the coldest in Lapford for at least two hundred years and the coldest in all parts of England since 1895. In Kent the temperature was so low that the sea froze up to a mile from shore, but it was Devon that suffered the largest snow drifts.

Lapford avoided the initial outbreak of snow that hit most of the country in mid-December, but a blizzard with gale force easterly winds raged through the South-West on 29 and 30 December. Drifts, 30 feet deep in places, blocked roads and railways. Numerous villages, including Lapford, were cut off. Dartmoor, major army operations were staged to rescue hundreds of buried animals.

Snow fall continued into the new year. The heaviest fall in Lapford came on 06 February. Bovril News reported on the extraordinary efforts of villagers to keep the Ambrosia factory operational.

"At 2.30am on 6th February, after finishing his late shift, Richard Rice, the charge hand of the canning department, decided to make the three mile walk to his home. In ordinary circumstances there would have been nothing unusual about this, but 6th February happened to have the heaviest fall of snow during a period when a day without a snowfall would have been an event.

There was little moon that morning and the skies were still heavy with cloud. The road leading from the factory had been kept fairly clear by ploughs but further along, where he had to turn off on to a side road, the drifts became deeper. It was not long before the only way of telling that he was on the right route was by following the tops of the telegraph poles. Soon, these too went out of view and Richard alternated by walking along the tops of the hedgerows and clambering down to follow the tractor trails in the fields below.

Back on to the hedgerows and then confronted by what seemed a hill of drifted snow, he decided to try and climb over the drift; as he reached the top his hands touched something solid. He scraped the snow away and found himself looking through a pane of glass into a small room. Once over the initial surprise he

found that he was on top of a farm cottage, the roof of which is ORY..co.uk normally over fifteen feet above the roadway."




Richard Rice's story is probably the most unusual during a time when almost everyone in Lapford and the surrounding districts were at odds with the weather. But rather than being unique in itself it epitomised the ceaseless effort made by all to keep products of the factory flowing. Somehow most of the people managed to get to work and keep the factory fully operational.

Perhaps the most difficult task of all was the drivers'. Each morning they would set out from Lapford determined to collect the milk and get it back as near to the scheduled time as possible. Conditions were fantastic and where tractors and snow ploughs had been out during the night trying to clear the side roads, even they found themselves unable to move.

The farmers played their part in the campaign and one farmer virtually turned his house into a trading post. The roads were usable up to his front gate but beyond that they were blocked. Farmers from the surrounding district made their way on foot or by tractor over the fields to his house, where they left their churns of milk and collected the empties along with the post and supplies of food. It was this kind of spirit that made it possible for Lapford to remain operational.

It was nothing unusual for drivers to be returning to the factory hours after their normal time, and it is a well-deserved compliment to their skill to record that there were no serious accidents or damage to the vehicles during the whole time the arctic conditions persisted. A good indication of just how cold it became was that the diesel fuel for the lorries froze. A call to the local fuel supplier solved the problem: petrol was added and this kept it in liquid form. During the entire six weeks milk was arriving at Lapford frozen solid and so added one more operation to an already hard-pressed schedule.

The weather may of course be what seems to be called changeable, so please bring suitable clothing and footwear.





#### THE CHIMES ARE BACK

Most residents will already be aware the Parish Clock is now back chiming and we trust will remain a reliable and regular sound of Lapford life for many years to come. Three new motors have been installed to wind the three parts of the clock as and when required, together with refurbished weights, new steel cables and a new chain drive system.







The weights drive the clock through the drums on the ends of the motors then via the chains. When the weights reach their limits the motors then rewind them back up. The left-hand motor/weight works the quarter chimes, the centre one the clock itself and the right-hand one the hour chimes. Unlike before, each motor has its own electronics and control system. The clever part is that if a weight reaches its limit whilst 'working' the rewind motor keeps that part of the clock going at the same time as winding the weight back up to the ceiling.

The 19th century vintage clock mechanism then operates hammers which strike on the outside of the bells in the room above, unlike when the bells are rung in a peal, where they are swung around and struck by their larger internal clappers. This is why the bells sound quieter for the clock.

The repairs have been funded by the Parish Council as the clock was originally gifted to the whole community but mounted on the tower rather than constructing a new building to house it.
