





Lapford Weather Review



LAPFORD WEATHER JANUARY 2023

A very average January, half mild and wet and half cold and dry. Just one day with snow. No particularly notable days.

The mildest day was the 10th with a maximum of 12.8 $^{\circ}$ C and the coolest was the 17th with a maximum of 3.5 $^{\circ}$ C. The coldest night was on the 24th with a minimum of -4.0 $^{\circ}$ C. The lowest grass temperature was -9.0 $^{\circ}$ C on the 21st .

Total rainfall was 110.5mm, just a little wetter than average and the wettest day was the 11th with 22.6mm.

The windiest day was also the 11th with a gust of 42 m.p.h.

THE ROLE OF A PARISH CLERK

The role of a Parish Clerk is to ensure that the council conducts its business properly and to provide independent, objective and professional advice and support. They are under a statutory duty to carry out all the functions, and to serve or issue all the notifications required by the law of a Local Authority's Proper Officer. The Parish Clerk is an employee of the Parish Council. They are not an elected officer and can only make decisions which the Parish Council's elected Members delegate to them. Typically, these responsibilities are set out in the Parish Clerk's contract of employment and include most day-to-day administrative functions.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, FEBRUARY 2023

We have not been able to include any notes from the February meeting of the Parish Council as it took place after the copy deadline for this issue. We hope to be able to include these in the April issue of the Lapford Lookout.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, JANUARY 2023

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the draft minutes is available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The ARK.

The Parish Council met on 10th January 2023 in the Victory Hall. Six members of the public attended.

- Concerns were expressed about the missing County Councillor as it was felt she should attend more Parish Council meetings.
- Concerns were also expressed about problems with street lighting not working, highway and public rights of way and flooding causing damage to property.
- A presentation to Eddie, the former postman, would be arranged by Councillor Down.
- District Councillor Clive Eginton said that Mid Devon was looking at the possibility of increasing recycling collections to weekly rather than fortnightly in the future. He would report back later on this.
- The Parish Council precept for the year beginning 1st April 2023 would be raised to £25,000, increasing the charge for a band D property to £63.44, which was an extra £12.91 for the year equivalent to £1 per month or 25pence per week. The need to cover the cost of an election in May 2023 and to increase the amount of maintenance done around the village had been the main reasons for the increase. The Parish Council was looking to achieve more direct benefit for residents.
- The Parish Clerk, Rob Martin, announced that he intended to resign from his post, effective from 1st June 2023 as he had realised that this role had been one too many jobs for a man of his advanced years. Advertisements would be placed to find a replacement in time for some period of crossover.

Fretting about something that may never happen is like paying interest on misery.

"I've just been offered a new job and now I need to tell my current employer. The new company wants me to start as soon as possible. The



problem is, we're already a bit short-staffed where I am now and I don't know how soon I'll be allowed to leave. How should I bring this up with my boss?"

It can feel awkward telling your current employer you're moving on. The time between telling your employer you've found a new position and you actually leaving is known as your notice period.

If you've been in your current job for less than a month, you won't have to give any notice period unless you have a contract that states otherwise. If it's more than a month, you'll have to give at least one week's notice. Your contract should make it clear how long is expected.

If you don't have a contract and your employer has no written record of you agreeing to a notice period, you should give at least one week's notice.

It's worth waiting until your new employer has confirmed your employment, e.g. by giving you a start date before you hand in your resignation. It's then best to resign in writing (email is fine), so that you have a record of the date you told your employer. Take a look at https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/work/resigning/your-notice-period-when-resigning/ for some tips on how to write this letter.

You can work a longer notice than the one in your contract if you agree it with your employer. If you're keen to move sooner rather than later it may also be possible to negotiate a shorter notice period than your contract states. If you want to go down this route it can be useful to reassure your employer that you will tackle any urgent work before finishing.

Fixed term contracts are different as you won't need to give notice if you intend to leave on the last day of your contract. Leaving early would usually mean giving at least one week's notice unless your contract says otherwise.

Don't forget about your holiday during your notice period. If you have unused paid holiday you should speak to your employer about either taking this time during the notice period or being paid for them. Sometimes people change their mind about moving jobs or find their circumstances alter. If this happens to you, you should speak to your employer to see what the options are and if it is possible for you to stay in your current role.

YOUTH CLUB SALE AND LOWER TOWN PLACE

Some fifty people attended the February Parish Council meeting to hear why the Lower Town Place project had not progressed since the official opening event at the Covid delayed Revel in 2021. Since that time the Parish Clerk has been investigating allegations of irregularities concerning the sale of the old Youth Club in Popes Lane and the purchase of Lower Town Place.

Lower Town Place is owned by the Community, there has been no financial impropriety and there is no 'missing money'. These three headlining points are from the Clerk's Executive Summary as presented to the Parish Council. The report pointed out some problem areas and lessons to be learnt. The Clerk explained the time investigated had been narrowed down to a 10-year period covering four Council Chairmen, four Clerks, Council paperwork that could not be located and Council minutes which often lacked clarity. Unfortunately, this has fuelled misunderstanding and mistrust.

Fortunately, the Youth Club Committee had extensive files to evidence how professional advice had been taken from solicitors and the Charity Commission concerning decisions made. Youth Club Committee Chair Steve Keable said, "We nearly achieved top end value of £300k for the sale of the Youth Club and the Youth Club charitable purpose now passes into Lower Town Place.

In February last year the committee agreed a proposal paper "Youth Club of the Future" as a way forward with three examples of Exeter projects with £800k build costs. Both the Victory Hall Management Committee and HOLD welcomed this starting discussion. We have been waiting for the Parish Council to complete its investigation report in order to make progress. We'll have to wait another month until the Clerk's final report is checked, completed, and accepted by Councillors".



