


# LAPFORD WEATHER NOVEMBER 2022

Milder and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the 11<sup>th</sup> with a maximum of 16.8°C, not quite the mildest November day I have measured, but pretty close - the mildest at 17.0 °C was way back in 1999.

The coolest day was the 30<sup>th</sup> with a maximum of 8.8°C. The coldest night was on the 19<sup>th</sup> with a minimum of 1.1°C, and a grass temperature of -4.2°C.

This was a month of rain, with a total of 167.8 mm, more than 150% of the average. The wettest day was the 16th with 23.3 mm.





## **GUINNESS FRUIT LOAF**

Ingredients:

½ pint (300ml) Guinness (or stout) 12 oz (300g) mixed dried fruit

1 egg

4oz (100g) brown sugar

8oz (200g) Self raising flour

Soak the dried fruit in the Guinness overnight. Place the flour and sugar in a mixing bowl, add the egg and soaked fruit. Stir well, and place in a lined 2lb (1kg) loaf tin. Bake in a moderately hot oven, 175c, for 45 - 50 minutes. This can be sliced and buttered, but is rich enough to eat on its own.



# **LADIES GET FESTIVE**



On a chilly evening in November, the Ladies gathered in The ARK looking forward to getting creative. The plan was to mold some small Christmas decorations. We

were to have Fimo to make small tree hangings and sugar modelling paste to make cake decorations. We had Ron and Joy as our tutors for the evening.

First, we had Ron show us what to do with the Fimo. He came along very well prepared. He had made some little models to demonstrate what could be achieved and he had cut and brought small boards for us to work on. He had also cut the Fimo into small pieces and created little individual tinfoil parcels which contained all we needed to make each model. We gathered round him and admired the small Santa with his sack which had been attached to a small pin to make a brooch, the Christmas tree dotted with snow which was attached to a small cut of wood to hang from a Christmas tree and similarly the jolly Santa face that could also be attached to a small wooden plaque for hanging from a branch.



We watched as Ron demonstrated the process. Starting with a small lump of green stuff, he worked it until it was soft and then pressed and molded it into a leaf shape. He marked little veins along it with a sharp knife and then added tiny little rolled balls of white to make small snowflakes. He made it look very easy and when he had finished, it was our turn. The concentration was impressive as several heads bent to the task. The room is normally full of chatter and this was still there in bursts from time to time as people discussed and displayed their success but often the room was quiet as we worked on our pieces.



Meanwhile, Joy had set up her stall for those who wanted to try cake decorations. She too, had made her preparations and she shared sugar modeling paste and Christmas colouring with a group at her table and demonstrated her skills. She showed her 'pupils' how to shape the sugar paste and use the colours carefully and sparingly and soon some delightful little snowmen were lining up on the table. It was surprising how different they looked even though they were done to roughly the same design. Some were more portly, the hat shapes varied as did their expressions. Some of us had a go at guessing who had made which snowman but we were not very successful with our guesses. They clearly enjoyed their crafting as there was a lot of laughter and chat from that table.



By the end of the evening, we had amassed an impressive number of decorations. We were quite late finishing because everyone wanted to complete what they were working on. Nobody was rushing off home but eventually our pieces were perfected and the tidying up began. It was a really enjoyable evening thanks to the expertise of Ron and Joy. Ron told us how to bake the Fimo pieces so that they would last for quite a while if handled carefully. This Christmas, I think there will be a few trees in Lapford with an additional hanging or two and some jolly fat snowmen sitting on top of a few cakes.

# BBKA Okehampton Branch, Basic Beekeeping Course, eight sessions, starting January 2023

Okehampton Beekeepers are running a Beekeeping Training Course of 8 evening sessions. These will be held fortnightly, at Whiddon Down Village Hall, from 7 pm to 9 pm on alternate Wednesday evenings from January 18<sup>th</sup> through to May 3<sup>rd.</sup>.

The course costs £100, payable in advance at the initial session on January 18<sup>th</sup>. Payment can be by card, cheque or cash. Alternatively to pay on-line, see website <a href="https://okehamptonbee.co.uk">https://okehamptonbee.co.uk</a> and access the Membership Form, to be found on the Membership Page, for bank details. If paying on-line then be sure to put your name as reference and e-mail confirmation to the Branch Treasurer.

