# **Lapford Weather December 2024**

Milder and drier than average. A month noted for a lack of sunshine and a particularly gloomy drizzly period over the Christmas holidays.

The mildest day was the 1<sup>st</sup> with a maximum air temperature of 14.7°C in a warm south westerly air stream. The coldest day was the 11<sup>th</sup> with a maximum of 5.2°C and the coldest night was on the 4<sup>th</sup> with a minimum of 1.0°C. There were no air frosts this month, quite unusual for December but not unheard of. The coldest grass temperature was -4.2°C on the 20<sup>th</sup>.

Total rainfall was 54.3 mm, just under half the average for December. The wettest day was the 4<sup>th</sup> with 7.1 mm.

The windiest day was the 6<sup>th</sup> with a gust of 65 m.p.h.

#### **Annual Report 2024**

2024 was a milder than average year, the sixth mildest I have measured in my records going back 37 years. There has been a small rise in annual average temperatures here in that time, by less than half a degree. It was also wetter than average, total 1051.2 mm, the eleventh wettest in the same period. There does not appear to be any long term trend in annual rainfall here, some years are wetter than average, others drier

The warmest day of the year was the  $31^{st}$  July with a maximum of just 27.9°C. The coldest day was the  $24^{th}$  January with a minimum of -4.0°C.

The wettest day was the 1<sup>st</sup> May with 30.0mm, and the windiest was the 6<sup>th</sup> December with a gust of 65 m.p.h.

Last winter was relatively mild with just one cold spell in January, but very little in the way of snow. The only morning with snow lying on the ground was on the 28<sup>th</sup> March.

Spring was mild and wet. Summer was cooler than average and quite dry apart from July. Autumn was mild and wet, with an early taste of winter around 20<sup>th</sup> November when we had snow on the ground for a couple of days.

#### LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW

# The Lost Children Archive by Valeria Luiselli

The lost children in this story are ostensibly the Mexican and other South American children who make the long and perilous journey to try to gain entry to the US to rejoin their parents. This is a harrowing and pathetic part of the book the grandmothers in South America embroider the childrens' parents' contact details onto the collars of their clothes and tell them never to take their clothes off until they meet their parents in US. En route to the US the children are led by men who drive them like cattle through jungles, across deserts and onto the roof of trains, from which, inevitably, some children fall to their death. Those who manage to reach and cross the

border are detained, after which many are deported without even seeing their parents. The parents do not know what has happened to their children.

There are, however, two other lost children in this story. Tom, aged ten, and Memphis, aged five. They are stepbrother and stepsister. Their parents met when their working lives as sound recordists brought them together. The parents' working lives have now diverged, as has their personal relationship. Tom is very



conscious of what is happening and is desperate to protect little Memphis from what is going on. The parents resolve to move from New York to Arizona; Dad is obsessed with Geronimo and the Apache and Ma with the lost daughters of her Mexican friend Manuela. The book starts in a verbose and wordy fashion with Ma narrating their story as they pack to leave and travel across states, then the narrative is simplified as Tom takes over the story. His perception of what is happening seems to be more acute than that of his parents, who seem entirely bound up in their own world and their own projects and wholly oblivious to the needs of their children. Tom has a polaroid camera, and takes photos of their journey for Memphis. He knows that she is too young to remember much of what happened, and he wants her to be his friend for ever, despite the looming divorce. Eventually the two children leave their sleeping parents and set out together across the perilous desert, just like their Mexican counterparts.

This is a very interesting and thought-provoking read. The author is obviously very angry about the situation into which migrant children are thrust and wants the reader to share her indignation and fury. It works. Whether she realised that she has made Tom and Memphis two lost (in the sense of neglected) children is debatable. If you want to be drawn into the world of these migrant children and to understand their desperation, a world unimaginable to most readers, then read this.

