LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES MEETING HELD ON 9TH SEPTEMBER 2025

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest.

Five Parish Councillors, the District and County Councillor, and five members of the public attended the meeting.

- The bin in the Orchard Centre has been broken and is to be replaced with a metal wall mounted bin. A new commercial wall mounted toilet roll holder will also be purchased.
- The Council is to consider the possibility of a reduced speed limit of 20mph at a future meeting.
- Work on the telephone kiosk and the Orchard Centre is ongoing.
- Planning enforcement matters were discussed.
- HOLD and the Victory Hall Committee are to seek renewal of the planning permission for the two storage containers.
- The chestnut tree has now been felled and the trunk removed to Lapford Primary School.
- Good progress is being made with the S.106 application for funds towards equipment on the main playing field.
- Ownership of the land outside the Orchard Centre is being checked.
- Reports were received of flooding at the bottom of Orchard Way and Highfield.
- The Council now has a complete copy of SWW drawings for the village.
- Arrangements were agreed for the Village Tidy-Up Day on 20th September.
- Councillors agreed to support an application for a dung store at Rudge Rew.
- Detailed up to date bank reconciliation and receipts and payments schedules were presented and agreed.
- The Clerk is making good progress and hopes to be able to attend the October meeting.
- A clay tile presented by our French friends is to be hung in the Orchard Centre.
- There will be an update on railway matters at the next meeting.
- The next meeting will be held at the Orchard Centre at 7.30pm on 14th October 2025.





DEVON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION


"Devon Community Foundation (DCF) has adopted a new approach to distributing grants. The foundation has an extensive database of community groups and charities and will use this to identify those that fit



the funds that are available at any time. DCF will then invite relevant organisations to submit an application.

If you have submitted an application to Devon Community Foundation since 1 January 2023, successful or not, you will already be on their list and will be considered for all funding on a rolling basis.

If you haven't applied to DCF before, you can register with them via their 'Getting to Know You' form to be considered for funding."





Lapford Weather August 2025

Warmer and drier than average.

The hottest day was the 12^{th} with a maximum of 30.8° C and the coolest was the 29^{th} with a maximum of 18.1° C. The coolest night was on the 22^{nd} with a minimum of 7.2° C. On the 2^{nd} the grass temperature fell to just 1.1° C.


Total rainfall was 30.7 mm most of which fell in the last week of the month. The wettest day was the 28th with 16.9mm of rain

The windiest day was the 4th with a gust of 38 mph.

This summer was warmer than average but not the hottest on record as 2018 was warmer here. 1989 was the same as this year. Total rainfall was 185.6mm, only a little drier than average, although most of this fell in


a few days in July. The rest of the summer was rather lacking in useful rain.

LAPFORD VICTORY HALL UPDATE

Further improvements have recently been made with the removal of the old unused cupboards in the Small Room. This opens up the room to make it a more useful and usable space particularly for the Youth Club as a relaxing area. The



room is also currently being redecorated and further work will eventually see the unsightly electric meters boxed in. Long term it is planned to replace the old central heating boiler with a combi-boiler to heat the hot water as well as the radiators. A new safer entrance has also been planned opening directly on to Lower Town Place. This will all cost a lot of money, so further fund raising is planned with a Table Top sale, a Quiz in October and possibly a Christmas bingo. Grant applications will continue to be made (so far we have been unsuccessful with these).

We need the village's support as much as possible to keep this community building running. We think the current prices are very competitive compared with other Halls in the area. The price list is attached, as you can see the prices have been maintained at the same level for a couple of years now, although this will be reviewed before the end of the year. The more the Hall is used the better.

HIRE CHARGES

Main Hall (or Small Room)

£7 per hour (or part hour), minimum charge is for 2 hours, i.e. £14. For local village organisations there will be a 15% discount on these charges. (Equates to £6 per hour)

Kitchen:

£8 for a catering event, i.e. use of oven, crockery, cutlery etc. For use only of tea/coffee making equipment there will be no charge.

All day bookings (up to 6p.m.): £60 - After 6p.m. usual hourly rate applies.

Hire of outside space on Lower Town Place:

(only if exclusive use is required) Children's event: £10 per session Adult Event: £20 per session.

