WILD GARLIC

The young, tender leaves add a subtle garlic flavour to soups, stews, mashed potatoes and pesto. They make a seasonal, local addition to a plate pie or pasty filling.



To 450g (1lb) cubed or sliced boiled potatoes, add a generous handful of wild garlic, chopped and cooked in butter for two or three minutes. Season with salt and pepper and add 100g (4oz) of grated cheddar.



Lapford Weather Review

LAPFORD WEATHER FEBRUARY 2024

A very mild and wet month, with only one completely dry day. The mildest February since at least 1988, when my records began.

The highest temperature was 14.2° C on the 15^{th} , the coolest day was the 23rd with a maximum of 5.2° C. The coldest night was on the 27th with a minimum of -0.5° C and a grass frost of -5.6° C.

Total rainfall was 172.9 mm, not actually the highest for February, the wettest was in 1990 (188.1 mm), followed by 2014 and 2020. The wettest day was the 6th with 18.3 mm.

The windiest day was the 6th with a gust of ζ 42 m.p.h.

LADIES OF LAPFORD Ladies Find Out About Fragrances

Despite the rain and the puddles, most of our usual group paddled to The ARK to hear a talk about fragrances. We were looking forward to being entertained by one of our members. Helen worked for a number of years at the House of Fraser in Exeter selling perfumes. She often had to advise husbands on a choice for their wives which she enjoyed though not when one man came in at Christmas and announced, 'Right. I've got the saucepans for the wife. Now I need some perfume for the girlfriend.' She implied to us that the advice she had mouthed after his departing back was rather different from the polite assistance she was required to offer to his face!

Helen took us on a whistle stop tour through the ages and across continents to provide some history about the use of fragrances. We went as far back as the ancient Egyptians and were impressed to learn that sometimes when tombs from this era had been opened, the fragrances which had been used in the embalming still retained their original sweet smells. We nipped through Rome and the Middle Ages, stopping briefly in each and reached France and Napoleon Bonaparte. We discovered that he had large quantities of his favourite Eau de Cologne delivered daily. This Cologne 4711 is available today, still selling in the original style of packaging. It is probably one of the oldest fragrances still produced. We stayed in France to talk about Coco Chanel and her signature scent Chanel No 5, still popular today (if you can afford it!). Apparently, Coco is supposed to have said 'A woman without perfume is a woman without a future'. One or two of us raised eyebrows, perhaps bristling a little at this sweeping removal of our futures!

Helen talked about 'the Nose'. This is the name in the trade for the person whose job it is to spend hours sniffing and concocting to produce new fragrances. Good noses are vital to the production of new perfumes and in the past their skills were often learned by, and their jobs passed down to their offspring. At this point, Helen put us to the test. Perhaps there were some 'noses' amongst us. She had prepared 10 pots of undisclosed contents (mostly everyday things found in the kitchen) and we were asked to sniff the contents (eyes closed so that we had no extra clues) and write down what we thought we could smell. Our best nose was Briony; never too late to consider a new future, Briony.

Helen finished by telling some stories from her time at House of Fraser. Although she was there in the 1980s, she said it reminded her, looking back, of 'Are You Being Served?' because of some of the quaint old-fashioned customs and the way the staff had to stand to attention, when the manager did his pre-opening morning rounds of inspection.

It was a very enjoyable evening. Helen told us that she had been nervous because she 'was not used to talking'. Anyone who knows Helen will understand why this caused much good-natured chuckling, as she can always be relied upon to liven up a gathering. She quickly amended this to 'not used to public speaking'. She need not have worried. We went away, well informed, well entertained and with a smile.

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW 'Before She Knew Him' by Peter Swanson

This month's book met with a very mixed reception from Book Club members. The story, set in America, is a psychological thriller which encompasses serious mental illness, some very

disturbed people and a strange confluence of time and place which culminates in a final and unsuspected twist.

