Lapford Weather Review

Lapford Weather February 2026

Mild and wet.

The warmest day was the 24th with a maximum of 14.8 °C and the coolest was the 17th with a maximum of 5.6 °C.

The coldest night was on the 14th with a minimum of -0.6 °C in the air and -5.0°C on the grass.

This, unusually, was the only night with an air frost at the top end of Lapford. The average night time temperature was actually the highest I have recorded for February thanks to a succession of mild, cloudy and damp nights.

Total rainfall was 140.9 mm, not far off twice the average for February. The wettest day was the 15th with 15.5 mm.

The windiest day was the 20th with a gust of 41 m.p.h.

Overall this has been a mild and wet winter. Temperature approximately 1 degree above average and with a total of 441.9 mm rain, the wettest since 2014.

HEATING FUEL THEFTS

Fuel theft awareness

Considering recent events in the Middle East, and the price rises of fuel, we want to alert you of the rise in fuel thefts. These incidents primarily involve the **siphoning of heating oil** from storage tanks.

How to Protect Your Fuel

Thieves are often opportunists who target tanks visible from the road. You can significantly reduce your risk by following these steps:

Secure Your Tank: Use high-quality closed shackle padlocks (BSEN12320 Standard) on inspection caps. Consider fitting a steel cage (LPS1175 SR1) or a lockable filler cap to prevent easy access.

Install Monitoring Systems: Consider an oil level alarm or electronic gauge that triggers a notification if levels drop suddenly.

Improve Visibility: Motion-activated security lighting and visible CCTV act as strong deterrents to help gather evidence.

Be Vigilant: Stay alert for suspicious vehicles, especially large vans or tankers that seem out of place and are not local to the area.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM NORTH DEVON RAILWAY DEVELOPMENT ALLIANCE CONFERENCE

At the peak of the recent storms there were no rail services whatsoever operating across Devon, Cornwall and West Somerset. This completely overwhelmed the availability of alternative transport, both vehicles and drivers. It takes 24 buses and drivers to cover the Tarka Line alone. Buses were being sourced from as far away as Wales and Lancashire.

In order to better monitor the risk of damage to bridges Network Rail are now trialling an ultrasonic detection system on the Tarka Line which will reduce the inspection time post-flooding and enable services to restart sooner.

GWR has taken delivery of 26 Class 175 units and intends that when in service they will be as 5-car sets on peak hour trains, such as for the up to 400 passengers who use the 07.22 departure from Barnstaple - the 08.00 from Lapford – roughly doubling the number of seats available. However, the units need repairs and refurbishment which is taking longer than anticipated. It is hoped the new trains will start on the Tarka Line at the December timetable change.

In terms of producing not just longer trains but more frequent and more reliable trains, Network Rail is progressing on the following:

- Reinstating double tracking from Coleford Junction to Newton St Cyres to offer more flexibility for trains to pass.
- Reinstating a length of double tracking at Umberleigh to provide a second passing loop so that there can be two trains north of Eggesford at any one time.
- A detailed assessment of what timetabling enhancements could be possible given these infrastructure improvements.

Taken together these could enable a half-hourly service on the Tarka Line plus the option of 'fast' services from Barnstaple to Exeter with limited stops and semi-fast services able to stop at all stations – including Lapford - slotted in between. There are currently 17 trains each way Mondays to Fridays of which only a third serve Lapford.

REGISTER OF HERITAGE ASSETS

Local Heritage Assets Register

Mid Devon District Council has prepared a list of heritage assets considered to be locally important and worthy of recognition in relevant planning decisions. Locally listed assets might include traditional telephone boxes, historic village greens, war memorials, cob or stone walls, or indeed any building, monument, place or area with a locally significant heritage value that merits consideration when planning decisions are made. *Designated heritage assets such as listed buildings, conservation areas, scheduled monuments and registered parks and gardens are already recognised as heritage assets and have not been repeated on the local list. Most buildings within the 50 Conservation Areas within Mid Devon were also not included in the local list, as these buildings are already protected under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.*

The Register of Heritage Assets is a working document, and people are invited to submit further nominations for heritage assets in their area. The register is intended to be an on-going project that will expand over time. It is not an exhaustive list but a list of those things which are important to local communities.


At present the only two assets registered for Lapford are the War Memorial and Lapford Mill.

