LAPFORD WEATHER OCTOBER 2023

Milder and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the 8th with a maximum air temperature of 24.0° C, the warmest October day I have recorded in the 26 years I have been keeping records. As in September, warm air from North Africa had drifted our way.

The coolest day was the 16th with a maximum of 11.1°C. The coolest night was on the 16th with an air minimum of 2.4°C, and a frost on the grass of -2.1°C.

After a dry start to the month which coincided with the warm weather, the rest of the month was wet.

The total was 123.7 mm. The wettest day was either the 11th or 12th, the total for these two days was 35.9 mm.

The windiest day was the 2nd with a gust of 24 m.p.h.

GRIT BINS

Three additional grit bins have been purchased by Lapford Parish Council and placed in locations not covered by those provided by the Devon County Council service. They are at the bottom of Kelland Hill, by the phone box in the centre of the village and towards the top of the village.



The grit should be spread as evenly as possible at the rate of a handful per square metre. Spreading it more thickly will not be as effective and will waste supplies.

As with the contents of all the other bins the grit is there for anyone to use in order to make the nearby public roads and pavements safer.

Please do not use the contents for spreading on private property. It is up to individual property owners to purchase their own grit/salt supplies for cold weather use.

FLOODING ADVICE

During the recent heavy rains associated with Storm Cairán the River Yeo at Lapford peaked at depth of 3.08 metres, well over its normal range of between 1 and 2.3 metres. The measurements are automatically taken hourly at the river bridge over the A377 near the station. The highest depth recorded was on 19^{th} December 1999 – 3.99 metres.

Although the flooding of Lapford's low-lying property is rare it can happen. To keep an eye on the river levels, without actually going outside to look, type <u>check-for-flooding.service.gov.uk/station/3098</u> into a search engine and the page for the Lapford Yeo recording station will come up with the latest state of the river level information.

For advice on how to prepare for possible flooding visit <u>www.gov.uk/prepare-for-flooding</u> There is more flood information on the Devon County Council website.

Lapford has a limited supply of sand and sandbags for use in an emergency. For more information please contact the Lapford Emergency Action Plan team (contact details at the back of the Lapford Lookout).

For a map identifying those properties most at risk of flooding see the Adopted Policies Map for Lapford available on the Mid Devon District Council website, or there is a copy on display in the Orchard Centre.

PETITION TO GET ROAD RESURFACED ON LAPFORD VILLAGE BRIDGE

Last month I asked Lapford Residents to sign my petition. In just the first week 45 residents did just this. This is a reminder as the 'promise' to fix the bridge has not happened. This is what the petition says:-

"The condition of the road surface of the bridge into Lapford is very poor. It is a hazard and causing damage to vehicles. Local residents call on Devon County Council to advance their programme of roadworks, and repair and resurface the bridge immediately".

DEVON BENCH ENDS

Approximately forty people travelled from far and wide to hear Dr. Todd Gray give a fascinating talk on Devon Bench Ends, a subject on which he is the undoubted national expert.

Dr. Todd Gray MBE has devoted his working career to the study of Devon's history. His passion for his adopted county is self-evident through his publications (48 books now) and in his lectures. He has written more widely on Devon than any other historian and is at the heart of its historical community. He is also an Honourable Research Fellow at Exeter University and has the Honourable Freedom of the City of Exeter.

> His talk took us through a well-illustrated series of slides demonstrating the incredible variety of carved wooden bench (pew) ends found not only in Devon's churches, but also all over the South West. Those of Mid and North Devon have characteristics found nowhere else, they are carved from

solid planks of oak and were made in a relatively short space of time during the latter part of the fifteenth century into the mid sixteenth, when they suddenly went out of fashion and boxed in pews became all the rage. There are a number of themes, some related to the Passion of Christ (leading up to the crucifixion), some are faces perhaps of local dignitaries, some are heraldic, some almost Celtic and some of a Renaissance design, these latter being peculiar to North Devon. Bench ends in Cornwall, Somerset and West Dorset tend to have their own themes. Dr. Gray thinks it likely that many of these carvings were produced by local craftsmen, who may have worked at several churches at the same time,

for instance Down St. Mary has some almost identical pieces to those at Lapford. Other craftsmen may have come over from Brittany, but records are scarce.

If you haven't already investigated, please do have a close look at Lapford's amazing, mainly unique works of fifteenth century art, and visit some of the other churches in the area, such as Down St. Mary, Burrington, Atherington, High Bickington and almost any other church in the district. This is such an unappreciated piece of our local history and culture.

LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS


Our first couple of weeks back after the Autumn half term have been all about remembering. We started the half term with a whole school focus on Black History following this year's Black History Month theme of Saluting Our Sisters. Children learnt why it is important to remember and celebrate the achievements of black women throughout history. Children in Robins learnt

> about Ruby Bridges who was the first black girl to join a school in the US where previously only white children were educated. Skylarks found out more about Rosa Parks and her campaign for equal rights for people of colour; and Kingfishers found out about Baroness Floella Benjamin and the Windrush Generation. Herons found out about Maya Angelou and enjoyed learning about her poems. They created some beautiful artwork based on her poem 'Caged Bird'.

> Our second week back was all about remembering men and women that have given their lives in conflict and learning why it is important to remember them. Children thought about the symbolism of the poppy and why we wear this as a mark of respect. On the 10th November the children walked to the war memorial to conduct a

short remembrance service. This was led by our oldest children from Herons and included each class sharing a snippet of their learning. Robins shared a poppy wreath they had made collaboratively with the poppies created from handprints. Skylarks shared a beautiful collage of Flanders Field as well as a poem which they had written together. Kingfishers had created individual collages of a poppy field and Herons had used the poem 'In Flanders Field' to create their own blackout poetry. It was lovely to be able to come together with members of our village community to remember and reflect.

LADIES REVEAL HIDDEN TALENTS

Our meeting in October took us along country lanes to what appeared to be just a huddle of barns on the road between Wembworthy and Winkleigh. We parked, stepped out carefully in the dark, trying to miss the muddy puddles, guided only by torches and followed our host around the side of a barn wondering if this had been a good idea. Then, suddenly we found ourselves in an Aladdin's Cave of Crafting.

The Little Red Hen Studio is well worth a visit for anyone keen on crafts. Susan Manley says

of her studio I wished 'to create an affordable and stimulating environment where people from the local community can happily explore their artistic talents and be supported in extending them as well as building social bonds'. She was prompted in part by her own realisation of how much the process of creating something can help people's mood. She has certainly succeeded; she has created this studio with its incredible range of materials, many recycled, which includes a pottery and firing facilities where people come together to have a wonderful time exploring their skills and finding new ones.

For us, it was the pottery we had come to try. We walked through an outer room, literally stocked to the ceiling with craft materials of every description, and passed tables set up with sewing machines and a weaving loom and entered the pottery. Here we settled at the table and were shown the balls of clay and tiles of clay that Susan had prepared for us. We were encouraged to just enjoy the feel of the clay and let our minds wander until an idea or shape came to us. Very soon the room became quiet, a sure sign that the ladies were concentrating. We had an array of tools which we could use and very quickly shapes began to emerge and tiles bore signs of decoration. Susan was on hand to suggest, help and encourage but gave us plenty of freedom to 'do our own thing'. On the shelves around us were an impressive array of works created by other artists, if we needed any inspiration. Some were waiting to dry out so they could be fired and some had already been glazed.



As well as moulding the clay by hand, we were offered an opportunity to try the potter's wheel. Most of us were already engrossed but one member gave it a try and created a very successful candle stick.

By the time we were ready to leave, we had lined up some decorated tiles, a woodpecker, a tortoise, a hedgehog, a characterful cartoon dog and a bowl or two. We had had the firing and glazing process explained and knew we had to let our creations dry out before they could be fired. Most of the group were keen to finish off their work once it was dry so we will be going back in due course.

We had a wonderful time and were pleased with our efforts. The studio makes very good use of recycled items and are grateful for almost

anything! There is a list of what they can use under The Little Red Hen Studio, Wembworthy on the internet and there is always someone there on a Tuesday between 11am and 3pm. Not only will they receive your donations gratefully but you will be welcome to try your hand at something while you are there, no appointment necessary, possibly a small fee toward running costs.

The studio is really worth a visit if you are interest in crafting or have 'stuff' you can't use and want to get rid of without just throwing it away. Oh, and just a word of caution; if you are visiting a friend locally and notice a new ornament, go carefully, they just might have made it themselves!

CHRISTMAS IS COMING AND THE SCAMMERS ARE AT LARGE!

"I mostly shop online and I'm always looking for a bargain especially at this time of year. However, I'm worried about scammers; what do I look for to avoid getting caught?"



More and more of us are shopping online – it's convenient and can save a lot of time. However, scammers are getting increasingly sophisticated with their tactics which can make them hard to spot. What you can do, though, is take steps to protect yourself.

