





#### **LAPFORD WEATHER NOVEMBER 2023**

Slightly milder than average, wetter than average.

The warmest day was the  $18^{th}$  with a maximum of  $14.7^{\circ}$ C and the coolest day was the  $30^{th}$  which only managed  $2.7^{\circ}$ C. The coldest night was on the  $26^{th}$  with a minimum of -2.5°C and a grass frost of -5.0°C.

Total rainfall was 143.0 mm, about a third wetter than average. The wettest day was the 1<sup>st</sup> with a fall of 18.4 mm.

The windiest day was the 19<sup>th</sup> with a gust of 39 m.p.h.

This autumn (September – November) has been a lot milder and wetter than average. Not the wettest but certainly the mildest I have recorded.

## LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW: MUM AND DAD by JOANNA TROLLOPE

Mum and Dad are Gus and Monica Beacham, who left England twenty five years ago to set up a vineyard in southern Spain, which is now very successful. They have three children, two of whom were left behind at boarding schools, only the youngest, Jake, going with them to live in Spain.

When Gus has a stroke Sebastian, the eldest son, and Katie, the daughter, have busy working lives and families in London and only Jake is free to fly out immediately and help Monica. As he is the favourite child, and because he went to school in Spain and is fluent in the language, Monica is initially delighted. Although Gus recovers reasonably well, it is obvious that he will be unable to continue to run the business as well as he had in the past. Never an easy person, he becomes ever more irritable and Monica finds it more difficult to respond to him. The family accepts that they must find a solution to the problems faced by their parents.

As the book develops, sibling rivalries re-ignite and we, the reader, see the various problems and resentments which lie beneath the surface of all the families. Sebastian and his wife Anna have two teenage sons; Katie and her partner Nic have three daughters and neither Anna nor Katie gets on well with Monica. It slowly becomes clear that Jake's ability to drop everything to go and

help his parents is because he is unemployed and in debt. His new wife is adamant that she does not want to go to Spain, using their 18 month old daughter, Mouse, as an excuse.

Unfortunately, as I read on I became less and less sympathetic to the adult characters, and it is the teenage children who ultimately find ways to help both their grandmother and grandfather. A typical Trollope book on families and relationships, and evoking the warmth of Spain, but not I felt one of her best.

## WINTER FUEL BILLS

Concerns about paying winter fuel bills are widespread. Citizens Advice had 32,400 people approach them about energy debt in the first four months of 2023 compared to 15,200 in 2020.



Here at CA TNMWD we have dedicated debt and energy teams who can help. Fuel vouchers are available for those on pre-payment meters; either call **01237 879233** or contact <u>fuelvouchers@ruraldevoncab.org.uk</u> or go to www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk/energyadvice/

For those who pay by direct debit it may also be worthwhile contacting us as we can advise on other possible solutions or ways to help such as approaching some companies that offer grants in certain cases.

If you have already incurred energy debt it is also worth a call or an email; our teams can work together to help find the best solution. Contact www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk/debt-and-money-advice/ to request help.

There are also some simple tips which, whilst not covering all the extra costs, will make savings that add up and help the overall picture.

- Most people like a room temperature of between 18 and 21 degrees Celsius. If you have a medical condition it is worth asking your GP what it should be but turning the thermostat down by just 1 degree within this range could save around £115 a year.
- Block any gaps in doors, windows and floors to prevent draughts and keep the heat in. You do need to allow some ventilation to prevent damp and mould but it is worth checking.
- Don't leave appliances on standby turn them off and switch off unnecessary lights.
- Consider using LED light bulbs as they cost less to run.
- Cutting your shower by just one minute can save money on energy bills. If everyone in a four-person household with a water meter did this, savings of around £75 could be made.

If you are struggling with energy bills you may be able to get support from the government or your energy supplier. Contact your energy supplier in the first instance.

These are very seasonal, topical issues but we can help. Could you help people with problems like these or, indeed, with other problems that people bring to us at CA TNMWD? We give full training and provide ongoing support but we need more people to join us as volunteers in order that we can better meet the growing demand for our services. The problems people bring to us are getting increasingly complex and therefore take a lot longer to work through so that exacerbates our need for more help.

## LADIES POP INTO PAST PUBS OF LAPFORD (and trying saying fast that after a pint or two!)

Our November meeting was not as planned. We turned to David, who was on our list to approach for a talk later in the year, to see if he could stand in at short notice. We were lucky because not only was he available but his talk gave us a fascinating insight into another earlier Lapford, many traces of which still exist and, thanks to David, have been recorded.



His tales were loosely linked together under the theme of pubs. Lapford has had quite a few in its time.

