

### **Lapford Weather September 2024**

Cooler and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the 1st with a maximum air temperature of 24.3°C and the coolest was the 30th when the temperature only managed 12.7°C in a fresh north westerly breeze.

The coldest night was on the 13th with a minimum air temperature of  $2.1^{\circ}\text{C}$  and a grass frost of  $-3.4^{\circ}\text{C}$ . Some of the nights during the month were quite mild under a thick cloud cover, for instance on the 2nd the overnight temperature was  $16.2^{\circ}\text{C}$ , not quite a record for September but indicative of a very mild air stream from the south west.

Total rainfall was 113.0 mm and the wettest day was the 5th with a fall of 27.0 mm. Some parts of the Midlands had more than this quantity of rain in just 24 hours leading to flooding in various locations.

The windiest day was the 29th with a gust of 41 m.p.h.

# FOR THE JANUARY LAPFORD LOOKOUT - 10TH DECEMBER.

### CONSULTATION: BONIFACE TRAIL

Devon County Council is engaging on the proposed multi-use trail between Crediton and Exeter. This engagement will run until Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November.



There has been a long-term aspiration to provide an active travel route between Crediton and Exeter. For journeys between the two settlements, there is high demand for travel, as shown by the number of passengers using Crediton railway station which has more than doubled in recent years, and the amount of traffic on the A377 causing congestion issues on the edge of Exeter. While the distance between Exeter and Crediton is almost 13km, there is no continuous path to provide a safe walking, wheeling or cycling link between them.

There are currently two proposed alignments: the A377 alignment and the Quiet Lanes Alignment, further details of which are available online. This engagement period is a chance for Devon County Council to understand which alignment is preferred.

The Boniface Trail is one of the proposed routes within the draft Countywide Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP), which is currently out for public engagement.

### FIBRE BROADBAND UPDATE

Questions are being asked about the rollout of fibre broadband through the village and what you need to do to 'redeem' the vouchers that many of you signed up to.

You should by now have received an e-mail from Openreach reminding you to order your fibre connection. Please follow their instructions.

You should also contact your current Internet Service Provider (ISP) and tell them you are interested in FTTP (Fibre To The Premises) and have pledged an Openreach voucher. They will check with Openreach and advise you of what else you need to do and what (if any) extra you will have to pay per month — which should be in single figures or nothing.

**If you pledged a voucher there is NO installation cost.** It is funded by a government grant.

If you are currently using satellite or AirBand you will need to select an ISP - start with whoever provides your landline or mobile.

Also check whether you will still be able to use an analogue phone - unless you are happy to convert to digital. Digital does mean you will have to add the dialling code for local calls in the 01363 area. You also need to inform your suppliers if you have any sort of alarm (personal or premises) that works over your phone line.

### AMAZING NATIONAL HISTORY NEAR YOU!

Did you know that at Coldridge, you can visit a fascinating research project that is being led by Philippa Langley, the lady who was responsible for finding Richard III's remains in Leicester?

Remarkably, St Matthew's church contains one of only two contemporary and original stained glass portraits of Edward V, the elder of the Missing Princes in The Tower, which exist today.



A team of investigators in the UK and abroad are examining the possibility that Edward V was not murdered at the hands of his uncle, Richard III, but in fact took refuge at Coldridge, which was owned by his elder half-brother, Thomas Grey.

The Missing Princes investigation at Coldridge has captured worldwide interest and featured in a recent book

by Philippa Langley. The project was the subject of a Channel Four documentary in 2023.

To learn about the latest findings, individuals, families, or groups can now visit St Matthew's Church, Coldridge, for the monthly open day and receive a slide presentation and tour of the church. A small donation is requested towards church funds. Lunches and refreshments are available in the adjacent village hall.

### ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR PENSION CREDIT AND NOT RECEIVING IT?

Nearly 40 per cent of pensioners who are entitled to Pension Credit, because of their low income, aren't claiming it and are missing out on vital support.

The Government is encouraging pensioners to check if they qualify for pension credit, and if so, to apply for it in order to receive the winter fuel payment. You'll need to apply by 21 December to get it though, as that's the final date for making a backdated claim for pension credit.

Pension Credit tops up your weekly income to £218.15 if you're single; or your joint weekly income to £332.95 if you have a partner, and you could also get additional benefits depending on your circumstances.

You can apply for Pension Credit up to four months before you reach State Pension age, or any time after you reach State Pension age, but your application can only be backdated by three months.

You can apply online, over the telephone, or by post. To find out if you're eligible visit www.gov.uk/pension-credit



### LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW

### MAXWELL KNIGHT, MI5'S GREATEST SPYMASTER BY HENRY FLEMMING

Rumoured to be the inspiration of the James Bond character 'M', famous for his collection of unusual pets and his gift for running spies, Knight was a legend of espionage. Drawing on declassified documents, private family archives and original interviews, this book tells the story of MI5's greatest spymaster.

