



The tree is in an increasingly sorry state. The Church Green Trustees are aware of public concerns about this and have plans for felling as soon as practicable. Meanwhile a survey of the tree carried out on 4th June established that:

- The tree is safe i.e. not about to fall over, and
- There are no animals, including bats, living or roosting in it.

The tree will be felled to ground level, leaving no protruding stump, and the wood taken up to the school in sections for use in the conservation area there.

Conservation Area permission is in place via MDDC.

WHAT3WORDS

Devon Air Ambulance is once again taking part in what3words summer campaign to raise awareness and urge the public to download the app to #KnowExactlyWhere.

 Devon Air Ambulance, along with other UK emergency services is urging supporters to download the free what3words app that can provide callers with their exact location.

Devon is a county made up of stunning, but rural and sometimes dangerous beauty spots like Dartmoor and our incredibly scenic coastal paths that both locals and tourists alike will flock to for their summer adventures.

'What's the address of the emergency?' is one of the first questions asked when calling 999 but describing where help is needed can be difficult and stressful, especially in unaddressed or unfamiliar areas. New research highlighted that many people would struggle to describe meeting points in forests (40%), on country roads (39%) and campgrounds (34%), which could lead to a delay in locating a caller when every minute matters.

what3words provides a solution and has created a simple way to communicate very precise locations. It has divided the world into a grid of 3 metre squares and given each square a unique identifier consisting of three words: a what3words address. This means that every viewpoint along a hiking trail, stadium entrance, picnic spot in the park and tent on a campground has its own what3words address.

The what3words app works offline, making it ideal for use in areas with an unreliable data connection, such as popular summer destinations like festivals, beaches, national parks and campsites. what3words is available in over 60 languages to date, including Welsh. It is free to download on iOS and Android, and can be accessed via the online map at what3words.com

TWINNING VISIT OF FRIENDS OF GRAINVILLE LANGANNERIE

A group of fifteen friends from Lapford and North Tawton have just returned from a visit to their twin town of Grainville Langannerie in Normandy.

On arrival at their "Salle de Fetes" (Town Hall) they were given a civic reception during which Peter Henshaw, chairman of the English twinning committee, and Chantal Lefèvre, his counterpart from Grainville-Langannerie, renewed the charter uniting Lapford and Grainville-Langannerie.

This visit celebrated 50 years of Twinning between the two towns.

At the welcoming ceremony Chantal Lefèvre, chairman for 42 years, retraced the history of these exchanges. "Their origins date back to September 9, 1974" she explained. Mr. Potel, then Mayor, had received a circular from Mr. Destors, vicepresident of the General Council, proposing a twinning with a town in Devon. This initiative took shape during the conference of English towns in Devon twinned with those in Calvados, which Mr. Potel attended on October 12, 1974. It resulted, in April 1975, in a merger with the village of Lapford, "chosen because of its population of around 700 inhabitants and its agricultural and commercial activities, perfectly suited to Grainville-Langannerie"; Since then, Grainvillais and often Lapfordians meet most regularly, during May Half-Term, alternating between Lapford and Grainville-Langannerie. "Over the years, the partnership has been enriched by numerous official visits, school exchanges and private meetings between families. These exchanges have strengthened the human and cultural ties between our two nations.

This four-day exchange continued the tradition: with a visit to Bird Hill (Municipal Gardens reclaimed from an ancient landfill site) and the castles of Caen and Vendeuvre; an afternoon of games; and a barbecue evening with dancing which included an old English favourite of the "Hokey Cokey".

Plus, there were other excursions to places around Caen and the D Day Beaches with our particular hosts.

We sadly had to leave on Sunday. But we hope that our French friends will come and visit us in England next year. If you feel like getting involved and are happy to host some of our French guests next year — please contact Marion Pratt marion174@btinternet.com.

Light refreshments will be provided.



LAPFORD BOOK CLUB Glorious Exploits by Ferdio Lennon

This story is set in Syracuse in 412 BC. Following a defeat in the Pelopennesian war, Athenian prisoners are being kept in

an old quarry. Two out-of-work potters, Lampo and Gelon, who love the theatre, entertain themselves by rewarding prisoners who can recite lines of Euripedes with extra wine and scraps of food. They have an idea to stage two plays by Euripedes, using the prisoners who can act and recite the best, for an audience of locals.



The tale is told by Lampo, who is something of a waster and not trustworthy, while his friend Gelon is

often sad as his wife and baby son have been killed, and the contrast between their personalities is obvious though their friendship is solid.