If you would like to submit any other heritage features within the parish please contact the Parish Council with the address or National Grid reference of the asset together with a brief description and any other relevant information plus a recent photograph. The Council can then collate all this information to pass on to MDDC. Note that buildings in the Conservation area will already be protected but probably not other features such as phone boxes, village pumps etc. To find out about listed buildings in the parish go to www.britishlistedbuildings.co.uk/england/lapford-mid-devon - there are 48 of them!

WE HAVE A PROBLEM!

The children of Lapford School sent a representative to the March Parish Council meeting, and it was lovely to welcome her and her mother. She presented a bundle of letters from the children on one topic—**Dog Poo!** The letters set out graphically that our children find the presence of dog poo left in the public areas of the village disgusting, unhealthy and smelly. Parish Councillors agree with them. The children gave examples of poo in the Playing Field, on Lower Town Place and on the routes they use to walk to school as examples. We all know where these places are.

The Playing Field has a **no dogs** policy, so poo in that area just should not be a problem. Lower Town Place allows dog walking on the strict understanding that dogs will be kept on a lead and all poo cleared up by their walkers. As for the walkways and pavements in the village dogs should be kept on leads.

Dogs on leads cannot pooh without their walkers noticing, and all poo should be picked up and disposed of sensibly. This means bagging securely and either taking the result home to dispose of in black bag rubbish, or placing in a special dog bin or rubbish bin in the village, and there are plenty of those. **Any Bin Will Do!** (except grit bins of course).

Dog poo can cause huge problems for those coming into contact with it through contaminated shoes for instance. Apart from being smelly and unpleasant to deal with it can cause nasty stomach infections, roundworm infestations and lead to blindness. Young children are particularly vulnerable as their immune systems are not fully developed.

Please do not let your dog run around any public space off the lead or on its own. Do not let it out at night to do its business when you think no-one will notice – they will. And **Pick up After Your Dog** for everyone's sake.





LAPFORD BOOK CLUB - BOOK REVIEW

The Muse by Jessie Burton

We are first introduced to Odelle Bastien, who moves to London from Trinidad in 1962 to pursue her dream of becoming a writer and poet. We are then taken to Olive Schloss' tale, set 30 years earlier in Spain 1936, just as the simmering tensions of the Spanish Civil War are taking hold.

Olive – an aspiring and talented artist – moves with her glamorous but bored mother, Sarah, and her art dealer father, Harold, to a relatively isolated villa in Malaga. Siblings Isaac and Teresa Robles introduce themselves to the family – Teresa is employed as the maid and Isaac, also an artist, is commissioned by Sarah to paint herself and Olive. Both siblings spend a lot of time with the Schloss women and become intimately entwined in their lives.



In London, Odelle starts a new job as a receptionist in the Skelton art gallery, she is taken under the wing of her boss, the straight-talking Marjorie Quick. It's when Odelle encourages her friend Lawrie Scott to bring a painting he wants to sell to the gallery that things get interesting.

The plot takes time to reveal itself, and tried to imagine how it would develop. I can't say I guessed correctly and that made the powerful, poetic ending even better.

BAILEYS CHEESE CAKE BY GIRT HIRD

2oz /50g butter
4oz/125g digestive or ginger biscuits -
crushed
2 125g packs of cream cheese
1 small tin condensed milk
1/2 pint of double cream whipped
1 tsp Camp coffee
1 sherry glass Baileys Irish Cream



Melt the butter in a saucepan. Add crushed biscuits and mix well. Grease or line an 8inch /20cm round loose bottom cake tin. (I did both to make sure it came out in one piece). Put biscuit mixture into cake tin, pressing it down well and put in fridge to cool and set. Blend together in a bowl the condensed milk and the cream cheese. Gradually add the coffee and Baileys, then fold this mixture into the whipped cream. Pour over the biscuit base and leave to set in the fridge for 24 hours. Enjoy.

Having been given two bottles of Baileys Irish Cream before Christmas, I was fortunate to find a recipe for a Baileys Cheesecake in the Bow Village Cookbook.

I also discovered the Baileys Cookbook with lots of lovely ways to enjoy Baileys, still working my way through the cook book!

SAMPFORD COURTENAY ST ANDREW'S SPRING CONCERT

COUNTERFEIT GOODS
What are our rights?

