ST THOMAS OF CANTERBURY CE PRIMARY SCHOOL, LAPFORD



On Friday 9th January 2026, the school community gathered to celebrate an important milestone as Lapford Primary School officially became St Thomas of Canterbury Church of England Primary School, marking its place within the Diocese of Exeter family of schools.

The day began with a special celebration at St Thomas of Canterbury Church, Lapford, led by Rev. Jeremy Putnam, where pupils, staff, families, and members of the local community came together to reflect on the significance of this new chapter. The atmosphere was joyful and inclusive, with pupils playing a central role throughout the celebrations.



A small-scale effigy of Thomas Becket led the procession back to the school. For many years, the local Lapford Revel festival has begun with a procession featuring a giant model of Thomas Becket, carried from the school to the church. Our small effigy was a heartfelt tribute to this cherished village tradition, connecting the past with the future.



After returning to the school, the ribbon-cutting ceremony was performed by the Bishop of Crediton, the Rt. Revd. Moira Astin, who officially marked the occasion by blessing our school and its new name. The Bishop's address was a warm reminder of the community's value within the Church family, with her prayers for the school's future.

Following the ribbon cutting, all guests were invited into the school hall to thaw out with hot chocolate! Here, the children performed a new school song, composed collaboratively by Herons class, to reflect the school's new vision and core values—love, bravery, community, curiosity, and



resilience. The song was performed with great energy and pride, a true testament to the creativity and spirit of the pupils.

In the afternoon, we welcomed guests from the local community, as well as directors from the Trust and previous Head Teachers of the school, to a special presentation about the significance of the school's name change. Mrs Healey shared the inspiring journey that led the school to become a Church of England school, reflecting on the values and commitments that guided the transformation. Mr Payne expressed his heartfelt gratitude to all those involved in the process, acknowledging the hard work and collaboration that made the day possible.



A special historical display was curated by the Lapford Village Archive group, showcasing the rich history of the school and its connection to the community over the years. Refreshments were kindly provided by The ARK, ensuring that guests were well looked after throughout the afternoon.

Children from both Herons and Kingfishers also spoke confidently about why the school was special to them, sharing personal reflections on their experiences. Some of the children demonstrated their newly created prayer pebbles, placing them into a special bowl crafted by Rev. Caroline Ralph.

The children looked incredibly smart in their new school uniforms, and their pride in the occasion was evident. The day was filled with joy, reflection, and excitement as the school community came together to celebrate this new chapter.

WINTER HAZARDS

As the recent stormy weather has shown it always pays to be prepared for winter weather. Here are some thoughts from the Met Office:

We are so reliant on the internet, but if a storm meant power and mobile phone networks were affected, what would you do? Consider a separate battery charger, and you could store key information such as the power cut helpline number (105) on your phone.

Cold weather can be a risk to your health, particularly if you are over 65 or have health conditions. Ideally your home (and those of elderly relatives and neighbours) should be heated to at least 18°C. During cold spells, keep your windows closed at night as this can cause a real drop in the temperature indoors.

In windy weather surprising things can become dangerous. Trees or branches can come down; cast iron guttering could be lethal and so can roof slates. Garden furniture and even children's toys and trampolines can fly around causing damage and potential harm and fences can become problems too. Check and secure is the way forward.

Insulating pipes has two benefits – you'll keep the heat in, saving you money, but it also means reduced risk of frozen pipes which can burst. It's also important to know where your stop tap (also called stopcock or stop valve) is and to check it regularly to make sure it is working.

Make sure you have basic supplies in stock in case your power and water are disrupted. It's worth putting together a 'grab bag' with bottled water, medicines, a torch, radio and batteries, copies of important documents and a change of clothes in case you have to leave home quickly.

Checking your car is ready for winter is important. Take a quick check of your tyres. It's dangerous and illegal to drive in winter conditions with low levels of tread on your vehicle's tyres. Have an emergency kit with you if driving far, water, blanket, emergency food, torch.

Winter weather coincides with the flu season and flu can affect people in different ways. The annual flu vaccination is offered free to people who are most at risk from the effects of flu.

 **Lapford Weather Review**

Lapford Weather December 2025

Milder than average, rainfall about the normal amount for December.

The mildest day was the 7th with a maximum of 14.3°C and the coolest was the 26th with 3.6°C. The coldest night was on the 31st with a minimum of -4.9°C and a severe grass frost of -10.2°C.

The first 3 weeks of the month were predominantly mild and wet, the final 10 days cold and dry.


The wettest day was the 15th with 16.4 mm rain. Total rainfall for the month was 115.1 mm.

The windiest day was the 9th with a gust of 41 mph.

The year 2025 was milder than the average (compared with the 30 year period 1991-2020), by just under one degree. It was also a slightly wetter than average year. Here at least, it was not the warmest year on record – that was 2023.

The warmest day of the year was the 11th July with a maximum of 31.2°C. The coldest night was the 31st December with a minimum of -4.9°C.


The wettest day was the 12th June with 58.1 mm rain, the wettest day I have recorded.

THE SEAGULL BY ANN CLEEVES



The meeting concluded with a picture gardening quiz, after which three people took home a prize pot of daffodils.

