

The mildest day was the 5th with a maximum of 13.4°C and the coolest was the 8th with a maximum of 2.3°C. The coldest night was on the 3rd with a minimum temperature of -3.7°C. The grass temperature on this night dropped to -9.5°C.

Total rainfall for the month was 146.7 mm. The wettest day was the 4th with 40.9 mm. This was the wettest January day I have recorded.

The windiest day was the 23rd with a gust of 49 m.p.h.



Local pet charity K9Focus in North Devon has just received a donation of £500 from Lapford Dog Club.

Lapford Dog Club has around 50 members. The Club specialises in promoting the training and welfare of dogs of any breed for the purposes of competition or as a companion. Each year they choose a charity to donate to and this year was the turn of K9Focus.

Fundraising money came in from their Christmas raffle and their annual Lapford Dog Club Charity Calendar sales. raffle consisted of many dog related gifts, from dog beds to tuggy toys and plenty of treats.

K9 Focus is a registered rescue, re-homing and rehabilitation charity, of both cats and dogs, together with promoting animal welfare in the Devon community.

Thurgood, Chairperson for Lapford Dog Club says 'we picked K9Focus as our local charity to receive the donation this year because of the amazing they do. We work were all concerned when North Devon Animal Ambulance had to close, so we wanted

to help a charity in that area specifically this year'.

Lynne Hall, founder of K9 Focus says 'the funds will help our long-term sustainability, especially with things like vet bills. The cost of a vaccination is now in the region of £90, our vet bills from October to December 2024 were just over £9K. Food and bedding is often donated by individuals and businesses so it is financial help that is most needed. The bottom line is without fund raisers we would not survive.

K9 Focus has a great schedule of events in 2025 – with seven dog shows already in the diary, a bingo night, a tattoo day and a music night. They are also putting together a fund-raising pack so that people can run their own events for K9 Focus'.



LAPFORD BOOK CLUB REVIEW Miss Pettigrew Lives For A Day

Miss Pettigrew Lives for a Day is a novel by Winifred Watson, first published in 1938.

Set in London in the 1930s, Watson's book captures an extraordinary day in the life of Miss Guinevere Pettigrew, a rather timid, down-at-heel spinster who has fallen on hard times. As the novel opens, Miss Pettigrew is in urgent need of a new job as a governess or a children's nanny. If she doesn't secure a new position that day, Miss Pettigrew may well find herself with nowhere to go but the poorhouse as her landlady has threatened to evict her.

Luckily for Miss P, the employment agency has a couple of new vacancies on its books: one for a lady's maid and one for a nursery governess. However, in a mix-up over the details of the two positions, the agency sends our heroine to the home of Miss Delysia LaFosse, a glamorous nightclub singer in need of a new maid.

When she arrives at the apartment, Miss Pettigrew finds Miss LaFosse in a bit of a fix. With her own culinary skills being virtually non-existent, Miss LaFosse is in urgent need of someone to fix breakfast for her gentleman friend, Phil; so before she can explain the reason for her visit, Miss Pettigrew finds herself in the kitchen, cooking ham and eggs for the two young lovers. The charming Miss LaFosse is thrilled with her new 'maid,' and Miss Pettigrew in turn is delighted to feel appreciated for once, an emotion she has rarely experienced while working as a governess.

As the tale unfolds, Miss Pettigrew assists Miss LaFosse with untangling her love life and that of Miss LaFosse's friends. Miss P spends the rest of the day amongst glamourous people she could only have ever dreamt of.

As I read the book, I was dreading the end of the day when she would have to go back to her old life. As in all good romances, her 'knight in shining armour' arrives in the nick of time. Great book, everyone in the book club thoroughly enjoyed it.


The photographs here show you how well Pearl and Jenny created their work of scrapbooking. Their books sit alongside Lapford School scrapbooks.

MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT FEBRUARY 2025 - CLLR STEVEN KEABLE, TAW VALE WARD

Aggressive Dogs & Owners using the woodland walks at Eggesford Forest. Following a series of incidents, a public meeting was held last September at Wembworthy. Since then, I have met with the Police & Forestry England (7th Oct & 13th Jan). Signs are now displayed in three car parks. The Wembworthy community have logged five new incidents since October. However, none of these have been registered with the Police or Forestry England. There is a request to promote awareness of the need to report incidents:-

From research undertaken by Forestry England, the demography of the Eggesford woodland is used by local people and few visitors outside local parishes. Dog Bins have also been requested. Forestry England do not have the budget for the revenue cost of disposal of dog poo. A request is going out to all parish councils in the locality to enquire about financial assistance.



Proposed car parking at Eggesford Station - For information -Local Parish Councils have been invited to attend meetings of the Eggesford Station Monitoring Group set up by Winkleigh Parish Council. S106 funding has been made available, from Winkleigh to Devon County Council, for car parking at the station.