A scam by another name in other words! However, fake goods can be dangerous. Take toys for example; if they don't meet safety standards, they may pose a choking risk if poor manufacturing mean small parts are easily detachable. It's not just toys and games though. Clothing, footwear, e-cigarettes, perfumes and media devices are among the many ranges of goods that can be faked. Sometimes it is easy to spot but not always.

Watch out for suspiciously low prices on well-known brands and signs of poor quality. Spelling mistakes in the advert or on packaging are also warning signs. Compare photographs from official sellers and always try to buy from reputable sellers only.

If you do buy fake goods, you are entitled to a refund within 30 days of purchase. If it's been over 30 days but less than six months since your purchase, the seller can offer to provide you with a genuine item but if they can't they are legally obliged to refund in full. If it's more than six months since the purchase, they are only required to provide a partial refund depending on how long it is since the purchase and how much the item has been used.

A seller may argue that the item was obviously not genuine as it was sold so cheaply but they have still broken the law and the consumer's legal rights still apply. If this happens and you paid by debit card, contact your bank and ask to use the 'chargeback scheme.' This also applies if a credit card was used and it cost less than £100.

If the purchase was made by credit card and was for between £100 and £30,000 you can contact the credit card company and ask for a 'section 75' claim to get your money back.

To report counterfeit goods or get help getting your money back contact Citizens Advice Consumer Service (citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/get-more-help/if-you-need-more-help-about-a-consumer-issue/). You can also report the seller to Trading Standards who investigate criminal activity. (citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer/get-more-help/report-to-trading-standards/)

This is just one example of the problems that people ask us for help with. We are a volunteer led charity and demand for our services continues to grow. LAPFORD PARISH COUNCIL NOTES Meeting held on 10th March 2026

Please note this is a summary of the main points of interest. The full minutes are posted on the Parish Council's website. Five Parish Councillors attended plus the clerk and five members of the public.



- A young representative from the School attended with her mother to present letters from children concerning the problems caused by dog poo in the village, particularly in areas where children play. She was thanked by the Council which has resolved to publicise the problem via a poster and social media campaign and the involvement of the MDDC Dog Warden.
- The County Councillor's written report was received, highlighting the DCC Council Tax increase of 4.99% representing an increase of £1.73 a week for a Band D property. Spending on Highways maintenance will rise to £32.4 million in the year 2026/7. Good news that the Devon Library service budget will not be cut but increased by £225,000 for the year.
- Changes to the delivery of Road Warden training were noted.
- Councillors to attend a planning training event in April.
- Repair to the muddy walkway at the end of Park Meadow Close has been carried out by a Parish Councillor on a voluntary basis. Thank you very much.
- The Annual Parish Meeting to take place in the Victory Hall at 10-00 a.m. on Saturday 9th May. Local organisations are invited to present brief reports at the meeting or send written information to the Parish Clerk in advance.
- The Parish was represented at the North Devon Rail Development Alliance meeting on 6th March. Further contact to be maintained with the group and a representative invited to a meeting for discussion about local rail issues.
- An application for funds from Lapford Victory Hall was considered and will be looked at again after more information has been gathered.
- A new three year contract for the annual review of Parish Council accounts was agreed.
- £60 was agreed to finance the recovering of four chairs in the Orchard Centre.
- The Council agreed to support the 4-5-1 Local Government Reorganisation proposal for Devon.

THE PRIORITY SERVICES REGISTER

We all expect the supplies of energy and water to our homes to be reliable, but just sometimes things go wrong – weather related incidents for instance - and supplies are cut. Annoying at the very least but for some people more than inconvenient and possibly life-threatening.

The Priority Services Register is a free service giving those who register with it information such as advance warning of planned power cuts, support with meter reading, free gas safety checks and special priority support in emergency situations.

To be eligible you should be of state pension age; rely on medical equipment or refrigerated medicines; have a long-term disability or medical or mental health condition; have young children under the age of five or in need of temporary support having just come out of hospital, recovering from an injury or recently bereaved.

To apply/register contact your energy or water supplier or network operator directly. More information about this on the Priority Services Register website www.thepsr.co.uk including how to register and who is eligible. Registration enables utility companies to take the best care of their customers. Registration is free and personal details kept confidential.