We were shown the likely site of the Maltster's Arms Inn. Guided by a tithe map of 1840, David feels it once stood at the top of the hill on the left going out of the village just before Rensey Lane. Using photography and a clever slider, we were able to get an idea of the size the building (two and a half times bigger than the present pair of houses!). It would have jutted well out into the road making it extremely narrow at that point. It was destroyed in 1851 along with the malthouse and seven other dwellings, in a terrible fire, possibly as a result of a carelessly discarded pipe in use the day before during the Revel. The Keeper, Richard Ellis, who was also a farmer and butcher found himself bereft of a pub but undeterred he was back in business a few years later running the Old Malt Scoop and using it as a base for his butcher's business.

We heard about another fire possibly caused by a single spark from a passing steam lorry. The house at Lower Forches went up in flames in 1925. The occupants, Mr. and Mrs. Butt in their late seventies, discovered the fire but apparently so no reason to alter their routine. Mrs. Butt was adamant that she needed to wait for the neighbour to dress her as usual before she left the house. Fortunately, the firemen rescued them both along with most of the furniture though they could not save the house. The link with the pub theme here was that this building was formerly the Barnstaple Inn, reminding us that this road was once the main route between Exeter and Barnstaple. The main route into the Lapford at that time would have been down the hill from here.

There is another story linked to the theme through a major sale that took place at the Malt Scoop Inn in 1910. The proceeds allowed George Croote to pursue gold in South Africa. He probably sank most of his fortune into this enterprise but it seems he did not forget his childhood home. There is a record that his son died at Farm Lapford at the end of WW1. It is not possible to be sure of its precise location as it has disappeared somewhere beneath the sprawling Soweto Township but it is strange to think of a Lapford Farm once existing so many miles from its namesake.

I, and I think everyone, was captivated with these tales and with the stories of other pubs, including The Railway Inn, which later became the Temperance Hotel and is now known as Lower Town Place, and the Yeo Vale Hotel, one keeper of which William Manington became the manager of the Ambrosia Factory which brought substantial changes when it arrived in Lapford. David's enthusiasm for his subject is evident and his research is thorough. As a village, we are fortunate to have him recording its past on the Lapford History Site. I particularly enjoy the photographs he has recorded which allow you to 'peel back' a slider so that you can see the same view as it is now and as it looked many years ago. Thank you, David for a thoroughly interesting talk and for preserving aspects of Lapford's history that might otherwise be lost.

## LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER 2023

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The ARK.

## The Parish Council met on 17<sup>th</sup> October 2023 in the Orchard Centre.

These notes summarise some of the issues discussed in the meeting.

The Parish Council received a presentation from Michelle Maidment of Openreach who explained she was managing a project to provide properties in Lapford and surrounding areas with an Ultrafast Fibre-Optic connection, allowing the broadband providers to make ultra-fast services available. People who wanted to take this opportunity would need to pledge a voucher to Openreach on the website <a href="https://www.openreach.co.uk/connectmycommunity">www.openreach.co.uk/connectmycommunity</a> where more details of the scheme could be seen. There would be no direct cost to individuals for this. There needed to be a minimum of pledges for the scheme to be viable for Openreach to undertake the upgrade.

The Neighbourhood Plan support team at MDDC had indicated that they did not have the resources available to provide a presentation.

The Parish Council would set up a Design a Logo competition asking parishioners to come up with something that could become the Council's formal logo. Cllr. Briant-Evans would organise this.

The Parish Council Events Committee would organise something to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day which will be on 6<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

The Parish Council contributed a grant of £300 towards the Pensioners' Christmas Lunch.

Three new salt/grit bins had been purchased and would be located at strategic places in the village.

## The Parish Council met on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2023 in the Orchard Centre.

These notes summarise some of the issues discussed in the meeting.

Abigail Whittaker had resigned as a Councillor because of her work commitments and MDDC had been notified appropriately. The first stage was to offer a by-election and if no-one requested one the process would be to fill the vacancy by co-option.

The following matters were discussed:

Section 106 funding for the Football Club – Cllr. Briant-Evans and the clerk to liaise on this.

Ash Die-Back – the problem to be notified to DCC Highways.

Signpost Cleaning – to be undertaken in the Spring.

Telephone Box Disconnection – now in the hands of BT and not National Grid.

Community Broadband Funding – The ARK already had a broadband connection.

Sandbags – to be ordered commercially.

Grit Bins - now installed.

The change in broadband connection for the Orchard Centre was on hold until the result of the Openreach fibre connection project was completed. This would enable a new contract to be set up with ultra-fast connection.

The planning application 22/01910/MOUT for 14 dwellings at Sandhurst, Lapford had been refused by MDDC and was now subject to an Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate. The Parish Council had objected to this application and would reinforce that objection by making a representation to the Inspectorate.

The initial discussions within the Parish Council on the 2024/25 Budget and Precept took place so that the requirements for the precept for that year could be decided in time for the January 2024 meeting.

The Parish Council would notify MDDC of what was needed on the playing field in conjunction with the Lapford Youth and Playing Field Trust, rather than MDDC using the Section 106 finance to supply equipment without local consultaion.