As a child, Max was obsessed with animals, by the age of nine he kept birds, lizards, mice, rats, hedgehogs, slowworms and a tortoise. Rescuing and taking care of them was a passion with him that lasted all his life. After the death of his father when he was fourteen, he was sent to HMS Worcester, a naval training vessel where the training was brutal. This ensured the cadets grew up quickly! After this he spent five years in the Royal Navy Reserves and at the end of WWI, he began work as clerk at the Ministry of Shipping. He became besotted with jazz and even set up his own jazz band and all this time he kept up his interest with animals.

Sir George Makgill had set up an intelligence agency, his main concern was that communist agents and other militant groups were infiltrating British society. Makgill recruited Max and instructed him to join a political group, the British Fascisti, a right wing group that Max had a slight knowledge of. A lot of the people he met now are well known even to this day, including William Joyce whom he actually liked at this stage.

This was the start of his time as a spymaster, he proved very good at it and in time he ran a whole stable of undercover agents. This book tells the true story of his amazing work, his agents who helped to capture men and women hidden deep in society who gave British secrets to enemy governments.

Max retired from MI5 in the early 1960's and, never having lost his passion for nature, he started a new career as a naturalist. He appeared on BBC and became one of their most prolific broadcasters with at least 306 radio broadcasts and frequent television appearances. He had 20 books published and was considered equal to Peter Scott and David

Attenborough. At this stage of his life (if you are in the slightly older generation) you may have seen Maxwell Knight talking about the animals he loved.

This was not a particularly easy book to read but the story it told was interesting enough to keep me reading until the last page.

### LADIES TRY A TASTE OF CRETE

On a lovely sunny September evening, our group visited Crete (mentally at least) with the help of Gaynor. She began by telling us about some of the events of her life that influenced her move to Crete.



Widowed suddenly in her twenties with a very small child, she very quickly had to become resilient and find a job. This turned out to be with a well-known travel company and so began a life-long love affair with foreign travel. With one small daughter attached to her hip (as she described it), she travelled all over the world for many years only returning to provide her daughter with a more settled formal education. The years that followed saw more studying for Gaynor, a change in her career and eventually a move to live and work in Cornwall.

To explain her move to Crete, she said that the moment came when she felt she was getting a bit tired and wanted to squeeze in just one more adventure. She decided she would go somewhere abroad and live there for a year. She chose Crete because it was familiar; Crete had tended to be the 'jumping off point' for much of her earlier travelling. Her mind made up, she disposed of all her belongings, apart from her dog and the essentials that would fit in her small car and off she went.

She soon realised that she was regarded as a bit unusual but wasn't sure exactly why. Eventually, a friend told her that the women were not used to the presence of an older single woman in their midst and the question on their lips was 'Where is your man?' Once she explained that she was a widow, they could understand. She talked about the warmth and kindness of the people. They would often leave small gifts on her doorstep without any note. She wanted to return the kindness but her attempt back fired a little. She made a lot of little cakes, wrapped them and left them on doorsteps. She was surprised to find that though these all disappeared, no-one made any comment about them. She made discreet enquires and discovered that she had managed to do this during Lent so, of course, no-one was able to enjoy them (unless some of them did so in secret!).

Another story that she told was of her attempts to learn the language; a difficult task as the Greek alphabet looks very different from our own. She used books designed for children and set herself the task of learning three new words each day and of using them to fix them in her mind. She would listen hard to pick up new words and on one occasion when an acquaintance pointed out a drone going overhead and named it, she listened carefully and planned to use the word as soon as she saw it again. She had her chance later on that day and pointed it out proudly displaying her knowledge. She was very surprised by the shocked and disapproving looks that she received and wondered if she had mispronounced it rather badly. When she checked with a friend, she was embarrassed to discover that she was, in fact, swearing! The person who had said the word in the first place had been venting his feelings when he pointed at the drone!

Another more disturbing and dramatic story revealed a lot about the people. Gaynor explained that she came to realise the Greeks, if not all, certainly the ones she was living amongst were a very vengeful people. She told us about a restaurant run by two brothers, one of whom walked with an awkward limp. When she asked someone what had happened to him, he shook his head and explained that the injured brother had had an affair with the other brother's wife. The way this was dealt with was quite normal for that area. The wife was banished from the island and the husband was allowed to shoot his brother in the knee to punish him. The authorities turned a blind eye and people, including the injured brother accepted this as just penance for his crime. Once the husband had had his revenge, the two brothers could continue to work together. The wife's future wasn't mentioned; she appeared to be forgotten!

In the end, Gaynor spent several years living very happily on Crete. She may have stayed longer but family circumstances meant that she felt she was needed back here in the UK. Her adventure had lasted longer than she had anticipated and was a wonderful experience. She rounded off the tale of her experiences with a splendid offering of tasty Greek snacks which were enjoyed while people asked questions and exchanged stories of their own. Gaynor brought the island to life with her entertaining talk and when I walked home through the quiet of Lapford on a chilly evening, I carried with me a taste of a sunny island full of colour inhabited by a warm, but volatile people.

### LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES -SEPTEMBER 2024 MEETING

A summary of the Council meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2024:

Village Handyman – it was agreed to revisit the suggestion of employing a Village Handyman.

Cllr Keable reported that Mid Devon District Council is required to increase annual builds by 70% to a total of just under six hundred per annum, underlining the need for Lapford to have a Neighbourhood Plan.

HOLD – The setting up of a new charitable organisation to look after the Victory Hall and Lower Town Place is proceeding with solicitors under instruction to take the matter forward. Tidying work has been done on Lower Town Place, including the weeding of the paths, the cutting back of weed, and the tidying of the CG/LTP bank. The temporary fencing and the posts have been removed.

LEAP — is planning to set up a village-wide training exercise in the New Year.

Highways – Cllr. Briant-Evans had drafted a letter to County Cllr. Squires and Highways Officer Steve Tucker which included the following issues:

Regular flooding on the road between Kelland Cottages and Edgerley Cross.

The state of Edgerley Lane below the Edgerley House lane towards Nymet Rowland.

Dead/dying ash trees on the bank of Kennet House garden. Lack of fencing by the river bridge.

Drainage across the A377 resulting in dangerously icy conditions in winter.

Councillors requested the following issues to be added:

The poor state of the road by Filleigh and Broomsmead. Flooding between the Lapford village sign and Blackberry Gate.

Potholes near Blackberry Gate.

Potholes in Highfield Close x two.



These to be distributed alongside the Lapford Lookout, with extra copies placed in The ARK, the pub, the garage, Parish Church, etc. The industrial estate will be leaflet dropped and the event publicised on social media. Cllrs. Agreed to have a separate meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> September to plan specifically for this event.

Phone Box – Some work has taken place but more is required.

Orchard Centre – An enquiry from the Village Archive group led to discussions regarding progress with the ownership and/or transfer of various parcels of land to LPC. Cllr. Keable was requested to set up a meeting with MDDC and the various parties involved in the hope that these matters could be progressed. There were still several items on the Orchard Centre 'to do' list.

Walking Festival – Likely to be repeated next year.

### ANOTHER DEFIBRILLATOR FOR THE VILLAGE

Lapford Parish Council has arranged for a second defibrillator to be installed in the village. This will provide support to residents at the bottom of the village. It is on the outside wall, to the left of the main door into the shop at Lapford Garage.

Thanks to the owners for enabling this to be fitted.

### **LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES, OCTOBER 2024**

The Parish Council met again on 8th October. Six members of the public attended.

- An additional Defibrillator about to be installed at the Spar shop. (This has now happened).
- the order for a new bus shelter at the top of Highfield to be progressed.
- Free, nearly new, play equipment has been offered to Lapford by another parish. The offer to be accepted. The Parish Council working with LYPFT and MDDC re the installation of this.
- A new slate sign has been purchased to fix to the outside of the Orchard Centre.
- The toilet door to be reattached asap.
- A grant for various public footpath repairs has been received.
- The Lapford's Future consultation event was attended by 100 parishioners over the two days and 400 comments were recorded. A report on this to be compiled by Devon Communities Together. Thanks to the 15 people who have volunteered to join a group to take the matter of a Neighbourhood Plan forward. A meeting to be arranged once the report has been received.
- A £50 donation to the Royal British Legion was agreed for the Parish Council poppy wreath.
- A positive meeting re land issues was held with Steve Densham, MDDC, and matters are being progressed.
- Two planning applications were supported.

### LAPFORD'S FUTURE CONSULTATION EVENTS

In the lead up the consultation events in the Victory Hall on 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> October, a considerable amount of planning took place.

Flyers were produced promoting the event which were very kindly delivered by the Lapford Lookout delivery team. Thank you very much for your help. Flyers were also distributed to all public places in the village.

Seven tables were set up on the day, covering the following topics:

- \* Housing and Design, including affordable housing
- \* Open spaces and community facilities
- \* Events
- \* Employment and Business
- \* Transport and Infrastructure
- \* Youth Facilities

There was also a power point presentation containing statistics from the last census, and other displays.

The events were facilitated by the Parish Council in conjunction with Luke and Anderson from Devon Communities Together (DCT). Steve Keable MDDC attended with laptop displays about neighbourhood planning and Mid Devon housing initiatives.

Across the two days, 100 people visited, great conversations were had, and 400 post it notes written with comments, ideas and suggestions. Thanks to you all for participating.

There were also 15 volunteers who have said they would like to be involved in the next steps. Thank you.

Devon Communities Together now have the task of 'pulling' all the information together and reporting back. Hopefully we will have an update for you next month.

Once again, thank you for supporting the event, and helping to plan for Lapford's future.






