#### Some highlights of the D-Day celebrations in Lapford



#### The D-Day 80 Proclamation, 8.00 a.m., 6th June 2024

#### "Oyez, Oyez, Oyez!

Today we commemorate the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, France - an incredible achievement in military planning and logistics uniting brave service personnel from air, sea and land forces at the beginning of Operation Overlord.

By the day's end, over one hundred and fifty thousand Allied troops had successfully stormed the now famous Gold, Juno, Sword, Utah and Omaha beaches to achieve a toehold in France.

In the weeks that followed, the Allies fought bitterly against a determined foe from the unforgiving countryside of Normandy to the liberation of Paris two months later.

We should all remember and never forget the selfless sacrifice and courage of all those involved and use this Commemoration to pay our tribute to those who gave so much to secure the freedom we all enjoy today.

#### Lapford Flypast - 6th June 2024

The yellow plane is a 1960 Auster Mk9 flown by Jeff Houlgrave. It took part in the England to Australia Air Race 1969 as an official army entry in that race.



The smaller camouflaged plane is an Auster Mk3 piloted by Nigel Skinner. This is a true warbird, meaning it was active during World War II. On 6th June 1944 this plane was in the Burmese jungle with 656 Squadron helping to push the Japanese out of the Malayan Peninsula.

Let us remember the brave doctors and nurses who cared for the wounded, the men and women who toiled in the fields, the coal mines, the factories and the air raid wardens, police officers, firemen, ambulance drivers and the young people of the Scouts and Guides who all played such a vital role in the war.

#### **Lapford Weather May 2024**

Milder and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the  $12^{th}$  with a maximum of  $23.5^{\circ}$ C and the coolest was the  $2^{nd}$  with just  $11.3^{\circ}$ C. The coldest night was on the  $4^{th}$  with a minimum of  $5.2^{\circ}$ C and a grass frost of  $-1.4^{\circ}$ C.

The month started with a good soaking of rain on the  $1^{st}$  with a total of 30.3 mm rain. This was shortly followed by the only dry week of the month after which it rained on and off for the rest of the month. The final total was 95.5 mm.

The windiest day was the 30<sup>th</sup> with a gust of 30 m.p.h.

This was (just) the mildest spring I have recorded, but not the wettest. Last year was 0 wetter as was 2018.

#### LADIES OF LAPFORD

Ladies get crafty again.

Our May meeting saw the return of Jo who came to us a few months ago to share her wonderful array of fabrics, examples of embroidery and



patchwork, beautiful old christening gowns and a wedding dress from the past. On this occasion, Jo brought felting wool. She has many talents and she had come to share one of them with us; she was to show us how to make felted beads.

I was not sure what to expect. I certainly didn't picture anything as professional looking as the beads Jo brought along. She showed us a necklace of beads perfectly formed and graded in size. The colouring of the beads was consistent and just looking at them, it was hard to tell what they were made from. They would not have looked at all out of place on a special evening out with your best dress.

Jo came with a huge bag of soft wispy felting wool in all the colours of the rainbow. She also had plastics tubs (the sort that might have contained ice cream) and a bottle of washing up liquid. After a short demonstration by Jo we were ready to give it a go. The tub, the washing up liquid, some hot water, time and a supply of felting wool are all you need. We selected strands of felting wool; some people stuck to one colour and some went for combining colours. We arranged ourselves around the tubs of hot water which were given a tiny squirt of liquid and having selected some strands of felting wool laid over each other, we dipped them onto the surface of the water without soaking them and squeezed them slightly then rolled our hands together round and round to gradually create the ball shape in our palms. That was about all there was to it. Sometimes the balls did not form neatly but had a sort of slight crease in them. It was possible to correct this by adding an extra film of felting wool but it took a bit of care to succeed. If colours were combined, the end result was unpredictable and Jo explained that it was important not to have a set outcome in mind but enjoy what developed.

Jo showed us how to thread them with the options of separating them slightly from each other by adding a tiny glass bead or two between the felt ones, and she showed us the clasps that could be used.

Unlike our art evening, this was not a quiet session of serious concentration because it was easy to roll palms together and natter at the same time. We even managed to eat cake and drink tea while working. Fortunately, this did not impact on the results which were very promising for beginners. Several people asked to take some felt away with them so I think the beading might continue at home and possibly a new necklace or two in felted beads might appear out and about in the near future.

Add the juice of an orange and sweeten to taste with castor sugar. Pour the puree into a serving bowl.


Place the remaining whole fruit on top and chill in the fridge . Serve with vanilla ice cream or yogurt.