The golden rule is that if it seems too good to be true it probably is. This goes for products that are 'must haves', are sold out at major retailers or are heavily discounted.

If you're buying from a site you haven't used before, do some research first. See what the company's returns and refunds policy is and look up the company's address which should be displayed on their website and make sure it is a street address and not a PO Box. Read reviews, not just the ones on their website but check out other review sites.

Be wary of people contacting you out of the blue on social media or via text and email and scammers will often ask you to pay in unusual ways like sending money through a transfer service such as MoneyGram or Western Union or even pay via vouchers. They may well put you under pressure to buy quickly; take your own time.

Scammers are clever and sneaky and regularly adapt making them harder to spot. Anyone can get scammed so if you do get caught don't feel embarrassed or ashamed. Rather, get practical; report it either to Citizens Advice https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/scams/reporting-a-scam or to Action Fraud www.police.uk/advice/advice-and-information/fa/fraud/action-fraud/

If you have transferred money within the last 24 hours contact the police on 101 but if you feel unsafe use 999 and don't forget to contact your bank even if more than 24 hours have elapsed.

Here at CA TNMWD we get asked all kinds of questions and get to hear about all kinds of scams amongst other things. Would you like to help us help people with their problems? We are always looking for more people to volunteer with us so that we can increase the number of people we are able to help. PICKLED RED CABBAGE

This is quick to prepare and makes a tasty addition to Christmas meals.

You need:

A red cabbage, salt, vinegar [malt and balsamic], brown sugar, bay leaf, peppercorns, and juniper berries, if liked.

Remove any blemished leaves from the cabbage, cut into quarters and cut out the tough white core. Shred the cabbage as finely as you can, place in a bowl layering with salt. Cover the bowl and leave overnight.

Next day drain the salted cabbage and rinse thoroughly under cold running water. Pack the drained cabbage into sterilised storage jars and cover with a mixture of balsamic and malt vinegar, a teaspoon of brown sugar to each jar, a bay leaf, peppercorns, and juniper berries. Seal the jars.

The cabbage will be ready to eat in about two weeks.

OPENREACH GIGABIT BROADBAND—IT AIN'T BROKE, WHY DO WE NEED TO FIX IT?

Dear Resident,

I'm one of the local people working to promote fibre broadband in Coldridge which shares the Lapford Exchange. I am not employed by Openreach and am not being paid by anyone. I'm a recently retired IT Communications specialist who worked for the Ordnance Survey, we had hundreds of surveyors all over the country working from home, some in some fairly remote locations so I have a wealth of experience to draw upon.

I was asked to address some of the areas people are unsure of....

"Our Broadband/phone seems to work fine, why do Openreach want to replace the copper lines with fibre?"

The UK network is being upgraded and copper is being withdrawn. More details can be found here - <u>https://www.openreach.com/fibre-broadband/retiring-the-copper-network</u>

Some areas are more cost effective to replace than others, and government vouchers are provided to residents for the harder to reach areas that are more expensive. However these are optional and available to people who want to change to fibre. As this is an optional scheme, there is no guarantee that it will go ahead unless there is sufficient interest/pledges. In terms of what may happen next if we don't build, you may be given an alternative option from another provider, it may be fibre, it may be 4G, it may be something else - the difference is that choosing to pledge now puts the control into your hands rather than waiting for an alternative that you may or may not want.

"I'm told if I sign over the free voucher the Government will give, I will have to commit to either my existing provider or a new provider of my own choosing. Why would I sign up now when I have no idea what the cost will be in 6-12 months' time?" "Every day is a gift, that is why they call it the present."

To help with pricing, typically 100Mbs costs around £25-30 per month. We anticipate this cost reducing as time goes on and more residents sign up to fibre. You can check pricing with different providers by using this postcode - MK18 2HY.

"Will I be expected to pay to have my copper lines replaced by Fibre?"

No. If you sign up as part of the voucher scheme this allows up to £4,500 to be allocated per property and the pot to be *'spread around'* the community. If we achieve sufficient pledges, there will be no additional costs for voucher holders. Non-voucher holders will still be able to order fibre when the network is built, but may be liable for any additional civil costs, if applicable to bring fibre into the property.

"We are in a remote area so our copper line takes a rather tortuous route. What happens if I don't sign and wait for the mandatory fibre rollout in 2025, could I wind up with an installation bill?"

There is no guarantee that you will receive full fibre by 2025, or that it will be Openreach that provides it.

"What about people who only have phone lines, will they need to buy broadband Internet?"

