Lapford Weather Review

LAPFORD WEATHER NOVEMBER 2023 and ANNUAL REVIEW

December was both milder and wetter than average.

The mildest day was the 27th with a maximum of 12.8°C and the coolest was the 1st with a maximum of 3.8°C. The coldest night was on the 3rd with a minimum of -6.0°C (yes, the month really did start on a very chilly note) and a very sharp frost on the grass (-10.0°C).

Total rainfall in December was 140.8 mm, the wettest day being the 30th with 14.5 mm. The last four months of the year produced over 480 mm rain (over 18" in old money). Plenty to have filled up the reservoirs you would have thought.

The windiest day was the 20th with a gust of 53 m.p.h. The 27th and 31st both also had winds gusting over 50 m.p.h.

Overall 2023 was milder and wetter than average. The mean temperature of 11.2°C was fractionally higher than my previous record in 2014. The mean maximum temperature for the whole year was 14.8°C (not a record) and the mean minimum was 7.6°C. This latter figure was the highest I have yet recorded indicating an unusually large number of cloudy mild nights.

Both September and October had higher than normal daytime maxima, in fact the 29.1°C recorded on September 8th made this the warmest day of the year.

The total rainfall of over a metre (1101.4) made this the wettest year since 2012. The wettest day was March 8th which saw a fall of 41.5 mm, a new record for a March day here.

TACKLE THE WINTER BLUES BY SHARING YOUR MEMORIES



Do you feel a bit deflated in the new year? Maybe you miss the cheer and hustle associated with the festive season, feel wiped out or even underwhelmed after all the build-up. What better way to overcome the winter blues than by sharing your memories over a chat and a cup of tea?

The Reminiscence Project is an ongoing project run by Crediton Library which collects memories of people living, or who used to live, in Mid Devon. Volunteers visit people in their own homes or in the community to chat about their younger years, school, jobs, or anything else they might like to talk about.

The conversations are recorded and stored online in a digital collection. This is open to the public for all to access, whether they want to find out about how their local area has changed over the years, whether they'd like to know what it was like to live in a certain time period or whether they just enjoy hearing other people's stories.

Funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, this project has been made possible thanks to money raised by National Lottery players.

LEARN HOW TO MAKE MORE OUT OF MENDING WITH DEVON AIR AMBULANCE

Devon Air Ambulance



At the **Positive Lights Project, Exeter** on **Saturday 24th February 2024**.

Devon Air Ambulance (DAA) offers a master class in 'stitching with style' at their first mending workshop for local sewing beginners and enthusiasts.

The event, run by the DAA retail team, aims to educate people about the positive impact that extending the life of much-loved garments have on the planet and inspire their supporters to learn new mending skills. This will help to reduce the amount of pre-loved garments that might usually be sent for recycling whilst increasing funds for the life-saving charity.

Those who are already skilled menders or those that are keen-to-be a little handier with a needle and thread are invited to book one of only 32 places available: <https://www.daat.org/Event/exeter-mending-workshop>

Those who sign up will learn and share sewing and mending techniques that will help to give much-loved and pre-loved donated garments a new lease of life and they can either bring a garment of their own that they would like to repair themselves, or receive advice about repairing, or they can come along and practice their skills using donated items from our Mishap Fashion range.

This first session will include a focus on hand-mending holes in knitwear, replacing buttons, using patches to cover marks and scuffs and more.

All mending techniques will be explained and demonstrated by Devon Air Ambulance retail team hosts and keen menders, Eliza and Isabel, who are looking forward to sharing their skills, hints, tips, and inspiration with the group.

Eliza, sewing enthusiast and Manager of Cowick Street's Devon Air Ambulance shop in Exeter, says:

'We are very much looking forward to welcoming menders to a lovely afternoon of stitching together in Exeter. Those helping to restore the life of our donated garments that need a little care can look forward to a friendly few hours with others who are 'stitching for our community' by repairing items for resale.

As a lifesaving charity that exists 100% thanks to the supporters in the communities we serve, we are delighted to share this hands-on approach to raising funds, raising awareness, and drawing threads between members of our community.

Every item mended and sold takes a little strain off the planet's natural resources and we cannot wait to share the skills to support our regenerative approach to fashion.'