Life has changed at a speed never seen before in human history. More than ever we need the quiet wisdom of those who lived in slower times.



LAPFORD BOOK CLUB BOOK REVIEW: SUNCATCHER by ROMESH GUNESEKARA

Set in 1964 when Ceylon (Sri Lanka) was at a social and political turning point, with Mrs. Banderanaike, the first female prime minister in the world, trying to reform the country through nationalising banking, education, industry, land, media and trade. (I looked her up, and her grip on government makes Mrs Thatcher look positively benign.) With school closed the main character Kairo, from a modest background, spends most of his time in his room leafing through



comic books. His mother works on the local radio, his father is in denial that, through his stubbornness to learn Sinhalese, his job is in jeopardy and he takes comfort in betting on the horse races held in England. When Kairo meets Jay, who is from a rich and landed family, he is dazzled by him. Over one summer Kairo is swept into Jay's world, helping him build the aviary for the birds Jay catches, looking after the fish tanks in Jay's room, and going with him to Jay's uncle Elvin's estate. It is here that Kairo begins to see that his friend has a disregard for others when a game they play with the son of the estate's overseer, using bows and arrows, ends in severe injury for the boy, and a rather callous reaction from Jay.

As the summer goes on Jay seems to push the boundaries of good behaviour further, eventually this leads to tragedy. Kairo realises that his childhood is over and that he was only ever included on the periphery of Jay's life. Many years later he returns to his old home and finds it impossible to recapture the magic he remembered from that time.

The author describes the landscape, the people and the flowers and birds in such a rich language that, even though the names of the birds and other animals were alien to me, I felt I could see everything he described in technicolour. The book was also an insight to how some of the problems in Ceylon at present, especially the emergence of the Tamil Tigers, started with Mrs. Banderanaike's attempts at modernisation.





LAPFORD PROJECT 2000 (LP2K)

It has come to our notice that some villagers are unaware of who we are and what we do. Lapford Project 2000 (LP2K) was established with the purpose of organising events etc. to

celebrate the new millennium. We currently have three main objectives:

The Lapford Lookout.

The first edition of the Lapford Lookout was a single piece of folded A4 published in April 1998. The publication has now evolved into a much loved monthly community newsletter and we hope you approve of how much progress has been made! The newsletter is self-funded as there has always been and continues to be great support from local advertisers. We have a monthly distribution of 600 copies, most being hand-delivered locally by our lovely group of volunteer distributors. Lapford Lookout is an ongoing regular commitment and takes many hours of volunteer labour to produce each month. It has continued to evolve and contributions are always welcome please send to lapfordlookout@gmail.com by the 14th of each month at the very latest.

Lapford Village Archive.

Lapford Project 2000 is also responsible for the setting up and ongoing maintenance of the Village Archive which consists of a collection of documents and artefacts mostly donated by local people and organisations, though some purchases have been and are made using income generated by the publication of the Lapford Lookout. It is mainly held in a dedicated, locked cupboard at the Orchard Centre, with an overspill facility locked in a container on Lower Town Place.

The day to day management of the Village Archive is in the hands of the Voluntary Archivist and helpers and all archive items are catalogued. The Archive is open to the public every Tuesday morning between 10-30 and 12-30, and at other times for individuals or groups by arrangement with the Voluntary Archivist who may be contacted by phone 01363 83103 or via email archivelapford2022@gmail.com

We are always pleased to receive items that may be of interest for future generations and researchers. Documents/ photographs can be scanned or copied for the Archive if owners wish to retain the originals.

Everything else!

Many other projects have been completed since the beginning. One such triumph is the Millennium Quilt providing a lasting record of the year 2000 in the Victory Hall. A close look at the quilt, or the book telling the story of how it was made, reveals Lapford Project 2000 how the village has changed over the last two decades.

LP2K is especially proud of its great success in the organisation of the Lapford Remembers events to commemorate the centenary of the Armistice in 2018. This huge undertaking brought together many sections of the community and was very well received. Lapford now has it's very own "Silent Soldier" and Lapford Project 2000 organises the display of poppies around the village each November. Again, please see the Poppy Appeal and Remembrance display in The ARK for further information and pictures.

LP2K has instigated and funded many other improvements to the fabric of our village over the years. These include the renovation of village pumps and seats, daffodil planting, improvements to The Orchard Centre, Lapford in Lights, Village calendars, new notice boards and parish maps. Picture rails have been supplied and installed in The ARK together with display materials for events such as the current display of Village Organisations.

Many events have been staged for the benefit of the local community ranging from informative shows, magic, exhibitions, drama, and theatre and displays in The ARK, to live music. Some may remember the first two Lapstocks were organised by Lapford Project 2000! Since then Lapstock has thrived as a separate group, but unfortunately there are currently no plans for Lapstock 2023.

Loan funding has been provided to other groups to enable things to happen locally, for example to Lapford Parish Council to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and to Lapford & District Horticultural Society to fund the printing of its Recipe Book. For several years a guiz was produced for the Playing Field Trust to raise funds for the maintenance of the Playing Field and, more recently sponsored Christmas Quiz Sheets have also raised funds for local benefit.

The future.

The Lapford Project 2000 group will continue to do what it can to improve village facilities for the benefit of all. For the time being, it will concentrate on the monthly production of the Lapford Lookout and the ongoing caretaking of the Village Archive. However, it doesn't rest on its laurels and has recently made an offer to Lapford Parish Council to take on the management of the village website!

LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS


It's been an incredibly busy half term at Lapford Community Primary School with so many exciting opportunities for the children to extend their learning both in and away from the classroom.