(A charge for the use of the Victory Hall at the usual hire rate will also apply to allow use of toilets and other facilities)

Sundry items borrowed from Hall: (for use away from the Hall)

Long tables: £5 each
Short tables: £3 each
Card tables: £2 each
Chairs: 50p each

Water heater: £6

Crockery & cutlery: 10p per item.

£70 deposit (returnable) required for private parties, etc.

"A STITCH IN TIME SAVES NINE"



When people come to us for our help, they are often at Mid & West Devon crisis point. One problem has multiplied itself into lots of problems and the end result is

that people feel totally overwhelmed, exhausted and, very often, fearful. The simple message this month is don't let it get to that stage before you come to us for help.

Everyone is affected to some degree by the cost of living crisis. Everyone has seen their every day bills increase and gloomy predictions about the autumn budget suggest it is going to get worse, not better. We can help people before potential problems escalate. For example, our specially trained energy team can advise on strategies to conserve energy and help keep costs down. If you are concerned about potential debt issues, our debt team can help you structure a manageable budget, prioritise your payments and advise you as to whether you are likely to be able to negotiate reduced bills for some utilities. We can also run a benefits check to see if you are entitled to claim any benefits, even if you are working.

If you are worried about what the winter might hold for you, just take a few minutes to browse our website and see if it provides some food for thought. It will cost you nothing but potentially, it could help you nip a potential problem in the

Increasingly, more and more people are coming to us for help - more than we are able to deal with. We are constantly working to make it easier for people to find their own solutions to problems by providing information and links on our website and sometimes signposting to other more specialised organisations. Our volunteers, however, are crucial to enabling us to help people face to face, on the telephone or via video appointments. If you would be interested in becoming a trained volunteer with us, there is information on our website or you can contact recruitment@citizensadvicetnmwd.org.uk. Our volunteers receive ongoing training and support and will tell you that for them, volunteering provides an opportunity to make new friends, gives them new skills and the satisfaction of being able to help people in our local community.

RIP CHESTNUT TREE

Following on from the article in the June Lapford Lookout we can now report that the tree has been safely felled and donated to the school for the children to use — a really lovely end use for it. Thank you Sam for the transport.



As Trustees we have worked hard over many years to give the tree as long a life as possible whilst bearing public safety in mind.

The Trustees' minutes of August 2007 record concern about it, and in 2008 that although the tree was stable further problems might result in it having to be felled. (It had already been pollarded for safety

reasons some time before that). More recent professional surveys indicated that the tree was at the end of its life, the failure of it to come into leaf last year confirmed this. It had been suffering from a fungal disease for some time as evidenced by the bark completely peeling away from the trunk meaning that no nutrients could pass from the roots to the branches, therefore no leaves. The trunk had already started to decay as can been seen in the stump remaining in the ground.

The tree surgeon estimated the tree to have been more than 100 years old, so it had seen a lot of Lapford history.

LAPFORD BOOK CLUB - BOOK REVIEW - The Locked Room by Elly Griffiths

Our hero — Ruth Galloway is an archaeologist. Three years after her mother's death, Ruth is finally sorting through her things when she finds a curious a decades-old photograph of her own Norfolk cottage— before—she lived there—with a peculiar inscription on the back. Ruth returns to the cottage to uncover its meaning as Norfolk's first cases of Covid-19 make headlines leaving her and Kate to shelter in place there. They struggle to stave off isolation by clapping for frontline workers each evening and befriending a kind neighbour, Zoe, from a distance.

Meanwhile, DCI Nelson is investigating a series of deaths of women that may or may not be suicide. When he links a case to an archaeological discovery, he breaks curfew to visit Ruth and enlist her help. But the further Nelson investigates the deaths, the closer he gets to Ruth's isolated cottage—until Ruth, Zoe, and Kate all go missing, and

Nelson is left scrambling to find them before it's too late.

Covid dictated so much of what happened in the story. It might feel as though we had largely stood still for two years but it was quite startling to be reminded of how it really was in those first few, frightening months. The virus comes perilously close to home.

It's an excellent read on so many levels and I didn't spot the ending until it was in front of me. All the members of the book club thoroughly enjoyed it.