# LAPFORD NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING UPDATE

Following the public consultation last October and the analysis of comments carried out by Devon Communities Together an exhibition highlighting that analysis has been staged in The ARK. In order to facilitate as many people as possible visiting these two extra public viewing occasions were arranged for 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> January. In addition, the information has been published in pamphlet form to be delivered to every house in the parish.

Devon Communities Together has been working to produce a questionnaire/survey form based on the consultation event comments. This too will be delivered in paper form to every house but will contain a QR code for accessing the form online. It would be preferred that the people use the online method of return, but paper copies can be returned to safe locations in the village or collected on request. More details about this to follow. Again, the results of the survey will be analysed by Devon Communities Together and the results presented to the village.

Members of the public who volunteered to be involved with the planning process met on 11<sup>th</sup> January, agreed to form a Steering Group, and will meet again on February 1<sup>st</sup>.

# Timetable going forward.

February – pamphlet to publicise the analysis of the Consultation to be delivered to every house.

March – Survey Forms to be delivered to every house, with one month in which to complete and return them.

April/May – Analysis of the survey to be received from Devon Communities Together. Look out for a public event when this will be formally presented.

June onwards – the work of writing the Plan begins.

#### HAVE YOU SECURED YOUR EMAIL ACCOUNT?

#### Why are email accounts so important?

Your emails contain a lot of information about you, so it's crucial you make your email password strong. If criminals get into your email account, they could access personal information that could be used to scam you or others. To make it harder for them, always use an email password that you haven't used elsewhere.

Your email inbox can also act as a 'gateway' to your other accounts. Once they can access it, a criminal could use the 'forgot password' option to request emails enabling them to get into other accounts, such as your social media.

#### How to secure your email account

#### Your email password

Using a combination of 3 random words creates passwords that are long enough and strong enough. Avoid words that can be guessed, like your pet's name or birth month. Adding numbers and symbols is a good way to make your password even harder to guess.

#### Turn on 2-Step Verification (2SV) for your email

2-Step Verification (2SV) gives you twice the protection so even if cyber criminals have your password, they can't access your email.

2SV works by asking for more information to prove your identity. For example, getting a code sent to your phone when you sign in using a new device or change settings such as your password.

You won't be asked for this every time you check your email.

If you are using an email service that does not offer 2SV, please consider switching to an email provider that does.

# How to check if one of your online accounts may have been compromised

Services such as www.haveibeenpwned.com can tell you if your personal information or any of your account passwords have been made public in a major data breach.

If you have been affected by a data breach, you can find some useful information here from the National Cyber Security Centre on how to how to protect yourself from the impact of data breaches.

Sunday 8 December, the hall was again full when the Exmoor Carolers came to entertain. Mulled wine and mince pies were provided, keeping the audience well sustained for the singing. The Carolers really enjoyed themselves in-spite of some of their journeys to reach Lapford. One Caroler from Lynton, came armed with a chain saw, just in case they came across trees down from the storm the previous night. A really festive and enjoyable evening.

On December 14, the Hall was again in full use for the LAFC Big Breakfast, which is always well supported. It obviously went well, the smell of a good fry-up was still evident when Lapford Community Church came to use the hall for their service on Sunday morning.

The Youth Club, Dog Club and Lapford Community Church continue to make good use of the hall each week. The Church was able to use the Hall for their usual Sunday service as well as on Christmas Day.

The facilities at the Hall are not top class, and much needs to be done to bring it up to the standard required. The committee is working to improve the space and make it more user friendly. It takes time, money, support and encouragement. The kitchen is constantly being inspected and kept up to health and safety regulations but it's not always easy when lots of activities are using the facilities.

As frequent users of the Victory Hall, Lapford Community Church wished to replace their fitted audio-visual equipment, which is

now rather old and at times unreliable. Technology moves on and to make it easier for all hall users, a more modern installation will solve these problems. For some months the church has been searching for an installer and have chosen the company who installed the halls' acoustic panels some years ago. During the process the church has been in regular contact with the hall management committee, the Parish Council and other interested hall users to help source the best solution. We are expecting the new system to be installed before Easter. It will be a great asset for the hall and the community.