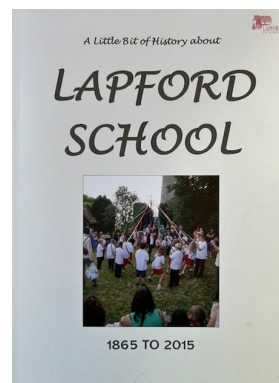

ACTIVE TRAVEL FUNDING WELCOMED

Devon County Council welcomed confirmation of over £13 million in funding from Active Travel England to support walking and cycling schemes, with delivery linked to the new Devon & Torbay Combined County Authority from April 2026.

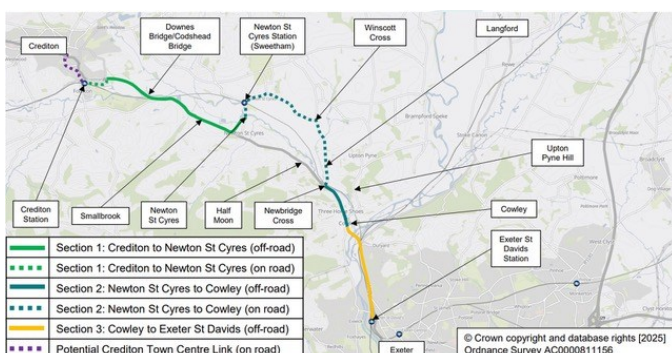
This is great news for the Boniface Trail (Crediton Exeter) which was given a green light go ahead at the January Cabinet meeting of Devon County Council. The route largely follows the A377, except for the section of trail between Newton St Cyres and Langford, where it follows a 'Quiet Lanes' route for a short section, before rejoining the A377 and then onto Exeter St David's. The Council was encouraged to make an early start on sections of the trail.

In 2024, public consultation was made on two different route - A377 or Quiet Lanes. While there was overwhelming support for the trail there was no majority support given to either option with a balanced split between both. This outcome has led to this proposal which now costed circa £15.5m (2025 prices) without any land purchase, ecology or inflation.

In April 2026 responsibility for the transport capital programme will transfer to the newly formed Devon & Torbay Combined County Authority (DTCCD). Upcoming active travel plans, such as the Boniface Trail, will make use of these funds and will form part of a capital programme report planned for the DTCCA Board meeting in March.

The purpose of the Devon Cabinet report is to endorse the preferred route and approve the start of negotiation on land acquisition. As the local Councillor I have ensured consultation with the Boniface Trail Association and Newton St Cyres Parish Council, where there is enthusiastic support.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION - MY PERSONAL VIEW

Now government has received proposals from all local councils in historic Devon, it will examine these submissions. Government will then decide which proposal/s will go to statutory stakeholders for consultation during the first half of 2026.

A final decision is expected by government next summer and shadow elections are due to be held in May 2027. The chosen new authority/authorities will take on its new powers and responsibilities from April 2028.

a) Devon County Council is proposing that it continues by absorbing the existing (9) district councils and Exeter into a **single Devon** unitary authority serving around 840,000 residents, and the existing authorities of **Plymouth** (1) and **Torbay** (1) also continue. (Aka 9:1:1).

Councillor Julian Brazil, Devon County Council Leader, said: "At the end of this process we all have to come together. Our duty is to deliver the services that our residents deserve. Within that is proper funding for local government. The fact children in Devon get less than nearly every other area in the country is grossly unfair and affects their life chances". I totally agree with this point.

There's a sense of frustration that councillors are not making the decision, I have witnessed this in both DCC and MDDC council debates. The consensus is that we are all being pushed and pulled, and forced to do this by government.

b) Seven District Councils are proposing a 5:4:1 model a bold plan for 'Reimagining Devon' with reorganisation by three unitary councils: the **north** East Devon, Mid Devon, Exeter, Torridge & North Devon (5), the **south**, South Hams, West Devon, Teignbridge and Torbay (4), and **Plymouth** (1).

My view is that there is no point in dying on the hill of Local Government Reorganisation when a government minister will decide what happens. We will be told late spring when the government formally goes to consultation. Shadow elections will be held in May 2027. This is the point when we must come together to deliver the service our residents deserve.

My view: on balance 'Reimagining Devon' is my preferred option but I recognise the Devon case for children and vulnerable people. As we wait for the Minister's decision there is work to be done.

