Celebrations to commemorate the 80th anniversary of VE day commenced early on the 9th May, with the Proclamation being read on the Church Green by Sue Briant-Evans, Vice-Chair of Lapford Parish Council. This was read amongst the excellent poster display of Lapford Wartime history, curated by David Garton.





Lapford Weather April 2025

Milder and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the 30th with a maximum temperature of 23.1°C and the coolest was the 15th with 10.5°C. The coolest night was on the 11th with a minimum air temperature of 1.5°C. The lowest temperature on the grass was -2.8°C on the 9th.

Apart from a week in the middle of the month this was a mainly rainless month. The middle week however produced a lot of rain, culminating with 51.1 mm on the 15th, the third wettest day I have ever recorded, and easily

the wettest April day. Total rain for the month was 95.2 mm.

The windiest day was the 1st with a gust of 42

NOTES ON THE LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 13TH MAY 2025

- Seven councillors, the Clerk, the District/County Councillor and four members of the public attended.
- Cllr Julie Down was elected as Chair for the next twelve months, Councillor Sue Brant-Evans as Vice-Chair
- The District/County Councillor's report covered the DCC issues of pothole repairs and less than satisfactory Children's Services report; plus the MDDC achievement in the best ever recycling levels, the 2025 Green Enterprise Grant scheme, the judgement from the Regulator of Housing, Active Mid Devon's fee structure, ongoing debate re submission to the Government concerning Devolution and
 - Local Government Reorganisation which will be the subject of the State of the District debate to be held on 25th June.
- New equipment was being installed in the small Playing Field and would be commissioned for use in the near future; additional youth equipment to be installed in the large field as soon as practicable.
- Devon Highways to be contacted again concerning ongoing local road problems.
- Work to rectify footpath problems had been commissioned.
- The Parish Council Bank Signatories, Standing Orders, Financial Regulations, Statement of Internal Control, Receipt of Minutes and Agendas Online, Business Risk Assessment, Asset Register & Insurance and Internal Audit Report were all accepted by the meeting.
- The 2024/25 Annual Governance and Accountability Return was accepted, as was the Recurring Payments statement for the year ending 31st March 2026 and the schedule of Council Meeting Dates for the next twelve months.
- Proposals re the refurbishing of the Public Toilet and the Orchard Centre to be considered at the next Parish Council meeting.
- MDDC Planning Enforcement to be contacted re building construction and an untidy site at Eastmere Farm and the state of Prospect Cottage.
- A bundle of historic Parish Council documents to be placed in the Village Archive for safe keeping.
- A village Tidy-up Day booked in for 20th September.

COUNCILLOR'S REPORT FOR LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL 13TH MAY 2025

Cllr Steven Keable, County (Creedy, Taw & Mid Exe), District (Taw Vale)

Following the May 1st Devon County Council election this is the first of my joint Councillors report that will cover both the County Council and Mid Devon District Council. While I look forward to working with 29 different parish communities in my Creedy County Division, it does mean that with so many parish council meetings happening most months, it will be physically impossible for me to attend all meetings. I shall endeavour to keep your parish council informed through regular written reports.

It is an honour to be elected and it is my intention to serve everyone in our community and I shall keep to my election priorities of 'people, planet and prosperity'.

- 1. Devon County Council there will be a new Liberal Democrat led administration formed at the first Council meeting on 22nd May, where Cllr Julian Brazil (Kingsbridge) will become Leader of the Council and Cllr Paul Arnott (Seaton & Colyton) as Deputy Leader. There will be a Cabinet of 9 Councillors formed around the same themes as the previous Council. County Committee positions will be determined on 22nd as the political groups become organised. More information: https://www.devon.gov.uk/democracy/councillors-info/ The political composition of the Council is as follows:
 - Liberal Democrat: 27
 - Reform UK: 18Conservative: 7
 - Green: 6
 - Independent: 2
- **2. Potholes** the most talked about issue and this will receive a great deal of attention.
- Q: Why does it cost 3x as much to fill a pothole in Devon than it does in Somerset?
- **3. Children's services** after months of delay OFSTED publish their long awaited judgment on Children's Services in Devon https:// files.ofsted.gov.uk/v1/file/50276862. The 5-point grading of 4 x inadequate and 1 x requiring improvement is not good! "Children's experiences in Devon remain poor. For too many children, serious weaknesses remain, leaving children at risk of harm".
- **4. Mid Devon District Council** Full Council met for the new Municipal Year on 7th May. Details of Councillors, Democracy and Meetings are available https://www.middevon.gov.uk/your-council/councillors-democracy/
- 5. Mid Devon District Council has achieved its highest-ever ranking for waste and recycling performance, thanks to the continued efforts of residents to reduce waste and recycle more.