The book was well written and the plot and characters well-developed, though several of us questioned whether the female protagonist's sense of self-preservation (or rather total lack of it) was realistic. Some members really enjoyed reading it, but

others felt rather sullied after having read the somewhat over -detailed descriptions of murder and violent death and found the read rather unsettling. Some debate was had about the minds of authors who produce such books, and several of us will not be rushing to read any more books by this author if they are of the same nature as this.

So - if you have a strong stomach and enjoy suspense and psychological thrillers, give it a try. Otherwise, approach with caution.

THE BOOKERY - WORKING IN THE HEART OF THE COMMUNITY

The Bookery – Crediton's independent, non-profit bookshop – started as a community-owned enterprise in 2013, and a focus on community has remained at its heart ever since. Situated in the centre of Crediton's High Street, our bookshop is the first thing people see – but behind the shop are resources that may be of interest not just to people who live in Crediton, but in the surrounding area as well.

Working remotely doesn't have to mean working alone!

With remote working allowing many people to work flexibly, co-working spaces have become an affordable solution for those who are experiencing rural isolation, limited internet capacity or domestic distractions working from home – or who just fancy a change of scenery.

Tucked behind The Bookery is The Hub - a welcoming, openplan workspace (open 9 a.m.—5 p.m. Monday-Friday) with ultrafast fibre broadband, a kitchen and seating area with tea and coffee provided, and (thanks to grants from MDDC and the DLUHC) a private meeting room with videoconferencing equipment and a large screen for presentations.

Hub-user Mo loves the unique location: 'As an aspiring writer, I love the fact that The Hub is based in a bookshop with staff who are passionate about books. It's a beautiful, modern, airy space which is enjoyable to work in.'

There are good public transport links, including the number 5 bus stop just up the street and Crediton Station less than 20 minutes away on foot, and a great range of food and drink options available in Crediton town centre.

During the week beginning 29th April we'll be running our first ever 'Working at the Heart of the Community' week at The Hub, with half price on all bookings and a series of lunchtime talks and workshops. You can book a desk or the meeting room (and fill in our optional 5-minute co-working survey) on our website (https://thebookery.org.uk/work-hub/) or just call in to the shop.

A new space for schools and community outreach.

Thanks to a generous donation from the League of Friends of Crediton Hospital there is now a Community Events Room linking the bookshop to The Hub. School outreach activities and author events happen here, as well as community wellbeing projects pairing volunteers with elderly or isolated members of the community, and regular meetings of a book club and poetry group.

The Bookery also has everything you'd expect from a good bookshop: a brilliant selection of books, reading recommendations, a fast, free ordering service, signed copies, gift vouchers, and a selection of greetings cards, bookish gifts, notebooks and art materials – with all sales helping us to fund our outreach projects in schools and the community.

FINANCIAL HELP AVILABLE TO THOSE IN NEED

Our 'regular' monthly Advice Column focuses on Council Tax and what to do if you cannot afford to pay the increased amount in the forthcoming



financial year. (Essentially, it boils down to contacting your local council to see if you are eligible for any discounts – there are a number of options available). However, for our Mid Devon connections, we have some really exciting news that could be of much wider benefit to Mid Devon residents, so we are taking this opportunity to share it with you.

CA TNMWD operates as a charity and, whilst we benefit from some local authority funding, we need to supplement this and, consequently, invest a great deal of time and effort applying for grants from a wide range of funding bodies. We were absolutely thrilled, therefore, when we learned that we had been awarded a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund specifically to provide dedicated services in Mid Devon. This project is called Improving Financial Wellbeing and focuses on advising on debt and energy issues as well as income maximisation.