Payment in full will automatically include:

- FREE The excellent BBKA Guide to Beekeeping book (normally costs £18.99)
- Full registered membership of Devon Beekeepers (DBKA), worth £39
- Bee Disease Insurance for up to 3 colonies
- Monthly on-line copies of the Devon Beekeepers magazine
- Monthly delivery of the British Beekeepers' magazine, BBKA News

Please note; course applicants who have already paid their membership, only need to pay a fee of £61.

The course will follow the syllabus required for the BBKA Basic Assessment. Course students are encouraged to take the Basic Assessment once they have completed the course and have kept bees for their first year (but this is of course optional). Membership of Okehampton Beekeepers entitles course students to reimbursement of the Basic Assessment Exam fee (£25) on successfully passing the exam.

Course session dates are fortnightly, on alternate Wednesdays, as follows: January 18, February 1, February 15, March 15, March 29, April 19 and May 3. A number of informal follow-up practical sessions in May and June will give the opportunity to handle and inspect colonies of bees, putting into practice knowledge learnt during the course. 
Everything is getting more expensive and it's a really difficult time for a lot of people so it's sensible to be thinking how to manage. There are lots of things you can do to try and stay in control of your money.

Before you start spending, work out exactly what money you have coming in and going out each month. Be realistic about what you need for essentials like food and travel. Buy Now Pay Later (BNPL) schemes look tempting but the money does still need to be repaid so keep a record of how much you owe in total. Always make sure you understand what you are signing up for, how you'll make the repayments and what will happen if you can't pay on time. It's also important to check the returns process for both the retailer and the credit provider. Paying through BNPL may also affect the cost of postage returns if you've ordered online. The riskiest thing about it is that you're not guaranteed to be protected if something goes wrong so for example, you can't go to the Financial Ombudsman if you have a complaint.

Always prioritise your priority bills and essentials, (rent/mortgage, energy bills, Council Tax, food and travel). At Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon we have a specialist team offering advice on managing money and debt. Alternatively there is our national debt helpline available on 0800 240 4420.

# **BOOK REVIEW: WILDEST HUNGER BY LAURA LAAKSO**

Crime novels. Everyone is either writing them, or reading them. Personally, in this age of constant content I'm addicted to the idea of a morally-conflicted individual, dressed in charity shop donations entertaining me on Sunday night TV.

Yannia Wilde is your atypical, defective detective. She has an on/off boyfriend, a fixer and a snout. She has a contact in the police, but her methods are regarded as both eldritch and unconventional. Her cases are gory, steeped in sex, mystery and murder.

So far, so-so. Now, let's flip the script. Wildest Hunger is set in a world where supernatural beings co-exist uneasily with humans. Wilde is one such, her beloved Dearon is another. Her fixer is Karrion, a bird shaman. Her snout runs a magical shop. This is Wilde's third case and a series of dismembered bodies lead to a conspiracy at the dark hearth of the magical world.



Wildest Hunger will tick a lot of boxes for crime fans. It's also got enough sleaze and gore to satisfy Scandi crime fans. Wilde is certainly as dysfunctional and damaged as let's say, Rebus or Holy. What raises it, is the purely realised and well thought-out magical world. There is a bare minimum of my own personal hate: info dumping. That is real skill, even when reading the third book in a series out of sequence.


There are also sudden and thrilling shifts, particularly when Wilde can "borrow" the abilities of animals. There is a thrilling and gory dénouement between Wilde and the killer. There are also dashes of dark humour - Karrion loves a fried breakfast, but don't give him eggs.

It's an involving read and enough to sink your fangs into, even if you haven't read the other two books and the novella that Wilde features in. Plus, the novel finishes on a blue note that will lead into the next one.

What is surprising is that Laakso has created a magical world that is acceptant of sub-culture, diversity and difference. In a world where fantasy can be... shall we say, divisive - Laakso has created a fictional world where everyone belongs. As society grows ever darker, it's a mystery why some magical kingdoms (both spiritual and temporal) seem less diverse than others. Wildest Hunger is a thrilling, magical ride.
