CELERIAC SALAD

celeriac, mayonnaise, cider vinegar, chopped chives, salt, pepper and a little mustard.

Peel the celeriac and cut into wedges so it's easier to grate. Grate and sprinkle with a little salt. Mix well and allow to rest for 20 minutes.

Squeeze out the moisture and season the celeriac with freshly ground black pepper, mustard, add a splash of cider vinegar.

Mix in enough mayonnaise to make a creamy salad. Sprinkle with smoked paprika and chopped chives.

Lapford Weather Review



LAPFORD WEATHER FEBRUARY 2023

Slightly milder than average, very dry. The month alternated between mild spells and cooler ones.

The warmest day was the 15th with a maximum of 12.4 $^{\circ}$ C and the coolest was the 25th with a maximum of 6.1 $^{\circ}$ C. The coldest night was on the 10th with a minimum of -2.7 $^{\circ}$ C. On the 27th the grass temperature fell to -9.0 $^{\circ}$ C.

Total rainfall was just 13.6 mm, only 18% of the average for February. Only February 1993 has been drier.

The windiest day was shared by the 22nd, 23rd and 26th, all of which had gusts of 37 m.p.h.




CHULMLEIGH & DISTRICT GARDEN SOCIETY

LAPFORD VILLAGE MARKET

Please note the May Village Market has been cancelled.

"I ordered a watch online with personalised engraving for my partner's upcoming 40th birthday. The company has since gone out of



business. I keep phoning and emailing them but can't get through to anyone. I'm assuming they can't fulfil my order but I'd paid for the watch upfront and can't afford to buy another gift until I get my money back. Please help!"

This is frustrating both in terms of potential loss of money but also in terms of the time spent searching for a suitable gift. If you haven't had a dispatch note yet it suggests that the order is not on its way.

If the company has gone into administration it may still be able to fulfil outstanding orders but if the company is already in liquidation, you'll need to try to get your money back. If you're unsure about what state the company is in the Citizens Advice website has information on how to find out. https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk.

As it was an online purchase it seems unlikely that there is a shop or office that you can contact so the next steps depend on whether it's a limited company (with 'ltd.' or 'plc' after its title) or if it's a sole trader or partnership.

If it's a limited company you will need to get details of the administrator or receiver – the person dealing with settling the trader's debts. The names of those administrators will usually be on the website of the company that's gone bust. You should register your claim as a creditor on the GOV.UK website. Fill out the form with the details of what you are owed and send it to the administrator dealing with the trader's debts.

Unfortunately there is only a small chance that any money will be refunded as there will be a long list of creditors and individual small claims will be at the back of the queue.

More encouraging is to try and get a refund with a Section 75 claim or a chargeback on the credit card provider or bank. Again, check out the Citizens Advice website for details of making these claims. This is actually the best option if the seller was not a limited company but a sole trader or partnership. Every case is different but to establish specific rights in a given situation call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 223 1133 or visit https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/somethings-gone-wrong-with-a-purchase/if-a-company-stops-trading-or-goes-out-of-business/



LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, FEBRUARY 2023

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The Ark.

The Parish Council met on 14th February 2023 in the Victory Hall. Thirty-six members of the public attended.

- The main topic of discussion was the Executive Summary of the Youth Club & Lower Town Place report, a full version of which would be published in March 2023. The overall conclusion was that there were few concerns about either the sale of the youth club or the purchase of Lower Town place and that where matters could have been done better is a lesson for the future. The overall feeling was that the Parish Council should concentrate on looking forward and helping to provide facilities for the youth of the village.
- The Parish Council agreed to underwrite the cost of the upcoming Coronation celebrations to a sum of £500, which would be added to the surplus made at the Jubilee celebrations last year. The expectation was the income would more than likely cover costs, so this was just in case it did not.
- The Parish Council had received an Orchard Centre Fire Risk Assessment which identified several matters that needed to be attended to.
- The Archive Cupboard in the Orchard Centre would now be locked with the key in a key-safe inside the building.
- The replacement of Parish Clerk who has resigned with effect from 31st May 2023 was now being undertaken and anyone interested should give him a call or email to find out what was involved.
- Parish Council Elections were due to take place on 4th
 May 2023 and potential Councillors should look at the
 Parish Council website to see how they should go about
 putting themselves forward.



