Lapford Weather Review

Lapford Weather June 2025

Warmer and wetter than average.

The warmest day was the 30th with a maximum air temperature of 27.1°C. The coolest was the 7th when it only achieved 14.0°C. The coolest night was on the 8th with a minimum of 7.0°C. The grass temperature fell to 0.9°C. The first two weeks of the month were at or below the average for June, the following two weeks were above average, particularly at night when it remained quite warm at times.

Total rainfall was 127.6 mm, more than twice the average largely thanks to a couple of very wet days mid-month. The

12th gave 31.5 mm, and the 13th saw a fall of 58.1 mm, the wettest day I have recorded since I began here in Lapford in 1987.

The windiest day was the 26th with a gust of 30 m.p.h.

Some chapters are sad, some are happy, and some are exciting, but if we never turn the page, we will never know what the next chapter holds.

THOUGHTS FROM THE ARK

Try to picture this, you are in a restaurant with someone who's meal costs £15 and you're watching them struggle over the tip. they have £2 left over, and they know



that a 10 per cent tip is considered the very minimum. They waste five minutes getting change for that second pound so they can leave a £1.50 tip rather than leave a little extra. What would have happened if they had left the full £2. They may have made the waiter or waitress's day. Fifty pence may not seem much, the message that goes along with it can make the world of difference to someone, especially if they are having a rough day. It says "Thank you, you did a good job, I appreciate you, you are valuable." Maybe the message gets lost – your server just sweeps up the coins without counting – but God blesses you for doing it, anyway. "Whoever sows generously, will also reap generously." 2 Corinthians 9: 6. Think about it; you can increase the happiness of others and bless yourself with the mere change in your pocket.

This is just one tiny example of the many ways in which the small things we do can have surprisingly big repercussions. Simple acts of random kindness set the tone for your day. Going the extra mile – whether it's a slightly larger tip or an unexpected compliment or gift – costs very little and gets you a lot. And here is an important thought; we can have mountain-moving faith, understand and explain all the deep doctrines of the Bible, and get top marks for personal holiness, yet God's word says that without love we are nothing. Taken from UCB's Word for Today. This has been the ARK's mantra ever since it was opened in July 2015 – "simple acts of random kindness". We have tried to do this as often as we could, supporting the community whenever possible.

It will be all change at the ARK over the summer, that's why we are closing the Cafe and Foodbank for August. Our last day will be 1st August. It's not a complete make over but there is a need for some painting and cleaning to be done, there are things that need replacing, some items need to be thrown away, a good clear out is always positive. I'm hanging up my apron at the end of August and something new will be put in its place. It's an opportunity to review how the ARK and Foodbank have been functioning and to look to the future. Change can bring fresh ideas and a different perspective.

The ARK will open again Tuesday 6th September. In July The ARK will have been open 10 years, so we have decided to celebrate this by holding a Mad Hatter's Tea Party on Saturday 13th September, 2 — 5pm. We will have the Copplestone Choir, the Hatherleigh Silver Band, providing music, a celebratory peal by Lapford bell ringers, not just a cream tea but an afternoon tea, and a parade of hats, with prizes for the best hats. Nearer the time there will be more details. We'd love for to you to join us and help us celebrate.

District Councillor Steve Keable described the process behind the twenty-thousand-pound project using 106 funding, topped up by the Parish Council.


Following the cutting of the ribbon and applause ceremonial bubbles were blown. The children needed no invitation to make use of the new facility.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES MEETING HELD ON 8TH JULY 2025

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest.

Five Parish Councillors, five three members of the public, and one invited guest attended the meeting.

- Mrs. Sarah Healey from Chulmleigh Academy Trust attended the meeting and explained the reasons for the proposal to change the name of the village primary school. The Council agreed to support the choice of "St. Thomas Church of England Primary School, Lapford".
- A quote for the repair of the fence posts at the footpath in Park Meadow Close was accepted.
- Councillors are to attend training on 28th July 2025.
- It was agreed to push for enforcement action at Eastmere Farm.
- The concrete storage bin on land near the A377 will be removed as it was being used as a refuse bin which encouraged rats.
- The Toddlers' Play Area was officially opened on 28th June to a good reception.
- Work will continue on securing play facilities for the Playing Field but this has been delayed due to the Clerk's illness.
- Work continues to refurbish the toilets in the Orchard Centre.
- Outstanding highways matters are to be followed up as soon as possible.
- The flower bed at the top of the village has now been planted.
- The Council agreed to support two local planning applications.
- It is hoped to appoint a temporary Clerk to cover the Clerk's period of illness.
- Letters are to be written regarding weeds and overgrown hedges.

The next meeting will be held on 12th August at 7.30pm in the Orchard Centre.

BEWARE PARCEL SCAMS!

Parcel delivery scams are becoming increasingly common and harder to spot. Ones involving texts and emails



are known as phishing scams and aim to trick you into giving away your personal information and financial details so your bank account and money can be accessed.

One way scammers do this is by enticing people to click on links which can lead to fake websites in the hope that this information will be entered. While scammers can pretend to be from any parcel delivery company, may choose Royal Mail because it's the largest delivery company in the UK so the chances of scammers contacting someone who receives parcels from Royal Mail is higher.

These scams can be in the form of a text, an email or a phone call. There are also reports of 'Something for You' cards which Royal Mail leave when a delivery is attempted but there is nobody at home.

Here are some tips to help you stay vigilant and spot the signs of a parcel delivery scam:

- If you're waiting for a parcel and get a message that asks you to pay to get it, or reschedule the delivery, it's usually a scam.
- Don't click any links or attachments in the text or email.
 Delivery companies won't ask you to pay them this way.
- Scammers often pretend to be from an organisation like Royal Mail and try to get you to click on a fake version of the genuine website.
- To check if a link is genuine, hover your mouse over the link without clicking on it, or press and hold on the link on a mobile device. You should then see the address the link goes to.
- Check the address carefully; many fake addresses can at first sight appear to be the real thing
- Beware of spelling or grammar errors or generalised greetings rather than your name
- Don't feel pressured to act; you can always contact the genuine company directly and ask if they have been trying to contact you.