The first part of the book, with descriptions of the market, the theatrical workshop where the costumes are made, and the horrors of the conditions in the quarry are vivid and often entertaining. However the story gets darker towards the end of the book and the finale is unexpected and sad.

I think I was the only one to read to the end, so not a popular choice, even though the book was highly praised in reviews.

VOLUNTEERING AS A CAREER MOVE

Whether you are looking for your first job or you are a pensioner seeking to top up your income, finding a job can be really challenging.



Undertaking unpaid work can be a good way to plug gaps in your CV and get a taste for different types of jobs. These roles usually come in the form of volunteering, work experience, or internships. If you are in receipt of welfare benefits you will need to check to see if your benefits will be affected if you take on unpaid work. How volunteering affects your benefits overview - Citizens Advice

Rules around unpaid internships are complicated, so get advice on being paid less than the minimum wage before applying.

Volunteer roles are usually well defined, exposing you to specific types of work whether you are looking for office experience or something more practical like supporting people in your local community. Volunteering is also a great way to build confidence in a work environment, provide structure to your day or week and learn new skills which may be transferable to paid work. It also gives you the opportunity to brush up existing skills, like typing and general computer skills.

Citizens Advice Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon always welcomes volunteers who all get comprehensive training and ongoing support. Not all volunteers want to be advice giving; some will fill in forms which, to the uninitiated, can seem very daunting at first sight. Some volunteers take on administrative roles and the beauty of volunteering with CA TNMWD, is that there are opportunities to apply for paid positions within the charity so if you are ultimately looking for paid work, volunteering with us can be a useful stepping stone. Even if you don't end up working in a paid position with us, when applying for jobs elsewhere, as a volunteer you are demonstrating a commitment to utilising your time effectively, a willingness to undergo training and perhaps develop new skills and whether this is going to be your first paid job or you have retired and been out of the working environment for some time, as a volunteer, you will have been used to being in a work environment so should adapt easily. So aside from the knowledge that you are making a valuable contribution to the wellbeing of your local community, there are other benefits too!

Lapford Weather May 2025

Mild and dry.

The warmest day was the 1^{st} with a maximum of 23.7°C and the coolest was the 5^{th} with a maximum of 13.7°C. The coldest night was the 6^{th} with a minimum of 1.5°C and a grass frost of -3.0°C.


Another mainly dry month with just a handful of wetter days towards the end gave a total rainfall of 26.1 mm, less than half the average for May. The wettest day was the 27th with 9.1 mm.

The windiest day was the 27th with a gust of 38 m.p.h.

This has not surprisingly been the warmest spring for a very long time considering the record breaking amount of sunshine we have had, but not the driest by any means. Total rainfall was 124.1mm, well above the driest spring back in 2011 when I measured just 64.2mm.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Main points from the meeting 10th June 2025. The minutes in full can be accessed on the Parish Council website.

Five parish councillors and three members of the public attended the meeting.

- The Council currently has three vacancies and is looking for suitable candidates to co-opt onto the Council.
- The Council will have a table at the Revel on Saturday afternoon where Councillors will be available to chat to or post any suggestions from members of the public.
- The toddlers' play equipment is now open and available to use; there will be an official opening on the 28th June.
- Application for S106 finding has been submitted for additional youth play equipment.
- The Asset Register has been updated and approved.
- The future of the village market was discussed and requires new and fresh ideas to secure its future.
- A grant application has been received to support the Playing Field Trust with its insurance for the coming year.
- Lapford School is to be renamed as it becomes a Church of England school, the confirmed name is yet to be decided.

Date of the next meeting is 8th July.



Thank you so much to the volunteer who has kindly cleared weeds from the top of Orchard Way, and to others who have tidied away weeds from outside their houses. If more of us could find the time to scrape away the weeds from the paths and kerbs around where we live how much better the village would look. LADIES TAKE A LOOK BACK IN TIME

For our meeting in May, we were lucky to have our very own local historian to regale us with stories from the past. We asked David if he could concentrate on female characters who had connections with Lapford and had managed to get a mention in the history pages. The task proved quite a challenge. In the past, we of the fairer sex were expected to be obedient and show the qualities of humility and purity, quietly supporting our menfolk while they made history.



David set about digging and managed to find a few characters worth a mention. He took us back to the 11th century and the first Queen of England, Matilda, wife of William the Conqueror. As William was kept quite busy quashing rebellions in the north and keeping an eye on affairs in Normandy, Matilda, a spirited and politically astute lady, had some significance as a ruler in his absence. Her connection with Lapford is that she owned it having acquired it from a former lover. Matilda was not above holding a grudge and she had this lover imprisoned and eventually killed after which she took over his property. His portfolio included Lapford. Matilda and her proxy rulers had masses of trees cut down to clear land for farming. Good farmland was an important asset. It is likely that much of the landscape around Lapford and its importance as a farming community was shaped at this time.