For the year 2023/24, the district council recorded a recycling rate of 57.9%, placing it 11 out of 197 local authorities. Mid Devon also achieved a non-recyclable waste figure of 307.8kg per household, ranking ninth and placing the district within the top 5% of local authorities nationwide. https://www.middevon.gov.uk/mid-devon-achieves-best-ever-waste-and-recycling-results/

- **6. Mid Devon District Council's 2025 Green Enterprise Grant is now available to small and medium businesses in the district.** The Green Enterprise Grant scheme offers capital grants from £500 to £5,000, covering up to 50% of eligible project costs. Funded by Mid Devon District Council, it is open to small and medium sized local businesses who want to reduce their carbon footprint by investing in energy efficiency and renewable energy, or by efficient use of resources or materials. https://www.middevon.gov.uk/grants-now-available-to-help-mid-devon-businesses-go-green/
- 7. Mid Devon District Council has received a judgement from the Regulator for Social Housing, following its housing rent calculation error. The Council made a self-referral to the regulator in September 2024, following the discovery of a historic error in the way it applied formula rent to the majority of our tenants. https://www.middevon.gov.uk/housing-rent-error-regulator-s-judgement/
- **8. Active Mid Devon** Mid Devon's new look leisure service, introduces fee reductions to unpaid carers who use it's facilities and classes with a 25% discount on Membership or a 20% discount on casual sessions, for adult carers while those carers who are under 18 years will have free access to Mid Devon's leisure centres.
- **9. Devolution & Local Government Reorganisation** 28th November is the deadline for submissions to Government. The District Council are pooling resources to work through joint consultants on 1:4:5. DCC has put forward 5 options: these will be considered by the new Council.
- **10. State of the District Debate** this annual event has been deferred due to the County Council Elections and is being scheduled for 25th June where Local Government Reorganisation in Devon will be the theme.

Crafters, artists, photographers and cooks can join the competition with their best efforts. Age is no bar – there are categories for everyone!



LADIES AND KINUSAIGA





try on the altered skirt! Knowing her skills, we asked her if she would come up with a craft activity for our April meeting. We knew we could rely on her to do a good job and she

We were introduced to Kinusaiga. This traditional Japanese craft involves creating art using material but without needle or thread. Originally, the art would have been created using scraps of material and wooden boards into which grooves had been cut. The material was held in place by pushing it down into the grooves. Often the scraps would come from garments which had been 'retired' but which reminded the owners of a special era or occasion so that as well as creating a picture, the artwork could contain a host of happy memories.

Beccy came with two examples of what could be achieved. The first thing she showed us was a stunning mosaic in lovely vibrant colours and at this point I wanted to sneak quietly out of the door as I knew I would not be able to produce anything remotely similar. Fortunately, she explained quickly that we were not expected to be able to do something on that scale and showed us a much simpler but very effective scene of a sun rising over the horizon with folds of hills in the foreground. She explained how we were to pin our desired picture (sketched on paper) onto the insulation board and then using a sharp modelling knife, we were to go over all our drawn lines cutting grooves into the board. Once this was done, we were to cut pieces of fabric to the approximate size of an area we wanted to cover, put it into place and secure it there by tucking the edges down tightly into the grooves.