There are just **32 spaces** available for the 3-hour session, which can be secured for just **£15 per person**. The cost for the workshop includes all mending supplies and refreshments. The minimum age for participating is 13 and under 18's must be accompanied by an adult.

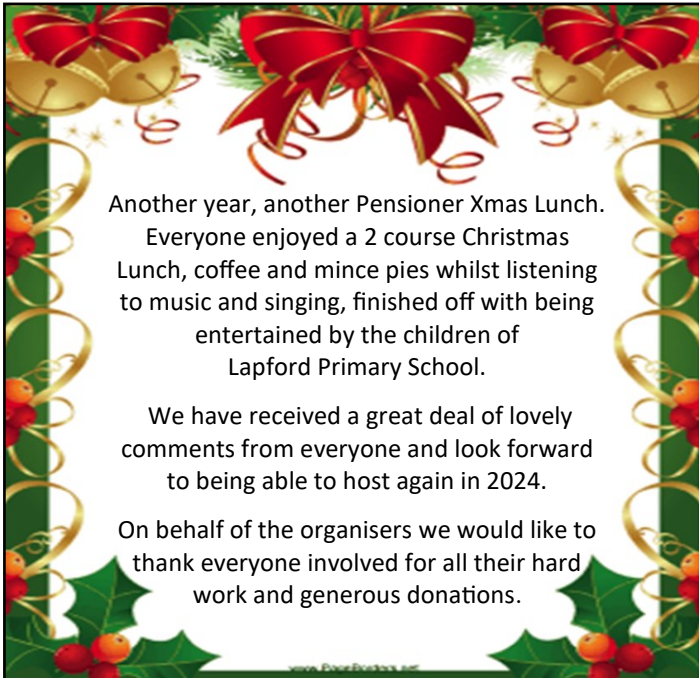
CAROLS ON THE GREEN

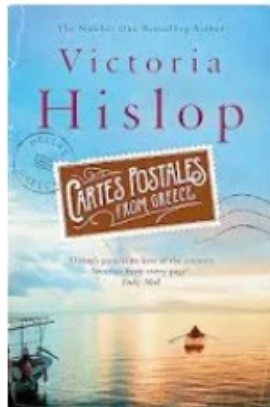

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW: CARTES POSTAL by VICTORIA HISLOP

Week after week, the postcards arrive, addressed to a name Ellie does not know, with no return address, each signed with an initial: A.



With their bright skies, blue seas and alluring images of Greece, these cartes postales brighten her life. After six months, to her disappointment, they cease. But the montage she has created on the wall of her flat has cast a spell. She must see this country for herself.

On the morning Ellie leaves for Athens, a notebook arrives. Its pages tell the story of a man's odyssey through Greece. Moving, surprising and sometimes dark, A's tale unfolds with the discovery not only of a culture but also of a desire to live life to the full once more.

In the notebook 'A's stories tell of his travels round Greece and of the people he meets and the tales they tell him. Some of the stories are very dark and some are fantasy.

Most of our book club members enjoyed the book, mainly because the story is set in Greece – in the sunshine and we have been suffering with the UK having wind and rain.

LOCAL LIBRARY PROVISION

Mobile library visits to our villages are currently scheduled to end on 27th February 2024. Readers may not be aware of some of these alternative options.

Crediton Library is open five days a week and is fully accessible to all, with off-road parking, including disabled space. Aside from a wide range of fiction and non-fiction book titles, the library offers audio books to borrow which can all be issued using the self-service points. The library has a small study area with free Wi-Fi, including eight public access computers, which are free to use for up to two hours each day, plus printing, photocopying and scanning facilities. There are a range of regular events for all ages, both social and various informal learning activities, such as Baby Bounce and Rhyme, knitting group, Lego Club and reading groups for adults and younger readers.



Chulmleigh Library is a dual purpose library on the site of Chulmleigh Community College, offering both the general public and school students access to all of Devon Libraries services. There are two public computers that are free to use for up to two hours per day during public opening times. The library offers printing facilities including a design service, photocopying and laminating. The library is open to the public on Tuesdays 9-4, Wednesdays 9-4, Thursdays 9-3 during term time and on Thursdays 9-3 during college holidays.

