BUTT?!

So where does the term 'butt' come from? The term "butt" originally referred to a medieval measurement for the capacity of wine casks, which was standardised in the year 1707.

Among these measurements, the largest was the tun (distinct from the weight measurement, ton), approximately equal to 252 wine gallons (953.92 liters).

From the tun, other units were derived. A butt represented half of a tun, while a puncheon equalled a third of a tun.

A hogshead was defined as a quarter of a tun, and interestingly, two hogsheads together constituted a butt, with each holding 63 gallons (238.48 litres). Following these were smaller units: the tierce, the barrel, and the rundlet, each progressively smaller in size.





THE PARK HOUSE - A NEW VENUE IN THE HEART OF CREDITON. WHAT DO YOU THINK?

The Crediton Heart Project has some exciting plans to develop a community arts venue on the edge of Newcombes Meadow and we want to know what you think. The Park House would include a flexible performance space, with seating for 300, rooms for other community activities and a beautiful café opening onto the park. It would provide a welcoming and inclusive place to meet, learn and create together in the heart of our town



Built on the site of the dilapidated Union Road toilet block, between the War Memorial and Bike Shed, the Park House could offer amazing opportunities for local and national performance groups and bring many more events to our area, including theatre, cinema, dance, comedy and live music. It would transform our park and regenerate our town centre.

Crediton and its surrounding villages are important and vibrant communities in Mid Devon. But Crediton is expanding and to avoid it becoming a dormitory town for Exeter, we need to provide the spaces and facilities to ensure that people can choose to spend their leisure time locally and that our community continues to thrive.

The project is being led by the Crediton Heart Project, with support from Crediton Town Council and Mid Devon District Council. The Heart Project is a volunteer led charity, set up in 2018 with the key aim of developing a new community venue. Since then we have been exploring possible sites and running a range of successful projects such as the Crediton Heart Project community website, an annual Summer Arts Festival and, most recently, the Kick Start Art project for children.

Last year the Newcombes Meadow site became available so we commissioned a feasibility study by award winning theatre designers, Foster Wilson Size. They concluded the site could accommodate a 300-seat professionally equipped theatre suitable for a wide range of performances and events. The Park House hasn't been designed yet, but this is a computer generated image of what it could look like



This is a hugely ambitious project with the potential to benefit everyone in our community. But before we take the next steps we need to know what people in the town and



surrounding villages think. We would be very grateful if you could share your views by completing a short online survey available via this QR code or our website www.creditonheartproject.org Paper copies of this survey are also available at Crediton Library and Crediton Town Council. Thank you.

Lapford Weather July 2025

Another milder than average month. On the dry side.

The warmest day was the 11^{th} with a maximum of 31.2° C, this came during a 4 day heat wave. This was the warmest day since 12^{th} August 2022. The coolest was the 6^{th} with a maximum of 17.6° C. The coolest night was on the 3^{rd} with a minimum of 7.8° C.

Total rainfall was 27.3 mm, less than half the July average. The wettest day was the $21^{\rm st}$ with 9.7 mm.

The windiest day was the 15th with a gust of 38 mph.

LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES MEETING HELD ON 12TH AUGUST 2025

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest.

Six Parish Councillors and four members of the public attended the meeting.

- The Council was updated on the situation regarding the recent burst sewerage pipe at Lapford Mill.
- The new Toddlers' Play Area is well used.
- Progress with the Telephone kiosk and the Orchard Centre is ongoing.
- Planning enforcement matters were discussed.
- Council considered the possibility of brown Tourism signs for the A377.
- The yellow post box is to be refurbished.
- Members of the public are encouraged to help themselves to fruit from the crab apple planted in memory of Sybil Williams.
- The concrete storage bin on land by the A377 is to be removed shortly.
- The S.106 application for funds towards equipment on the main playing field has been submitted to Mid Devon District Council.
- It was agreed to trial a vinegar based weedkiller. MDDC no longer clears weeds.
- There is to be a Village Tidy Up Day on 20th September.
 A list of potential jobs to be compiled at the next meeting.
- It was agreed to support LYPFT with a grant of £336.27 to cover its insurance premium.
- The new name for Lapford Primary School will be "St. Thomas of Canterbury CE Primary School, Lapford."
- Two fuchsias stolen from the flower bed will be replaced.
- Councillors agreed to support an application for an agricultural building at Great Hole.
- The Clerk hopes to be back doing some paperwork shortly and will start with bringing the Council's financial affairs up to date.
- All Councillors and members of the Neighbourhood Plan group to be aware of a Planning Training Presentation from MDDC.
- The bench in memory of Karen Burrows is to be moved to the playing field.
- The hedge by the river and railway bridges has been cut by the Quick family. Thank you
- The Council would like to revisit the idea of a logo and will discuss guidance for this at their next meeting.
- The water leak at Kelland Hill has now been repaired.
- The Clerk will be asked to follow up outstanding highways matters as soon as possible.