What really impressed us all was the work Beccy had put into making the task very straightforward. She handed out a pack to everyone. We opened our packs to find instructions, a sample picture and spare paper in case we wanted to draw our own picture, pen and pencil, a little set of pins, the modelling knife, the insulation board, neatly cut to size, scissors, glue and an assortment of tools that could be used to press the material into the grooves. Instantly, each of us was equipped with everything we could possibly need so that we could get to work quickly. Get to work quickly we did with the usual varying degrees of success. Our natural crafters were soon racing ahead while some of us followed more slowly but Beccy's careful preparation had made sure it was achievable for everyone. Her attention to detail made everything very straightforward.

It was a task which required some concentration but not so much that we couldn't chatter so the room buzzed with conversation while the

pictures slowly appeared. Everyone's hands were busy and the time flew by. People seemed reluctant to stop what they were doing so tea and cake were served while the work continued. Eventually the evening came to an end with some pictures finished and others being carried away carefully to be completed at home.

It was a very enjoyable evening thanks to the really thoughtful effort Beccy put in. The only drawback from her point of view is that because the evening was so successful, we are very likely to ask her to do something for us again!

SWIFT CONSERVATION TALK BY EDWARD MAYER OF SWIFT CONSERVATION HOSTED BY SUSTAINABLE CREDITON

This talk was held in the Crediton Congregational Church at the start of May and Edward spoke entertainingly about these amazing birds. Swifts have been around for millions of years with an image a 49 million year old swift fossil displayed. Nowadays we may be privileged enough to hear these all-black birds screeching speedily over the village. I noticed them arriving at the very start of May. They land only to nest while they feed, drink, mate and sleep on the wing. Living for around 9 years, they are loyal to their mates and nest location.

Unfortunately, like many species they are now on the red list meaning their numbers have dropped by more than 60% in the last 40 years.

Due to changing weather, reduced woodland cover and the use of pesticides in farming. Modern building practices have reduced nesting space for swifts further. Worryingly, an example was given

of a single UK oil seed rape crop that required 22 applications of pesticide and fungicide.

Urban areas can now often provide more biodiversity including habitat for swifts. Urban parks, trees and buildings provide shelter, food and nest sites.

We can improve things for swifts! The talk encouraged us to be alert to any new planning applications and request these include bat and swift boxes. We can increase the availability of insect food by creating meadows, small wild patches and other native planted areas.

If you are carrying out any repairs to your eaves or roof, talk to your roofer about keeping nests and providing more with swift bricks, access or boxes. Edward explained that the direction doesn't matter, as long as they aren't facing into the prevailing weather. You can make or buy boxes. Some people also play swift calls to attract the birds to new nest sites and there was discussion about the suitability of adding nesting boxes to local church bell towers adding nest boxes. The swifts don't mind the bells.

Here in Lapford we also enjoy the sight of House Martins in the village but you can differentiate these birds as they can land on wires and have white chests. We can also make space for them by not disturbing their mud nests and providing similar habitats for insects.

One final point was to make sure that water was accessible and if there were ponds that these were bromide free.

Once you are attuned to their screeching calls it is a pleasure to watch them speed across our skies.



NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL CITIZENS ADVICE

We have just finished compiling our Annual Reports for 2024-25. In them we relate our impact on local communities. They will be available before the end of May on our website and make for interesting reading. Inquiries about welfare benefits, energy, debt and housing remain key areas where people need our help. We have covered advice on all of these issues over time and shall doubtless be doing so again. However, this month I'd like to talk about another aspect of our work and ask for your help!



In-house we refer to our Research and Campaigns which roughly translates into trying to make society fairer. This is a lesser known aspect of our work but every bit as important as the advice and help we give because it enables us to put pressure on the decision makers where we see something is unfair. Our charity is highly respected and people listen to us. We also maintain relationships with our local MPs and councillors. Whilst maintaining the highest standards of confidentiality, we compile compelling data to support our causes.