If you have any concerns about your current service, please contact your communications provider to discuss your options. You need to let them know if:

•You rely on your phone line for calls because you do not have a good mobile phone signal.


•You have personal care/alarm equipment connected to the phone line - they will not know unless you tell them.

Chair's Report for 2022-2023 for Heart of Lapford Development Limited

It is with great pleasure and no little relief that I am able to begin this report on a positive note, with the various allegations by certain members of the previous Parish Council concerning HOLD, the Youth Club committee and the acquisition of Lower Town Place having now all been shown by a very detailed report from the Clerk to be completely without foundation. This took a lot of hard work in researching and collating all the necessary evidence and I wish to thank those involved for their unstinting efforts to establish the truth.

This in turn had led to a complete hiatus in relations with the Parish Council and it is again with pleasure that I can report that the new Parish Council, HOLD, the Victory Hall and the Church Green Trustees are now moving forward as one in providing and enhancing the community facilities in the heart of the village.

We are also pleased to welcome Cllr. John Burrows as the Parish Council representative on the Board.

Meanwhile Lower Town Place has been enjoyed extensively both by Lapford groups and individuals, the Youth Club has gone from strength to strength with children playing on LTP whenever the weather and light evenings permit. The space was used many times over the summer with open air plays and a very successful Revel restart attended by hundreds of villagers. As for the HOLD board, during this period it has continued discussions with the Victory Hall committee with a view to producing an amalgamated constitution which should bring both organisational and economic benefits to both organisations. In addition, new access doors in the Hall are planned to enable easier passage between the VH and LTP as well as other matters affecting both sites.

The Board had been looking at renovating the Devon bank between the Church Green and LTP in co-operation with the Church Green Trustees. Annual maintenance has been ongoing, including not only grass cutting but weeding and planting. Thanks to the volunteers who turned up on a very wet Coronation Volunteering Monday to weed and tidy up generally after the Coronation event the previous Saturday.

I am very pleased to finish on another positive note. Since April, with a new Parish Council elected, HOLD has been able to make significant advancements. The Devon bank work has been financed and completed.

Thanks especially to David Bragg and Abi Whittaker for this and to Derek Pleace for building such a beautiful wall. A new gate has been fitted and a path made between the CG and LTP, creating a footpath from the car park through to The ARK without the need to walk on the highway. The bank and the new access were formally 'opened' by the Chair of the Parish Council as part of this year's Revel celebrations.

A new joint constitution has been agreed by both the Victory Hall Trustees and HOLD and is ready to be reviewed by a solicitor specialising in charity matters so that the legal aspects can be checked and any possible unseen problems with the proposed document as drafted identified.

LTP is continuing to be extensively used by children and by the Youth Club; another open air play has been staged and a highly successful Revel. People regularly walk their dogs around the path and after an excellent campaign and video by the Youth Club we have seen the 'dog poo' incidents fall dramatically.


Lapford can now look forward to making the most of its public areas in the centre of the village.

LAPFORD VOLUNTARY CAR AID -WHO ARE WE?

In the mid 1990's the Charity Commission announced that charities

with an annual income of under £1,000 per annum should be dissolved if possible because they were too costly to administer. Lapford had six of these charities set up by benefactors in the 1800's and early 1900. They were intended for the poor of the Parish, one being to provide tools for a labourer and another to give each school child at Lapford School six pence at Christmas. The investments were sold raising the sum of £600 which was used to start the Lapford Voluntary Car aid for those who needed to go to the surgery but had no transport of their own.

This service enables residents to attend doctors' and dentists' surgeries within a ten mile radius of Lapford. We are managed by a small committee of six volunteers, and currently have ten volunteer drivers. The drivers are paid fuel allowances only, partially by the client, and topped up by LVCA. The LVCA money comes from donations, legacies, grants and fundraising events.

We serve surgeries at Chulmleigh, Bow, North Tawton, Winkleigh, Morchard Bishop, Crediton (Redlands) and Witheridge. We also go to Crediton Community Hospital and the Breast Screening Unit at Tesco Car Park, Crediton. During the year 2021-22 we covered 4,800 miles over 277 journeys, proving that we are a very busy service – vital to the village of Lapford.

Although we have a bank of drivers, they are not all available all of the time, thus reducing our capacity to serve the community. If anyone would like to offer their services, please contact Grace on 01363 83178. This would be much appreciated by LVCA and by the residents of Lapford.




LIBRARIES UNLIMITED BOOKS ON WHEELS