We have a team specifically designated to work in Mid Devon so any inquiries that are received via our AdviceLine (free and local on 0808 27 87 999) are directed to that team. We have an outreach office in Crediton that people can book their own appointments for (every Wednesday) and the link for that will soon be up on our website and face to face appointments can be arranged elsewhere in Mid Devon on a case by case basis. DEVON AIR AMBULANCE LAUNCH VIRTUAL 'MEMORY GARDEN' DEDICATED TO LOVED ONES

Devon Air Ambulance (DAA) has launched a new space on their charity website dedicated to loved ones who have sadly been lost by families throughout Devon and beyond.

Family members, friends, neighbours and colleagues are encouraged to leave special messages and memories in the charity's new online Memory Garden as a tribute to their special person, a wonderful way to celebrate their life.

DAA had chosen to launch this offering ahead of Mother's Day with the first memory being a touching tribute from the charity's founder Ann Ralli, a mother who turned her personal tragedy into a beacon of hope for her community and the county of Devon, a lasting tribute to her beloved son Ceri.

Since her son's death in 1986, Ann spent six years holding countless fundraisers, liaising with many council, health, and aviation officials, and gaining vital support of those in her local community and across Devon before the charity, and its services, were officially launched in 1992.

Ann said: 'It was hard to come to terms with the idea that an air ambulance we didn't yet have could have saved his life, a life that potentially would have enabled him to do all the things he cared about. Ceri would have been the first to recognise the value of an air ambulance and to work towards making it happen. That's when I realised he still could.'

As Devon Air Ambulance continues its mission to serve the community, they are delighted to unveil this new offering that pays homage to Ceri's memory while empowering others to leave dedications for their loved ones.

Jo-Anne Rigby, Head of Fundraising at Devon Air Ambulance said: 'We are so proud to launch our new In-Memory pages, providing our supporters with a way to pay tribute to their loved ones with a touching dedication in our Memory Garden, create a tribute fund or find information about how to leave their own lasting legacy. Our charity was founded by a mother who turned her grief into a wonderful tribute to her son, so we feel that this new space creates a special connection to Ann and Ceri.'

gardening where you nourish the soil rather than the plants. Recycling may be somewhat depleted in Lapford as we gather cardboard for the basis of a weed suppressing mulch to start our own 'no dig' systems.

Finally, Lara told us how she came to run the Skool Beanz gardening club; something that every primary school should have. She also started up a Saturday club at the village allotments based on the same 'no dig' idea. This is a flower and vegetable garden that also benefits wildlife, as well as giving children opportunities to learn to love and cherish their environment. LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES - FEBRUARY 2024