We support this at both local and national levels and are very active locally, getting out and about in the community and undertaking surveys which are a vital part of this work. We recently published a report on the impact of the cost of living crisis based on our local research.. Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon 2024 Living Standards Report - Rural Devon Citizen's Advice We were also delighted when Karen Plum, our Research and Campaigns volunteer received an "Unsung Hero" award at the recent Research and Campaigns national conference. She and our Team Leader Laurence Atkinson, who heads our Research and Campaigns work, put a great deal of time and energy into this crucial aspect of our work. Which leads me to my request for help!

As part of a Devon-wide campaign we seek information from people experiencing problems with repairs in private or social rented properties. There is a simple form here https://forms.office.com/e/0gRCPqVggG and if you could complete it for us it would be really helpful. We can't undertake to try and resolve any issues you may have but it will help us to escalate what is a very real and widespread problem. We would also like to hear from you if you do seasonal work in the area and are on means tested benefits as we are also picking this up as an issue that needs serious review for people finding it hard to make ends meet. LAPFORD ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The Lapford Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Victory Hall, Lapford, Crediton, EX17 6PZ on Tuesday 10 May 202 at 10.00 am.

Attendees: Cllrs. Julie Down (LPC Chairman), Sue Briant-Evans, Bill Graham, Steven Fletcher, Roy Andrews, Steve Keable (District and County Cllr), Luke Groves-Davies (Devon Communities Together), Rob Martin (Parish Clerk) and twelve members of the public.

1. Lapford Neighbourhood Plan – DCT Presentation

2. Acceptance of notes of meeting held on 14 May 2024

The minutes of the meeting on 30 May 2023 were agreed as a correct record and were duly signed as such.

3. Chairman's Annual Report 2023/24

This year has been challenging in many ways, both on a national level with a change of Government, ongoing discussions with regards to the future of both County and District Council structures, and changes/resignations within the Parish Council.

Looking to the future, there is some uncertainty, but one thing that is virtually guaranteed is that more work will be undertaken by us, your Parish Council. We do have three vacancies at the moment, so if you are interested in getting involved, please speak to us, or contact our Clerk. The Parish Council plays a pivotal role within the village of Lapford, much of its work goes unnoticed, that is until it doesn't get done! Below is just a 'taster' of the work undertaken:

Approximately twelve planning applications have been received for the village, and reviewed, some straightforward, some requiring more thought and consideration.

Our year started in June 2024, with D-Day celebrations, a Proclamation on the Church Green early in the morning, a flypast, an evening event and beacon lighting, all arranged by the Celebrations Committee.

In July, following much lobbying by the Parish Council, Lapford's biggest and most talked about issue was finally resolved - Mill Hill was resurfaced, much to the delight of everyone in the area. An excellent job was done by the contractors, who kept the road open as much as possible.

Numerous tidy up days have taken place, including litter picks, weeding, and general maintenance of village assets, and there are quite a few! Thank you to everyone who helps whether it's at the organised events or not, it's much appreciated.

The first of the Neighbourhood Plan consultations took place in October, with over 100 villagers taking part. This formed the basis for the survey and report, already covered today by DCT.

The Council is in a good financial position, which has enabled some significant improvements to be made in the village.

A new bus shelter was erected at the top of Highfield, which is very well used by all both the school pupils and service bus users.

A contribution was made toward the new sound equipment in the hall.

New equipment is being installed on the toddler area at the moment, which is being funded partly by the Parish Council and partly from S106 monies. The area will be managed by us moving forward.

The last event for this Parish Council year was on Thursday evening, to celebrate the 80th anniversary of VE Day. There was a proclamation, a flypast, a concert in the church and lighting of the Beacon. The observant amongst you will notice that our year started and ended in a very similar way.

Councillors are all volunteers, who have the village and it's residents at the heart of every decision taken, sometimes it's difficult, but on the whole rewarding.

Thank you to every one of you, councillors, volunteers, and those who do things 'on the quiet' so to speak, you are all appreciated.

4. Reports from Outside Bodies

Lapford Youth and Playing Field Trust (LYPFT)

The Lapford Playing Field Committee is continuing to improve and maintain the facilities at the playing field – hopefully our S106 grant application will be successful and enable us to add some new equipment to what is already there, to be used by the older youths and adults.