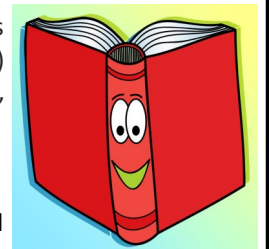

Books on Wheels. If you have difficulty in accessing the library, you can apply to use the Books on Wheels service run by Libraries Unlimited. This will entail Peter Westcott choosing books for you (with your help) and delivering and collecting them on a monthly basis. If this sounds like something you would like to do, please contact the Library at Crediton 01363 772578 or Peter on 01363 83525. This is a free service.



Future plans for enhanced library provision in the village.

The ARK, Lapford Parish Council and Lapford Book Club are working together and hope to put in a joint bid for grant funding, under discussion at the moment as to what it could best be used for.

With children particularly in mind, It is hoped that The ARK library will open on Saturday mornings. There is also scope for a weekday or evening opening currently under discussion.

The ARK and Lapford Book Club are working together on plans to run story time sessions, initially for children in Key Stage 1, during school holidays. If this goes well, it is hoped that the opportunity will be widened to include children in Key Stage 2.

We hope to have an update on all these plans for you next month!

QUINCES AND MEDLARS

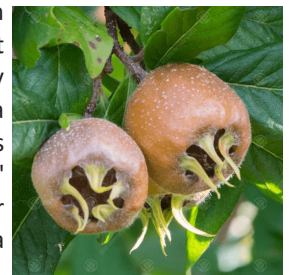
From Blackberry Farm

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, DECEMBER 2023

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. A copy of the minutes will be made available on the Council website, www.lapfordparishcouncil.org.uk and on the notice boards in the Orchard Centre and in The ARK.

The **Parish Council** met on 19th December 2023 in the Orchard Centre.

These notes summarise some of the issues discussed in the meeting.

- A playing field working party of Parish Councillors, Youth and Playing Field Committee members and the District Councillor and possibly other interested parties would be set up to ensure that the changes to the **Playing Field** were in the best interests of the children of the parish.

The agreed process to be followed is in the table below:

Process	Action	Who by?
Step 1	Health & Safety Removal of existing condemned equipment.	MDDC – Steve Densham
Step 2	Land Transfer Parish Council acquires the cleared nursery play area land from MDDC.	LPC – Parish Clerk/Steve Densham
Step 3	Play Equipment Needs Decide upon what equipment was desirable and where it should go, irrespective of finance currently available. To conduct public consultation on what is best for the community. To decide where on the combined playing field the equipment is best placed.	Working Group
Step 4	Financing the project Decide on how the project is to be funded and/or phased, including acquiring the available Section 106 funds.	LPC & Working Group
Step 5	Acquiring & Installation of equipment As the parish council can reclaim VAT on the purchase of equipment it makes sense for it to pay and own it, reducing the cost to the community.	LPC

- The **councillor vacancy** closing date was to be 31st January 2024 for a decision to be made at the February parish council meeting.
- A planning application had been received for the land at Sandhurst for a change of use of agriculture land to horticultural/domestic use, erection of two animal shelters, greenhouse and new access gateway. The parish council fully supported this application.
- The budget and precept for 2024/2025 was considered and it was agreed to increase the total charge from £25,000 to £26,000 which would result in a Band D increase from £63.44 to £64.90 for the year, or 2.3%.
- The next meeting would be on Tuesday 13th February 2024 (to be confirmed), followed by one on 14th February, although this would be reviewed next time to avoid clashes with district council meetings.

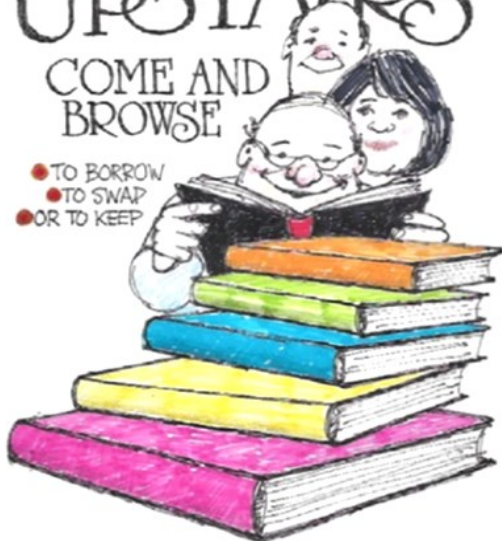