Lapford Celebrations Committee are holding a Quiz evening in the Hall on the 31st January so if you have found January slow, this should kick start you into 2025 with renewed vim and vigour.

## **LAPFORD VOLUNTARY CAR AID - A CRY FOR HELP!!!**

Let us tell you a little bit about Lapford Voluntary Car Aid (LVCA)...

It is a subsidised transport service for the residents of Lapford that provides cars (and drivers!) to take "Clients" to and from their doctor/dentist appointments as well as collecting medication as requested. We



serve Bow, Chulmleigh, Crediton, Morchard Bishop, Winkleigh and Witheridge surgeries, Chulmleigh Dentist and Crediton Hospital.

This service was set up in the late 1990s and has been well used over nearly 30 years. We normally have around 12 volunteer drivers but, over the last couple of years, this number has reduced and, over the next few years, as the current drivers' ages increase, we anticipate the number reducing even more. With this in mind, if we don't manage to "recruit" more volunteers to drive for us then sadly the service is in danger of closing down, which would impact on the lives of a lot of Lapford residents who cannot manage to get to their appointments without us.

Drivers give their time voluntarily, but will receive a mileage allowance for their vehicle expenses. It would not be a huge commitment, maybe just 2 or 3 journeys a month – but even that would be so appreciated by all who run and use the service.

If you think you can help us to keep this valuable service running, please contact Grace on 01363 83178 and she will give you all the information you need to join the team.

Once again, we cannot stress enough how vital this service is to ALL ages in Lapford (not just the elderly population) – please help us to keep it running as successfully as it has for almost 30 years.

# PARISH COUNCIL NOTES FROM MEETING 14th JANUARY 2025

- There is a meeting being organised by Lapford School regarding some changes on 28th January, Julie Down and Roy Andrews to attend. No further details known.
- Short report from Margaret Squires re Unitary Council.
- Steve Keable reported on Devon and Torbay Local transport plan. Proposed car parking at Eggesford Station, and Tarka line rail investment, due to increased usage. Also election fees are increasing. S106 governance is being updated. There have been problems with aggressive dogs and owners at Eggesford forest. A full copy of the report is available online.
- Rail travel/station access etc will be included in the Neighbourhood Plan.
- Road Warden equipment has been received. Training ongoing.
- Potholes are being filled in about a week once reported.
- · Open reach fibre installation still ongoing.
- One Network website shows all current/future road closures.
- Awaiting confirmation of S106 funding for playing field equipment from MDDC, Clerk to provide additional information.
- Footpaths grant to be applied for, same amount as last year.
- HOLD report, grass cutting going to tender, gate latches not working.
- Celebrations Committee reported that there is a fund raising quiz on 31st Jan, now planning for VE day. Councillors asked to provide a raffle prize and a cake!
- LEAP reported a lack of response to letter to DCC regarding various highways issue sent in November. Clerk to chase.
- Grant application received from Citizens Advice. Decision delayed until next meeting to establish the service they provide in Lapford.
- Grant application received from the Community Church to assist with the upgrade to the sound system/projector in the Victory Hall. Agreed to use the Calor fund balance of £1300 plus additional £700. This will be available for village use.
- Tenders to be sought for grass cutting.
- Road safety on A377, discussed danger whilst walking/speeding cars. DCC aim is to maintain existing network, no budget for new works. Speeding is a police matter.
- Neighbourhood Plan, lots of ongoing works, see separate reports.
- A payment to be made for the use of The Ark for Neighbourhood planning meetings.
- A contribution to be made to the Victory Hall for electricity used for Christmas Tree lights.
- Consideration to be given to setting up a cleaning schedule for village assets and weed control. To be added to a future agenda.