Another wife who was connected through her marriage to a well-known episode from history was Thomasine Arundell, a Lapford resident. Her first husband was Roger Grenville who met his death when his ship sank to the bottom of the sea. After many years of work, the ship was finally brought to the surface in 1982. And the ship? Yes, the Mary Rose. Thomasine's son, Richard, also exerted some influence on the way history unfolded. He planned circumnavigational routes around the world and his work probably contributed to the success of later explorers although this largely went unacknowledged.

These ladies made it into history mainly because of their menfolk. Not so Anne Dowriche. A pious and devout woman married to the Rector of Lapford in 1580, Anne made her name by writing the first text that can be directly attributed to a Devon woman. Her work, the French Historie was a 2400 line poem largely about the St. Bartholomew massacre of protestants in France and is said to be the first example in women's literature of a powerfully drawn dramatic female character. Apparently, it is a particularly gory and gruesome fictionalised account of the massacre and many have wondered how a quietly living rector's wife from a Devon village came to produce such a work.

David toured on through the ages. He mentioned Janet Jarrett who lived in Lapford with her husband George in the late 1880s and who campaigned with him to create the 'Party of the Poor' and improve their conditions. They were perhaps the first socialists and she was certainly at least as active as her husband. We heard about the claim that Edith Patten of Calves Bridge put a spell on Mrs. Ford after her husband sued Edith for not paying him for his goods. We learned that Harriet, daughter of the station master here in Lapford, moved to Gloucester with her husband where, after his death, she became the only female editor in the county. Naturally, we covered the extraordinary story of the life of Mary Ann Partridge who may or may not have poisoned her husband, brother and sister with only her sister surviving, and who went on to live a prosperous life in Australia.

David kept us all entertained and he finished by reminding us that each of us can contribute to history. He encouraged us to record names and dates on photographs and articles and to record our own memories of interesting escapades or simply of life in Lapford for future generations. Hopefully, in the future, it will not be so difficult to find examples of women who have earned a place in the archives.

DEVON SWIFT PROJECT

I was interested to read the article about a talk by Sustainable Crediton, in the June Lapford Lookout, about helping swifts and other birds. It may interest you to know that there is an organisation already active all over the county helping to do just this. It is the Devon Swift Project, and here in Lapford some swift boxes have recently been installed up the church tower, just inside the louvres where the bells are located.

The following is taken from the website: (www.devonswiftproject.co.uk)

'The main aim of the Devon Swift Project is to increase the population of common swifts in Devon and beyond.

Swift numbers have decreased by up to 60% over the past 20 years with 40% of that loss occurring in the last 10 years. The main reasons are our construction methods, and land management. Fortunately, for a little effort we can make a difference to help these amazing birds! A special thank you to Devon Birds who have supported the project, in particular, sponsorship of the Church installations.

The main aim is to increase the population of swifts in Devon and beyond. This can be achieved across a range of activities. Often, when we see statistics on population declines in species, we feel that it's beyond our capability to help.

Helping swifts is as simple as putting up a swift box, or sowing wildflower seeds to help with flying invertebrates (swift food!). This can be scaled up; volunteer groups, scout groups, etc. can make a bunch of boxes to install. You can also speak to your local council to find out which patches of ground are available to be managed for wildflowers. It's amazing what can be achieved when we work together!

The objectives of the Project are:

To install colony boxes in churches throughout Devon and beyond. This is a great way to provide nesting for this colony species within a structure which is protected from development. We have installed in a selection of churches in Devon and the project has been accepted by some wonderful people within the church community; so a big thanks to you all!

To provide people and communities with the information, designs, and assistance with setting up their own installations or swift project. Many village and town communities across the UK have done this already. Imagine looking up to the skies in the summer to see swifts zooming around and thinking, I've helped that!

To create awareness of the other factors which affect swift populations. Swifts feed only on flying invertebrates and modern land management practices has reduced these species by approximately 60% in the past 20 years in the UK; recognise that number?, yep, it's the same as the percentage of swift population decline. Changing our mindset on how we manage land and our gardens to incorporate habitat that encourages invertebrates will definitely help swifts.'

It may take a year or two before swifts locate and start using the new nest boxes, surveys will be taking place through the summer to monitor the results.






One is on the outside of The Orchard Centre in Orchard Way