- A question was raised regarding the road closure in the village and the Parish Council confirmed that it had not been notified.
- District Cllr. Keable wanted to pick up the fibre broadband issue. A simple message advising that there was unlikely to be a
 massive increase in broadband cost to people who support the bid. He believed that this very simple message should be put in
 the Lapford Lookout. The clerk indicated that he would also put the same message on the website. The Parish Council
 unanimously agreed to support the broadband project and would encourage all residents and business in the parish to do the
 same.
- The clerk had suffered from another bout of COVID since the last meeting and given this focussed on the following points.
- The missing paperwork of the Parish Council has been retrieved on the passing of Juliet Cross, former Clerk to LPC this will be sorted, filed and stored in time.
- A success story with MDDC agreeing to repair or replace several dog/waste bins in the parish. This has now also been completed.
- BT Disconnection of the electricity supply at the phone box—BT were due to attend for the disconnection on 26th January, which they did. Unfortunately, the box was still chained up so access could not be gained. A new date has been arranged with the box opened beforehand so that this work can be done.
- An offer had been accepted for a free framed picture of HM King Charles to be hung in the Orchard Centre.
- The clerk reported he had made a suggested approach to the PROW team leader at DCC for the possibility of using P3 grant finance to make the repair to the driveway affected by water and debris run-off. He was awaiting a response to this suggestion.
- The signpost replacements have now been agreed and since the meeting an agreement to proceed with ordering and new signs will go ahead
- The missing LAPFORD sign needs replacing, and a member of public has indicated that she has one stored at home and can gift it to the parish. Cllr Andrews to organise this.
- The youth council idea will be held on ice for the time being due to councillors and volunteers already being fully committed at the current time.
- The community equipment in the container at the Victory Hall has been reorganised.
- Cllr. Briant-Evans reported that the LEAP minutes had just been circulated. The first request to the parish council was that the clerk write once again to Highways to make the point that the bridge repairs had still not taken place and to stress the urgency for this, also to point out the lack of urgency that the riverbank problem hadn't been addressed. She also said that the recruitment of a road warden was essential and that Cllr. Wilkie would do a presentation at the Annual Parish Meeting on what this involves.
- Grass Cutting It was agreed that the advertisement for quotations would be posted on the website and in the Lapford Lookout
 with some changes to the number of cuts and a revised deadline of 15th March 2024. The start date of the work would also be
 brought forward to April 2024, not May.
- LAPFORD NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN. Housing Needs Survey questionnaire has been circulated to residents to complete.
- BIG HELP OUT DAY 8th June 2024. Details to follow.
- **BUS SHELTER PROPOSAL.** A request had been made for the installation of a new bus shelter at the top of the Highfield. The clerk would investigate what grants were available for this and would look for suitable suppliers and prices once the Chairman had supplied him with photographs of the existing village bus shelters, alongside a location plan for the new one.
- There is a display in The ARK all about the local government, come and take a look at what actually happens.
- The removal of the existing district council play equipment from the playing field should be completed Mid-March. Discussions between the Parish Council, Cllr Keable and MDDC about funding replacement equipment and the ownership/leasing of the land are ongoing.
- The Parish Council supported the Planning application at Sandhurst, Lapford.
- All payments on the schedule were approved for payment.
- Items for the agenda of the next meeting were the annual asset inspection and general weed clearance around the village.
- It was agreed the next meeting will be held on the 12th March subject to clerk availability here are the next year's dates:
 12th Mar, 16th Apr, 14th May (AGM), 11th Jun, 9th Jul, 13th Aug , 17th Sep, 8th Oct, 12th Nov, 10th Dec

FROM OUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

For each meeting of the Parish Councils in my Taw Vale District Council Ward for Mid Devon I produce a report. While the full report is available through Parish Council minutes and public notice boards this is a reduced version for the Lapford Lookout:-

1. Our district is now amongst the top 10% of council areas nationally for recycling - together we have achieved a recycling rate of 55.4% for 2022/23, jumping 16 places since 2021/22 and becoming the second-best performing district in the county. We have not only improved its recycling rate; the amount of residual waste in the district has also reduced by 21kg per person since 2021/22, which puts it 15th out of 210 local authorities.

2. Waste collection – if there are any known issues, best report these online https://www.middevon.gov.uk/do-it-online/street-scene/report-waste-collection-issues/ or tell me your issue.

3. State of the District debate – With a commitment to work closely with parish Councils, this event happened on Wednesday 20th March with local Parish Councils - themes included communications, sustainability, planning, homes & community plans, emergency & resilience, finance.

4. Mid Devon balanced budget – 2024/5 budget unanimously agreed with the support of all political parties. This is the first budget for many years that has not required taking funds from balances.

5. Crediton High Street parking meters – the County Council has dropped proposals to introduce High Street charges. Thank you to those who signed my petition as this helped very much.

6. MDDC: car parking charges - bad news being an increase in the proposed 6.7% will raise the 2-hour charge by 20p to £2.90. The better news is that, after consultation with local groups, more flexible times will be available to provide more shoppers' variety.

7. Devon's dangerous road - With Copplestone patched, Lapford bridge has been promised now for three months and waiting for better weather!!! Again, thank you to those who signed my petition.

8. **New M5 Junction 28** - Devon County's Cabinet now support work funded through Mid Devon for major highways works estimated at £195m with funding identified in October by the Prime Minister as a result of HS2 cancellation.