MEETING HELD ON 13th JANUARY 2026**

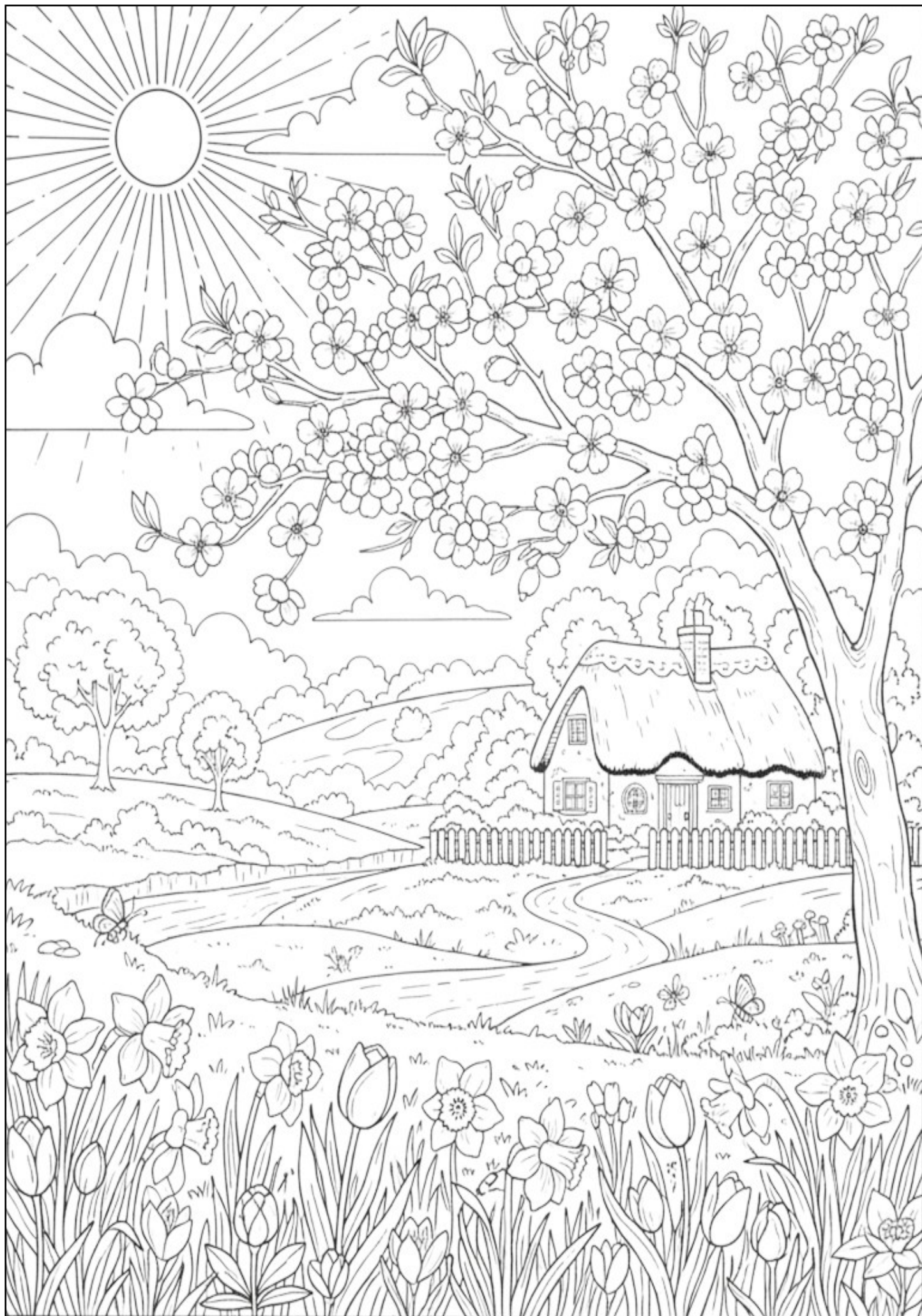

- The next Parish Council meeting to be held on February Tuesday 9th at 7-30 p.m. in the Orchard Centre.

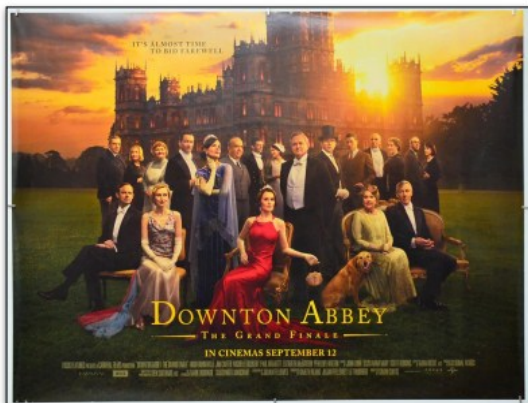
**LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES
MEETING HELD ON 16TH DECEMBER 2025**

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. Six Parish Councillors attended, plus two members of the public and the County/District Councillor.

- The dialogue with Southwest Water concerning the state of the village sewerage system and the number of raw sewage discharges into the River Yeo continued.
- Two outstanding planning enforcement matters in the parish were being pursued by MDDC.
- Problems with unruly/out of control dogs can be reported via the MDDC website.
- The Parish Council lease of the Toddlers' Play Area to be formalised and signed.
- The possibility of introducing a 20-mph speed limit in the village was felt to be impractical.
- Two new gateposts had been installed at the entrance to the footpath in Park Meadow Close. A footpath maintenance grant of £160 would be paid via DCC.
- Sadly, there had been more vandalism to the public toilet at the Orchard Centre. A padlock to be fitted to the toilet roll holder to deter theft.
- The Parish Council precept for 2026/27 was set at £33000, representing an extra cost of 69p per month for a Band D property. The amount to reflect the expected increase in the financial burden on the Council following Local Government reorganisation.