PHOTO ID REQUIRED TO VOTE

Parish and District Council elections will occur across Mid Devon on 4th May and, for the first time, all voters will need to bring a valid photo ID. If you don't have a valid form of photo ID you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate (VAC).

The forms of ID you can use to vote are:

- UK passport
- A passport issued by an EEA (European Economic Area) state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving license (including provisional licence)
- Older person's bus pass
- Disabled person's bus pass
- A blue badge
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)



THOUGHTS FROM THE ARK

Virginia Randolph was a pioneer in black education. She began teaching in a southern rural school in 1892. As she tried to instil high ethical standards along with the "three R's," many parents



resented it. In fact, one mother bragged about whipping every teacher at the school. She vowed Miss Randolph would be next.

One day Virginia saw a woman standing on the porch with a long stick. She had just finished reading 1 Corinthians 13 to her class. "Children," she began, keeping her voice steady, "this morning I am going to pray. "Lord, have mercy on the dear mother who came to school today." "So glad to see you, dear mother." Then Virginia led the boys and girls singing the hymn "I need thee every hour." She continued, "Now, students, this has been the first mother to visit school. She has two lovely children, and you know the hand that rocks the cradle rules the world. Don't you feel proud. I will ask her to speak to us." The mother was so touched, her eyes filled with tears. "I came for one thing and found another," she said, "I will never disturb the classroom again." She kept her promise and became a willing school worker.

Isn't it amazing how love disarms hostility? It was true in 1892 and it is just as true now. 1 Corinthians 13, in the Bible, describes love... "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast. It is not rude, it is not self seeking. It is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

The final verse to chapter 13 states, "And now these three remain faith, hope and love but the greatest of these three is love." If you have a Bible, read the complete chapter of 1 Corinthians 13, in the New Testament.

It also begs the question, who do you love that much that you would willingly give your life and die in their place. Jesus did that for each one of us and that is what Easter is really about. Not about chocolate, rabbits, eggs and chicks. One man's life for mankind, now that's love indeed.

The ARK will close from the end of Friday 31 March and will open again on Tuesday 18 April. We will be doing some volunteer training and cleaning during those two weeks. The food bank will still be operating, delivering parcels and food to those who need help. Thank you to all who have kept us going with food donations, it's not been very easy, as food prices have continued to rise and we have been buying in items so that we can continue supplying people.

The team at The ARK wish you and your family God's peace and joy at this special time of Easter.



LADIES LEARN ABOUT WIND POWER

We gathered in The ARK on our usual third Thursday in February for a talk by two speakers about wind farms and specifically the wind farm just outside Bow. Anyone travelling regularly between Lapford and Okehampton will be used to the sight of the great arms sweeping through the air.

Despite how familiar they are now, the site has not been there for very many years. It might have been there a lot longer were it not for the opposition from local people. The Den Brook Valley Action Group was formed when proposals were first put forward in 2004 and when the planning application was submitted, 2,915 objection letters were received including letters from Dartmoor National Park and Dartmoor Preservation Association. There were 71 letters in support. This Council did decide to refuse the first planning application. What followed was a long battle over several years between the two sides as appeals were made and upheld and then overturned once more until finally in 2011, the last attempt to prevent it going ahead was rejected. Even then, work did not begin on the site until 2015 and it was fully operational in 2016.

The information above was not actually part of the talk but I remembered there had been controversy and thought it would be interesting to balance the favourable view that the speakers gave with an awareness of the initial opposition. The talk concentrated on factual information about wind farms and this site in particular and about how much electricity it could generate. There are nine turbines, each 120 metres high to the blade tip. That bit I did retain but as more figures and statistics were mentioned and more maths seemed to be needed. I struggled a bit to keep up. In support of the site, the speakers were keen to explain that in their view it had brought some protection for certain species of wildlife and flora and fauna because of the conditions that had to be met in order for the planning to be approved and because of the careful monitoring that was done. He also pointed out the financial benefits that the area had received. He spoke about the Community Benefit Fund which makes money available for local projects, the local electricity discounts available to properties within 2.3 km of the turbines and the improvements made to the link road at Whiddon Down.

At the end of the talk, there were questions raised about noise disturbance, habitat damage and animal welfare and the visual impact in an area so close to Dartmoor which the speakers did their best to answer. Wind farms always seem to