The next meeting will be held on 9th September at 7.30pm in the Orchard Centre.






LAPFORD BOOK CLUB

Out of Bounds by Val McDermid

Out of bounds means beyond the remit of Detective Chief Inspector Karen Pirie of Police Scotland's Historic Cases Unit. Set in Edinburgh her investigation into an historic case involves the brutal murder of a young hairdresser and

becomes entangled with another officer's current case of four joy-riding teenagers and the death of three of them. Two more threads are picked up as relevant by Karen and her less than switched-on assistant Jason and concern a current investigation into the apparent suicide of Gabriel – a bit of an eccentric loner, and the supposed IRA bombing of a light aircraft twenty years earlier.



The threads are complex enough in themselves without DCI Pirie's personal problems and her not altogether cordial relations with Police colleagues who value neither her meddling in their cases, her methods, thoroughness or insatiable curiosity.

A thoroughly enjoyable, fast-paced, beautifully written and researched story. Highly recommended particularly for the complexity of the plot intertwined with family and professional relationships which play out over two decades.

I am delighted to announce that the change of status for Lapford Community Primary School has today been confirmed by the DfE.

From September 2025, the school will become a Church of England primary school. Given that this is now confirmed, the school will also change its name.

Thank you to everyone who responded to the recent consultation on the change of name. Responses to the comments are included below.

The Directors of Chulmleigh Academy Trust, and senior leaders carefully considered the responses. What we found particularly interesting was the history surrounding the Anglican church- as outlined by local historians at a recent parish-council meeting.

Having taken this into account, directors have therefore agreed that the school will become: 'St Thomas of Canterbury CE Primary School, Lapford'

Next year, there will be an official re-opening of the school. More details will follow in the autumn.

Thank you again for your support during this historic moment in time for the school and the village.

Responses to consultation feedback:

Consultation not wide enough

People immediately connected with Lapford and the school were consulted: staff, parents, children, the community, including the Parish council, Lapford's three churches, Devon County Council and Exeter Diocese.

It was felt there was no need to consult more widely as the views of the Lapford pupils, parents, staff and village community were the most important.

Not received consultation information

This information was sent out via emails, as is the usual method of communicating.

No need to change name- school and village are wonderful

Agree with this, but currently pupil numbers are too low. From September, only 41 pupils are on roll from Reception to Year 6. If the school was full, there would be 105 children enrolled. Primary pupil numbers are low nationally. Local residents appreciate what a great school it is, but to attract more children, the net needs to be cast further afield. A large rebrand with national press coverage will draw attention to the school and hopefully attract families considering a relocation to this hidden gem. The present low pupil numbers do not make the current class or staffing structure sustainable in the long term.

Cost to parents because of rebranding

There will be no cost to parents.

St Martha not a 'local' saint

Agree with this. Martha was a suggestion. The fascinating history surrounding Thomas Becket and Lapford was hitherto unknown to the trust and to the school. We are delighted that by consulting on a name we have found this out. We agree it makes more sense to adopt a saint who continues to engage local pride.

The Trust makes some financial gain by this process

There is no financial benefit to doing this unless pupil numbers increase. The more pupils, the more funding. Increased funding because of more pupils, goes directly to the school.

Church schools receive more money

Not true. Pupil funding is the same for all schools irrespective of whether they are a church school or not.

Use of social media

Negative comments on social media and in the local press are not helpful to the school. If parents/grandparents/carers wish to support the school, then we need as much positivity as possible. If parents/grandparents/carers have concerns about the school or trust going forward, please contact the school or trust directly.