Last year's fundraising events were hampered a lot with poor weather, however, we still managed to raise £621 by holding indoor car boot sales and running a couple of village markets.

We have "spruced up" the goal posts for the budding footballers, we will be adding more picnic benches for families to use, and hopefully we will be making a wildlife area at the very bottom of the field.

We had a ROSPA safety inspection in March and everything passed.





Lapford Project 2000 continues to thrive as a well run and cohesive group. Our current areas of work can be summarised as follows:





- 3. We provide ideas, help, support and materials for the regular displays in The ARK.
- 4. LP2K also organises Lapford's poppy displays and our "Silent Soldier" on the Church Green for Remembrance each year. This year we have also updated the wording on the Orders of Service.
- 5. We take the lead in providing and maintaining the village notice boards outside the Victory Hall. Both have recently been renovated and are now in tip-top condition.
- 6. We organise village improvements and events on an ad hoc basis, as and when a need or opportunity arises, and will continue to do what we can to improve village facilities for the benefit of all. Should you have any suggestions for consideration please get in touch.



Lapford Voluntary Car Aid (LCVA)

Lapford Voluntary Car Aid continues to be very busy, providing subsidised transport to medical appointments for the residents (clients) of Lapford.

During 2023/24 the LVCA completed 222 journeys, covering 3282 miles, proving that we are still a very valuable service to Lapford.

Lloyds Bank have now started to charge us £4.25 per month just to hold an account with them (as they have registered us as a business, which we clearly are not) – this will be a drain on our resources, so we are going to ask the Charity Commission if we can register with them, hoping it will make us exempt from these charges. We do not generate an income – our funds come from donations/fundraising and legacies.


This service has been running since 1998, so soon to be 30 years - what an achievement!

Trustees of Lapford Church Green



The Trustees have met regularly over the last twelve months:

- The Chestnut tree by the Melissa Lake Shelter has died. Conservation Area permission is in place to fell it for public safety reasons. The work will be carried out following a hopefully favourable survey to confirm that no bats are using the tree for roosting. The felled timber will be gifted to the school and placed in the conservation area there.
- The Melissa Lake Shelter has been repaired, including the installation of a replacement carving, courtesy of Melissa's family. They have been thanked for this.
- The EVJ bench has been restored by a volunteer. Thank you.

- Maintenance of the fencing and gates is ongoing.
- Trustees have worked to keep the Churchyard wall and the bank between the Green and Lower Town Place tidy.
- Original Church Green documents, including conveyances, have come to light and been deposited in the Village Archive for safe keeping.
- A new power box has been installed to enable easy connection for outside events e.g. the lighting of the village Christmas Tree.
- Public events on the Green have included The Revel, The Annual Remembrance Service, the D-Day commemoration, a display
 of Mysterious Lapford to coincide with the Mid Devon Walking Festival event and the siting of the Christmas Tree. The next
 event will be the village's VE Day commemoration.
- The ARK café makes very good use of the tables and benches on the Green in the summer months.
- New banking arrangements are in place.
- Thank you to our grass cutting contractor for keeping the Green looking so good and to the volunteers who keep other areas tidy and the fencing and seats in good condition.

Lapford Revel Committee



Following the AGM in September sixteen people agreed to serve on the committee for the current year. An average of ten people turn up for the monthly meetings.

The huge amount of planning for the July Revel begins early with the booking of bands, bouncy castle and entertainers, all in place by Christmas. Subsequent meetings are concerned with arrangements for road closures, food and bar provision, timings of events, liaising with other organisations e.g. the school for the procession and choosing of the Revel Royal Party, and churches for the Revel service; approving the event management plan, insurance and security, volunteers, the draw, publicity, and more.

This year's Revel theme will be 'Industrial Lapford', so watch out for displays on this theme. Also this year the Revel Church Bell ringing competition will be revived after a gap of around sixteen years.