Tarka Rail Investment – I have a growing confidence there will soon be a strategic outline business case for signalling and loops in the line that will enable two trains in the hour. The line has the greatest and most consistent passenger growth on the GWR network – 15% pa or and additional 50k journeys p.a.

a briefing from GWR Regional Manager David Whiteway. This Group is becoming a focal point for the parish councils of three District Councils. The Northern Devon Railway Development Alliance provided a good deal of technical assistance to the

railway companies. They have an AGM 7th March at the Royal & Fortescue, Barnstaple. The Tarka Line Association has rebranded itself as the North Devon Line Promotion Group. There is a letter in circulation to parish councils along the railway line to become members (£15 p.a.)

Devon & Torbay Local Transport Plan. (LTP4) 2025 - 2040 Public consultation closed in November. I together with other parish councils, made the case for improved bus services in our part of Devon. With the prospects of improvements to the railway a bus shuttle service between Winkleigh-Eggesford-Chulmleigh-Chawleigh has been proposed. However, following a recent meeting between the Eggesford Station Monitoring Group and Devon County Council, this requirement has not been recognised yet on the LTP4. This is a matter that I shall continue to lobby.

Biodiversity Duty Action Plan & Climate Strategy Action Plan -Mid Devon has adopted the first as a statutory requirement. The second Action Plan will be a starting point for engaging with communities, businesses, and partner agencies. Mid Devon is on target to reduce its carbon footprint to meet its target for 2023.

White Paper and Decentralisation - There has been considerable media coverage since the publication of the "Devolution" White Paper on 16th December. This impacts upon us all in three completely different ways.

- (a) A Combined County Authority, with a strategic overview of historic Devon was formed on 5th February and the inaugural meeting will be at Tavistock on the 19th March, with three representatives from Torbay Council, three representatives from Devon County Council, two representatives for the eight District Council and the Police & Crime Commissioner. This body will have a small budget of devolved funding to perform strategic duties.
- (b) Unitary Council(s) The Secretary of State has announced that Devon will not be in the first round of Councils for the consideration and that the County Council Election on 1st May will not be cancelled. There is little doubt there will be local government reorganisation in Devon. We enter a period of uncertainty.

The County Council is proposing a Unitary Devon, seven of the eight District Councils plus Torbay are likely to propose two Unitary Councils in Devon and supporting an expanded Plymouth into part of South Ham and part of West Devon.

(c) Mayoral Strategic Authorities. This is the most significant of devolutionary Government initiatives and established, will have a considerable budget. These authorities refer to a local government body in the UK where a directly elected mayor has significant power to make decisions on strategic issues like transport, planning, and economic development within their region. Devon & Cornwall is the proposed region.

Unitary authorities will impact upon the tasks of parish councils. A Unitary Council area equivalent to a current County Council In December the Eggesford Station Monitoring Group received Division e.g. one County Councillor (Margaret Squires) with 22 active parish councils between Wembworthy and Silverton and eight District Councillors will be reduced to two Unitary Councillors.



LAPFORD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS



It's been a very busy half term for Lapford Primary School with opportunities for all the children to extend their learning beyond the classroom. One of the huge benefits of being part of the Chulmleigh Academy Trust is the close links we form with the other Trust schools.



This means we can pair up for residential and sporting events and also give children the opportunity to make use of the secondary school facilities at Chulmleigh College. Of course, with every Lapford child guaranteed a place at Chulmleigh College, this also helps serve as an enhanced transition, with children getting used to the school they will one day attend.

This term both Herons and Kingfishers classes have had opportunities to visit Chulmleigh College to complete DT projects. Kingfishers have been learning all about bread production and to complete their unit of work and put all their learning into practice, they were set the challenge of baking six identical rolls which included one special ingredient of their choice. After a busy morning baking, the rolls were sent for judging by an expert panel, consisting of staff and students from the college. Despite the high standard of baking, the results were unanimous and Zeph's chocolate chip flavoured bread recipe emerged triumphant!



Herons have also been hard at work learning all about mechanical models and they were set the

challenge of creating a moving animal model. After several weeks learning how cam mechanisms work, building prototypes and designing an automata

animal model in the classroom, they finally travelled to the college to use the workshop to make the mechanisms for their final designs. The children were amazing: following instructions to use tools



safely, demonstrating resilience and perseverance when things didn't quite go according to plan and working as a team to offer support and guidance to each other. They had a wonderful morning in the workshop and all made a working cam model. I can't wait to see their finished products once they have decorated and added their animals.




Perhaps the highlight of the half term was our grand opening of 'The Wooden Spoon Sensory Room'. During the previous academic year we were fortunate enough to secure over £7,000 funding from The Wooden Spoon charity, to create a fully equipped sensory space. This, combined with a generous donation from FLS, ensured we were able to redecorate and rewire the room so that the sensory equipment could be utilised most effectively. At the end of January, we invited representatives from Wooden Spoon and from FLS to join us to celebrate the completion of the project. Our guests were treated to a tour of the school by current pupils and then we congregated in the hall to

watch the cutting of the ribbon live on

the screen. Finally all of the children decorated a wooden spoon. These have been hung in the corridor leading to the sensory room. It was a really special day and it was clear that the children really do appreciate their new space. Our guests commented time and time again how well mannered, enthusiastic and engaged the children were and the chairperson of the Devon branch of the charity commented that Lapford was one of the happiest and most inclusive schools he had visited. We were incredibly proud of all the children.