The Revel rarely makes a profit, last year it just about broke even. In March the committee held a successful quiz in the Victory Hall raising just over £400 towards this year's costs.

Thank you to all those people who come together to create such a wonderful annual event for the village.

The Committee is always looking for new ideas and for additional people to join it to plan for the next twelve months.

Lapford Emergency Action Plan (LEAP)

LEAP is a working party of the Parish Council with its own terms of reference. During the last twelve months it has been concerned with:



- Pressurising Highways to improve the condition of local roads culminating in the resurfacing of the road over the river bridges and up Mill Hill.
- Joining the DCC Road Warden Scheme, with two local people half-way through their training, and road mending equipment bought by the Parish Council.
- The purchase and installation of a new grit bin for Highfield.
- The maintenance of winter grit stocks for the parish.
- The acquisition and siting of a second defibrillator for the village.
- A meeting with Steve Tucker, District Highways Officer and County Councillor Margaret Squires to discuss local road safety issues, particularly potholes and flooding issues, responsibility for the safe removal of dead and dying trees and the lack of safety fencing by the river bridge.
- Regular highlighting of local road issues and communication with Devon Highways about them, with little or no response.
- Attendance at the Devon Resilience Forum meetings.

This committee would really welcome additional members and volunteers from members of the public.

Lapford Celebrations Committee



The Committee was formed in order to organise local celebrations of National events, e.g. the Coronation.

Last May it co-ordinated the village's D-Day commemoration event and has just completed planning for this year's commemoration of Victory in Europe Day. To help finance this a really enjoyable quiz evening was held last January raising £500.

The Committee is a working group of the Parish Council. It has its own Terms of Reference and presently comprises four Parish Councillors and one member of the public. Last autumn the committee arranged Lapford's contribution to the Mid Devon Walking Festival, including a total revision of a local walks leaflet first published in 1994, an exhibition relating to the parish footpaths, tea at The ARK and a Village Treasure Trail.

Lapford Twinning Association

Lapford Twinning with Granville Langannerie started in 1975.

We then visited them and they had a return visit the same year. At one time the schools exchanged, pupils staying with families here. We now visit them once a year and they have a return visit the following year.



Twenty-two people visited us last May, we visited a couple of breweries and Castle Drogo amongst other places. Seventeen of us are now going to Granville Langannerie on 27th May 2025, cruising from Portsmouth to Calne. We have three days with our hosts, being entertained by visiting places of interest and joining in family life, returning on 1st June 2025.

We are now joined by friends from North Tawton, Hatherleigh and Sampford Courtney, under the heading of Friends of Langannerie.

If anyone is interested in joining the Twinning Association, our secretary is Marion Pratt, her contact details are in the Lapford Lookout or speak directly to one of us.

The Parish Church of St. Thomas of Canterbury

It has been something of an intensive year for St Thomas'.

We continue to work with both the Congregational Church and the Community Church and have established regular shared services. On the first Sunday of the New Year with the Community Church, for Mothering Sunday at the Parish Church, and for Harvest Festival at the Congregational Church. We also work jointly for 'event-related' services such as the Crib Service, Remembrance Sunday and the Revel.

It cannot escape notice that the church has gained its first extension since the end of the 19th century. This project was made possible by a very large bequest from the late Phyllis Partridge MBE. It is a matter of some 'inconvenience' that there is no public toilet within easy reach of the church. This is particularly felt at weddings and funerals where people have travelled some distance, for any



service involving small children, and when we have disabled visitors. It is also hoped to use the church for recitals and concerts in the future when the need for such facilities is even more necessary.

The vestry and many corners of the Grade 1 listed building contain considerable quantities of non-sacred equipment that enables the decoration of the church for particular occasions. There are also administrative files, even more of which are stored in the homes of PCC members and should be held centrally. The vestry fire exit is also blocked by storage so unable to be used.

The new extension therefore has three spaces – a fully accessible toilet with baby change table, a document store with filing cabinets and a large area for the storage of all the sundry equipment.

Unfortunately the establishment of the necessary easements for the drains to cross neighbouring properties has become embroiled in legal processes. We hope these will be able to be resolved within the next few months but in the meantime our considerable investment stands idle.

It should be recorded with the most heartfelt thanks that the whole external appearance of the extension is the work of Derek Pleace, and he completed it the evening before he sadly passed away. Derek loved the church and worked tirelessly on it in his spare time, whenever he was needed. Everyone who has seen it comments about how well it fits in with the ancient architecture and it is, in many ways, his memorial.

Lapford Community Church

Thank you for the invitation to report the work of our church at the AGM. Unfortunately, this is a busy week for us and so we are unable to be with you in person, but would like to submit the report below:

One might be tempted to think that the church is in decline. Certainly, anecdotal evidence might show that, but there are places both in the UK and around the world, where the church is thriving, especially amongst the young adult generation. Purely on numbers our church is doing well and our passion to serve the community is very much part of our journey.

We are delighted to be able to use the village hall regularly on Sunday mornings and, as you will be aware, with consultation with other hall users, we have recently undertaken a new refit of the audio/visual system.

The new system is working very well and a noticeable improvement on the old one. We are very grateful to the Parish Council for their considerable help with the funding for this and wish to point out that, with guidance, it is available for all users of the hall.

The ARK continues to be a focal space in the village, as well as the Foodbank, and we are currently undertaking a review of how best to use it to further serve the community of Lapford. Later this year it will have been ten years since its opening and, to mark this, we are planning a weekend of celebrations in the second weekend of September; more details available nearer the time.

We remain committed to working through Churches Together (with the other churches In Lapford) to provide support, regular Christian worship and witness both in the village and the surrounding area.

Lapford Youth Club

It takes a village to raise a child and that is why having a thriving youth club is so important, especially now after Covid lock-down and where so many teenagers are either studying hard or lost in their own private world of IT, social media and smart screens. Spaces are needed for social events, to meet with others, to talk, to play, to explore. This is the value of a thriving youth club. But to do this does require adult help and to be safe and sound a lot of adults are needed to help.

We have lots of energetic kids who want to do things but sadly we simple do not have enough adult helpers anymore to run the youth club programme of activities. Immediately after Covid we had a pool of 25 people running the Hi Five Thursday junior session and the Friday Drop-in for the older teenagers. Now with just four regular adult helpers the Hi Five Thursday nights has not run since last September. Thanks to Sue Hemsworth, Steve Fletcher, Jake Lloyd and to Darren Crump for being on call as we need a minimum of 3 each Friday Club night.

Financially the Youth Club 'washes its face' and we are a working voluntary management committee. We have purchased new equipment and we have a plan to renovate and refurbish the small meeting room at the Victory Hall. We are totally dependent upon our own funds to do this. There are the regular costs of insurance and rent that must be paid out. These are met from a £1 subs fee for each Club session. The open space of Lower Town Place is a wonderful asset. However, using a door other than a fire door is urgently needed.

5. Parish Council Financial Report 2024/25

The Clerk summarised the financial position as it stood at 31st March 2025.

The Receipts for the year of £38,027 (£28,532 in 23/24) included £26,000 of precept and £10,424 of grants, (of which £5,510 was for the DCT Neighbourhood Plan work, £2,214 towards the bus shelter and £1,800 for P3 PROW Grant) and £1,122 in reclaimed VAT.

Payments during the year increased over last year from £27,442 to £39,636 with the main additional items being the bus shelter (£4,429), new defibrillator (£1,511), replacement signpost fingers (£1,048), DCT Consultant Work (£2,755), Additional VAT (£2,074) The overall level of Reserves fell between the years by £1,609, but more of this total has been reserved for the outstanding commitments at the end of the year, those being the final payment for the DCT work (£2,755) and the amount found from reserves towards the Toddler Play equipment (£6,851). The result Is that the General Reserve left to provide a back-stop to the precept has reduced from £25,937 to £15,795, which is still at a sufficient level, the guidance for which is between 50 and 100% of the precept.




